Can we get the previous bid tab, I know it was one Bid for both sections can we get that original bid prices Current and past dockets and legislation can be found on Lexington's website << <https://lexington.legistar.com/Legislation.aspx> >>. The last awarded contract was file # 0448-23, and any other requests for bidding information must be done by open records request

We will attach the last bid information it is the combined bid.

Do you have to have an office in Lexington, or can it be in a surrounding area? The contract does not have any local or state office requirement(s). However, it is expected that we have a contractor who can be reached in a timely manner (2-4 Hrs.) depending on the nature of repair or for regular meetings.

Can you use UV liner? Please see the technical specs which is in Part IX pages 9-1 to 9-9 which calls for steam or water inversion as ways to “cook” the liner. We would not be opposed to trying the UV liner if the awarded contractor could provide a demonstration and show it as an equal. However, price should be based on specifications and contract documents

Can a bid date extension of 1-2 weeks be given? Yes, a 1-week extension could be allowed. If we move it out too much, we run the risk of not meeting Council Legislative Calendar before their Summer Recess.

Can a pay item for mobilization by the hour be added? This should be incidental and accounted for in applicable line items.

Can you provide a line item for escalation of work that would be performed for renewal for years 2-5, this could be done by a line item with a percentage per year? No, because this is a 1-year contract with a possibility of 4 renewals. Refer to Part III - Form of Proposals Section 4 and Part IV - General Conditions Section 11.

Per the pre-bid a question was asked about a local office being a requirement. Looking through the specs, we were unable to locate that information.

Will an office in the state of Kentucky meet this requirement? The contract does not have any local or state office requirement(s). However, it is expected that we have a contact who can be reached in a timely manner (2-4 Hrs.)

Will this contract, or the dig and replace contract be awarded to one or multiple contractors?
This will be awarded to the lowest bidder on each contract. Therefore, it could be the same contractor to win both contracts or two different contractors for each individual contract

What will be the required response time for emergency mobilizations? We would like it to be as soon as possible. Within a 2-4 hr. window for a response time.

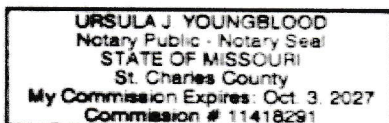

The LFUCG’s decision on the bid amount is final. This contract is a one year contract with the possibility of four (4) renewals. The Contractor cannot change prices on renewal without Owner’s approval and verification from material supplier.

The contract, if awarded, will be on the basis of materials and equipment specified in the specifications without consideration of possible substitute or “or equal” items.

The estimated quantities of items of unit price work are not guaranteed and are solely for the purpose of comparison of bids and determining an initial Contract price. 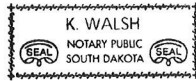

7. LEXINGTON FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT MWDBE PARTICIPATION GOALS, FORMS, AND GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

A. GENERAL

- 1) The LFUCG request all potential contractors to make a concerted effort to include Minority-Owned (MBE), Woman-Owned (WBE), Disadvantaged (DBE) Business Enterprises and Veteran-Owned Small Businesses (VOSB) as subcontractors or suppliers in their bids.
- 2) Toward that end, the LFUCG has established 10% of total procurement costs as a Goal for participation of Minority-Owned, Woman-Owned and Disadvantaged Businesses on this contract.
- 3) The LFUCG has also established a 3% of total procurement costs as a Goal for participation of Veteran-Owned Small Businesses.
- 4) **It is therefore a request of each Bidder to include in its bid, the same goal (10%) for MWDBE participation, the same goal (3%) veteran participation and other requirements as outlined in this section.**

B. PROCEDURES

- 1) The successful bidder will be required to report to the LFUCG, the dollar amounts of all payments submitted to Minority-Owned, Veteran-Owned and Woman-Owned subcontractors and suppliers for work done or materials purchased for this contract. (See Subcontractor Monthly Payment Report)
- 2) Replacement of a Minority-Owned, Veteran-Owned or Woman-Owned subcontractor or supplier listed in the original submittal must be requested in writing and must be accompanied by documentation of Good Faith Efforts to replace the subcontractor / supplier with another MWDBE Firm; this is subject to approval by the LFUCG. (See LFUCG MWDBE Substitution Form)
- 3) For assistance in identifying qualified, certified businesses to solicit for potential contracting opportunities, bidders may contact:
 - a) The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Division of Central Purchasing (859-258-3320)
- 4) The LFUCG will make every effort to notify interested MWDBE and veteran subcontractors and suppliers of each Bid Package, including information on the scope of work, the pre-bid meeting time and location, the bid date, and all other pertinent information regarding the project.

C. DEFINITIONS

- 1) A Minority-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned and operated by persons of African American, Hispanic, Asian, Pacific Islander, American Indian or Alaskan Native Heritage.

