NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and mutually agreed upon promises, conditions, and covenants hereinafter set forth, the parties hereto agree as follows:

#### ARTICLE

## Obligations of the Government:

To provide Eight Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$8,000.00) of general fund dollars to support the rental of units for emergency housing for homeless families in Lexington-Fayette County.

#### ARTICLE II

# Obligations of the Administrator:

- To operate and maintain units leased as emergency shelter for homeless families.

#### ARTICLE III

### Additional Provisions:
