Social Services and Public Safety Committee

October 8, 2024
Summary and Motions

Chair Reynolds called the meeting to order at 1:02 p.m. Committee Members Ellinger, J. Brown, Fogle, Monarrez, Gray, F. Brown, Baxter, Sevigny, and Plomin were in attendance. Vice Mayor Wu and Council Members Lynch, LeGris, and Sheehan were present as non-voting members.

I. Approval of September 17, 2024 Committee Meeting Summary

Motion by Sevigny to approve the September 17, 2024 Committee Summary. Seconded by Gray. Motion passed without dissent.

II. Villages Model Initiatives for Lexington

Roxanne Cheney, Chair of *A Caring Place*, presented the Villages Model for Lexington. She reviewed the mission statement which recognizes that loneliness is an epidemic with adverse effects on physical and mental health. The vision statement is to imagine a world where everyone feels loved. She reviewed programs they currently offer and said they serve seniors over 60 which includes people with disabilities and caregivers. She described *A Caring Place* as being like a village with community-based, nonprofit, grassroots organizations formed through a network of caring people who want to change the standard of aging. She reviewed the accomplishments and described how *A Caring Place* measures its results. She showed testimonials from 5 participants to describe the impact *A Caring Place* has had on people's lives. She said there are 250 locations of villages in the United States and Kentucky has 3 of those, with one located in Lexington. The most common structure of a village is a hub and spoke with the hub being a nonprofit and a spoke being a neighborhood group and there is potential to expand this program throughout Lexington. \$150,000 is requested for a feasibility study to help minimize the risks, optimize resources, and increase the likelihood of success.

Cheney clarified the areas included in the Bluegrass Region which is comprised of 17 counties in total. Cheney confirmed there are 40 college students who volunteer their time to this program. When asked how caregivers are supported, Cheney said we support them by engaging with them. When asked if these places are set up with hubs and spokes, Cheney said they have an executive committee they would use as a model. Speaking about the feasibility study, there was a concern that \$150,000 seems low. Kristy Stambaugh, Director of Aging and Disability Services explained villages are service-driven. As an example, Stonewall and Idle Hour (neighborhoods) would be spokes and *A Caring Place* would be a hub. There was a suggestion to put money toward resources rather than a feasibility study. Stambaugh said villages perform an assessment to find out what the needs are to be successful. The village model is unique and built by the neighborhood. The village is supposed to run itself and ask the hub for help when needed. Councilmember Lynch closed by saying *A Caring Place* is asking for help to do this. She will make a fund balance request to support the request for a feasibility study. No action was taken on this item.

III. Gun Violence Task Force Workgroup Report Out

Kendra Thompson, Council Research Analyst, presented the report out from the workgroup that was formed under the Gun Violence Task Force. She reviewed the members of the Gun Violence Task Force and the

workgroup that began meeting earlier in the year. She began the review of recommendations with the list that came out of the Community Pillars group: define gun violence as a public health crisis; recommend a month-long gun violence awareness campaign in June; and inform community partners of opportunities available to utilize and provide programs in community and neighborhood centers. The City Leaders Recommendations include: ONE Lexington when responding to gun violence incident in a councilmember's district, provide the appropriate notification of incident debrief and follow up with opportunities on how Council can get involved if appropriate; provide continued support for co-response teams and mobile crisis teams to allow for rapid response to acute behavioral health emergencies in the city and continue support for additional behavioral health specialists; expand the scope to address gun violence for all ages, not just ages 13-29; and communicate more fully with the community about the work surrounding gun violence. The final recommendation was for the creation of a new position in Social Services for a Gun Violence Program Coordinator who would work for all divisions on gun violence. \$75,000 would be requested from the FY2026 budget for the position and \$75,000 would be requested from fund balance for the implementation of the recommendations [note: \$100,000 was approved and allocated from fund balance to fund the implementation of the recommendations].

During the committee discussion, it was suggested that the coordinator and the budget requests be implemented earlier than FY2026. \$75,000 or possibly more for (gun violence) initiatives are appropriate for the Fund Balance discussion. Fund Balance would not be the appropriate place for discussing the position since that would include recurring costs. There was a suggestion that the position be in Public Safety. Social Services Commissioner, Kacy Allen-Bryant explained one category for ESR is community wellness and mental health and there have been applications related to Gun Violence under that category. There was agreement among committee members that elevating Gun Violence to a public health crisis is important, but this needs to be backed up with action and funding. There was support for the recommendations and recognition of this as a problem in the city and as such there was agreement to remove this item from the committee and implement the recommendations. Reynolds confirmed she is planning to move the entire list of recommendations to the full Council.