- 2) A Woman-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned and operated by one or more Non-Minority Females.
- 3) A Disadvantaged Business (DBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned and operated by a person(s) that are economically and socially disadvantaged.
- 4) A Veteran-Owned Small Business (VOSB) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned and operated by a veteran and/or a service disabled veteran.
- 5) Good Faith Efforts are efforts that, given all relevant circumstances, a bidder or proposer actively and aggressively seeking to meet the goals, can reasonably be expected to make. In evaluating good faith efforts made toward achieving the goals, whether the bidder or proposer has performed the efforts outlined in the Obligations of Bidder for Good Faith Efforts outlined in this document will be considered, along with any other relevant factors.

D. OBLIGATION OF BIDDER FOR GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

- 1) **The bidder shall make a Good Faith Effort to achieve the Participation Goal for MWDBE and Veteran subcontractors/suppliers. The failure to meet the goal shall not necessarily be cause for disqualification of the bidder; however, bidders not meeting the goal are required to furnish with their bids written documentation of their Good Faith Efforts to do so.**
- 2) Award of Contract shall be conditioned upon satisfaction of the requirements set forth herein.
- 3) The Form of Proposal includes a section entitled “MWDBE Participation Form”. The applicable information must be completed and submitted as outlined below.
- 4) **Failure to submit this information as requested may be cause for rejection of bid.**

E. DOCUMENTATION REQUIRED FOR GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

- 1) Bidders reaching the Goal are required to submit only the MWDBE Participation Form.” The form must be fully completed including names and telephone number of participating MWDBE firm(s); type of work to be performed; estimated value of the contract and value expressed as a percentage of the total Lump Sum Bid Price. The form must be signed and dated, and is to be submitted with the bid.
- 2) Bidders not reaching the Goal must submit the “MWDBE Participation Form”, the “Quote Summary Form” and a written statement documenting their Good Faith Effort to do so. If bid includes no MWDBE participation, bidder shall enter “None” on the subcontractor / supplier form). In addition, the bidder must submit written proof of their Good Faith Efforts to meet the Participation Goal:
 - a. Advertised opportunities to participate in the contract in at least two (2) publications of general circulation media; trade and professional association

publications; small and minority business or trade publications; and publications or trades targeting minority, women and disadvantaged businesses not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the deadline for submission of bids to allow MWDBE firms and Veteran-Owned businesses to participate.

b. Included documentation of advertising in the above publications with the bidders good faith efforts package

c. Attended LFUCG Central Purchasing Economic Inclusion Outreach event

d. Attended pre-bid meetings that were scheduled by LFUCG to inform MWDBEs and/or Veteran-Owned businesses of subcontracting opportunities

e. Sponsored Economic Inclusion event to provide networking opportunities for prime contractors and MWDBE firms and Veteran-Owned businesses.

f. Requested a list of MWDBE and/or Veteran subcontractors or suppliers from LFUCG and showed evidence of contacting the companies on the list(s).

This letter certifies that INSITUFORM tubes are manufactured in Batesville, Mississippi, USA by Insituform Technologies, LLC and meet all relevant specifications for a cured-in-place pipe product: ASTM D5813, ASTM F1216, and ASTM F1743. Insituform tubes have been manufactured in the USA since 1981.

The finished tube is manufactured using multiple layers of polyester felt, with one layer coated with either a Polypropylene or Polyurethane thermoplastic. The layers are cut/slit to a desired width and sewn concentrically to form the final tube. The coated layer is also sealed at the seam, using an extrusion or taping process. The extrusion process is used on the standard (inverted) tubes. The standard (inverted) tubes are manufactured with the coated layer on the outside.

Felt production is achieved by a non-woven needle punch process using Polyester fiber. The finished product is tested for thickness under a specified load and for tensile strength in accordance with ASTM D5813. The fabric tube has a minimum tensile strength of 750 psi (5 MPa) in both the longitudinal and the transverse direction. The seam strength of the tube is also tested on a regular basis and meets or exceeds the minimum tensile strength of 750 psi (5 MPa) in both the longitudinal and transverse direction. For Quality Assurance purposes, the material is also tested for weight and thickness.

All standard (inverted) tubes are run through a dye bath prior to shipment to ensure there are no leaks. Following the inspection process all tubes (except InsituMain, which are used in water lines) are printed with yard marks.


All tubes with tapers, transitions, or any change in tube diameter or thickness are produced under the same specifications, with the same materials, and meet the same material testing requirements as the standard tube.



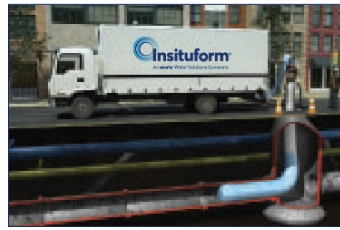

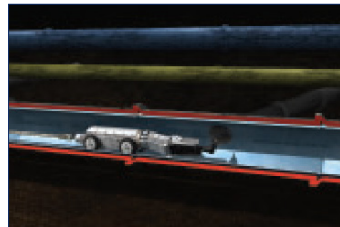
