SUBJECT: Accept Award from FEMA for the Mitigation Grant Emergency Generator

Request: Council authorization for the Mayor to execute an agreement and accept award of federal funding from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) in the amount of \$215,304 from the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program and \$34,448 from the state to overhaul electrical infrastructure at the Division of Streets and Roads maintenance and dispatch facilities. Match in the amount of \$37,320 is required.

Purpose of Request: On September 30, 2021 (Resolution 544-2021), Council approved to submit application to Kentucky Emergency Management for Federal funding under the Hazard Mitigation Grant program to overhaul the electrical infrastructure at the Division of Streets and Roads maintenance and dispatch facilities.

The Division of Emergency Management has been awarded \$215,304 in federal funds from FEMA and \$34,448 non-federal share from the state with a local match of \$37,320 for overhaul of the electrical infrastructure at the Division of Streets and Roads maintenance and dispatch facilities and install new electrical panels to back up generator systems. Total cost of the project is \$287,072.

What is the cost in this budget year and future budget years? Federal award in amount (75%) is \$215,304. State agency's share (12%) is \$34,448. Local match of \$37,320 (13%). Total cost of the project is \$287,072. Future cost of \$3,000 to \$5,000 for fuel and maintenance is anticipated.

Are the funds budgeted? A budget amendment is in process.