Motion by Fogle to approve the Gun Violence Task Force Report-Out recommendations as presented to committee and included in the committee packet. Seconded by Gray. Motion passed without dissent.

IV. Items Referred to Committee

No action was taken on this item.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:49 p.m.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING ("MOU") is made and entered into by and between Voices of Hope - Lexington, Inc. ("VOH") and Lexington Fayette Urban County Government ("LFUCG") as of January 1, 2025 ("Effective Date") through September 30, 2025.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, VOH is a tax exempt not for profit organization that provides services to individuals for the purpose of supporting meaningful recovery from drug and alcohol addiction; and WHEREAS, Lexington Fayette Urban County Government, operates the paramedicine program as part of its mission to enhance the public safety of Lexington-Fayette County residents and businesses through emergency preparedness, mitigation, response and recovery; and

WHEREAS, LFUCG provides paramedicine services and desires to offer access to peer support services, during LFUCG hours, for such participants; and

WHEREAS, VOH is willing to assist LFUCG in providing these peer support services.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants, agreements and obligations contained herein, VOH and LFUCG hereby agree as follows:

- VOH will arrange for one or more of its employees to provide peer support and recovery
 coaching services at LFUCG. This will include linkage program enrollments of participants
 that are seeking connection to evidence based treatment options. The dates and times will be in
 accordance with the LFUCG hours, but not to exceed 40 hours. The VOH staff are required to
 have significant experience and training with providing peer services, are certified peer support
 specialists and trained recovery coaches, and will be trained, supervised, and scheduled by
 VOH.
- 2. LFUCG will provide space for service provision and data entry, provide onsite orientation and support, as needed, and refer participants for peer services.
- 3. VOH will provide information to clients about local SMART Recovery and SMART Friends and Family Meetings.
- 4. This MOU is effective as of January 1, 2025 terminating on September 30, 2025. Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time for giving at least thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party.
- 5. VOH complies with the federal and state constitutions, and all applicable federal and state laws, regarding nondiscrimination. VOH provides equal opportunities for qualified persons in all aspects of its operations, and does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, ethnic origin, religion, creed, age, physical or mental disability, veteran status, uniformed service, political belief, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, pregnancy, marital status, genetic information, social or economic status, or whether the person is a smoker or nonsmoker, as long as the person complies with VOH policy concerning smoking.
- 6. Nothing in the Agreement shall be construed as an offer for payment by one or more parties to one

or more other parties of cash or other remuneration, directly or indirectly, in exchange for patient referrals or arrangements or recommendations for any item or service.

- 7. The information provided to the Recovery Coach will be confidential, unless they are required by law to report it (e.g., in the case that one is considering harming their self or others, or that they report knowledge of child abuse or neglect). Substance use disorder records are protected under federal law, including the federal regulations governing the confidentiality of substance use disorder patient records, 42 C.F.R. Part 2, and cannot be disclosed without written consent unless otherwise provided for by the regulations.
- 8. LFUCG will inform VOH of any lawsuit, which is threatened, or any patient care event, which causes or contributes to injury or death, and could result in a lawsuit, if a VOH employee is involved.
- 9. This MOU contains the entire agreement and understanding of the parties and supersedes all prior agreements, understandings, or arrangements (both oral and written) relating to the subject matter of this MOU.
- 10. The parties are separate, independent entities, and neither party is or shall be authorized to act as an agent or representative of the other. Neither party to this MOU is a partner, employee, agent or joint venture of the other. Nothing in this MOU is intended to create any relationship between the parties of any nature other than independent, contracting parties. Each party shall be responsible for its actions in connection with its performance of duties hereunder.
- 11. LFUCG shall not assign any of its rights or obligations under this MOU without the prior written consent of VOH, in its sole discretion.

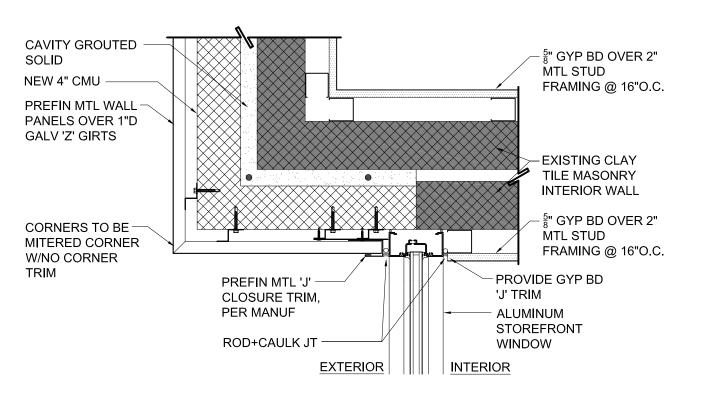




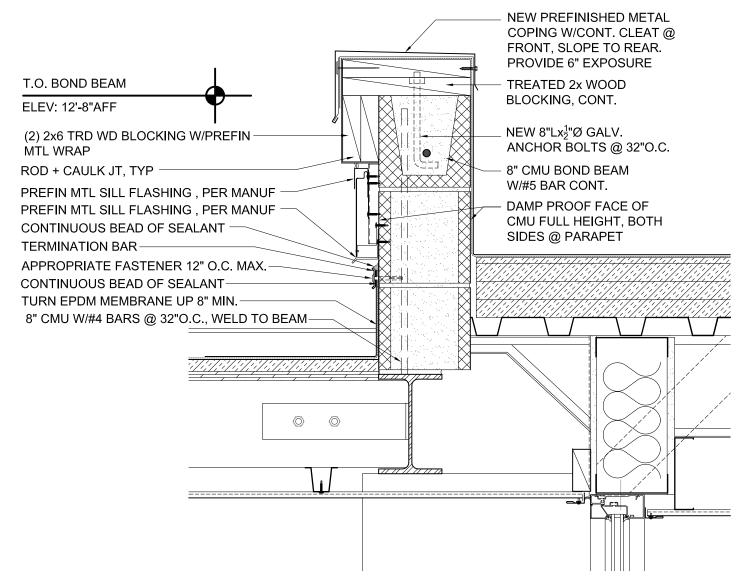
G WINDOW HEAD DTL A4.2 SCALE: 1 1/2" = 1'-0"

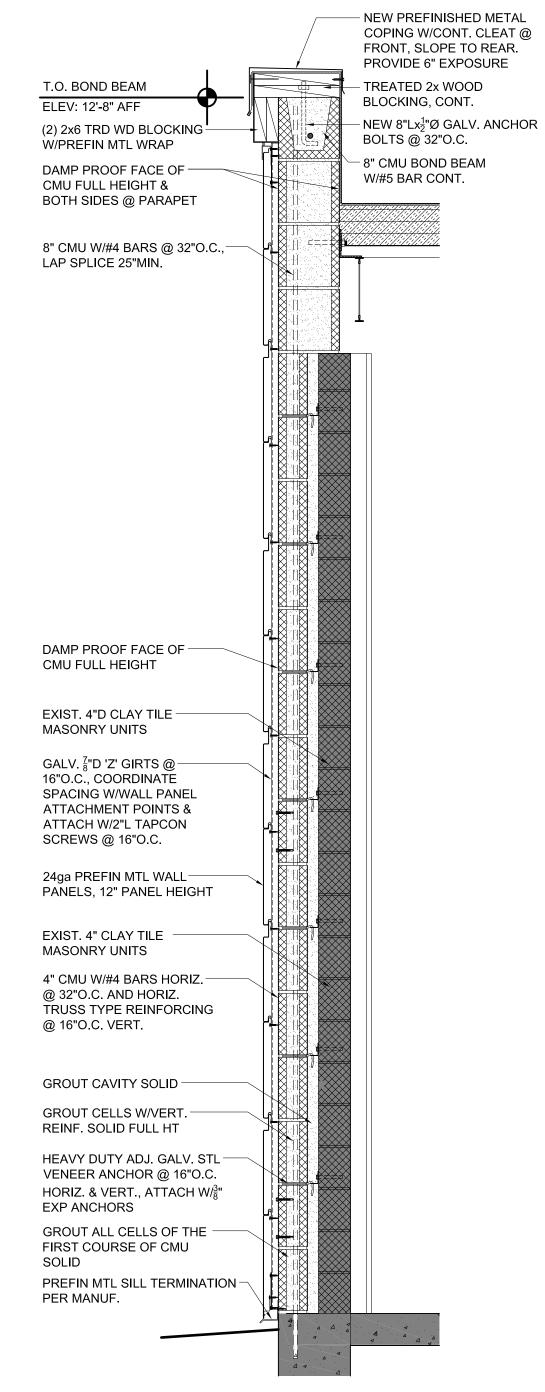

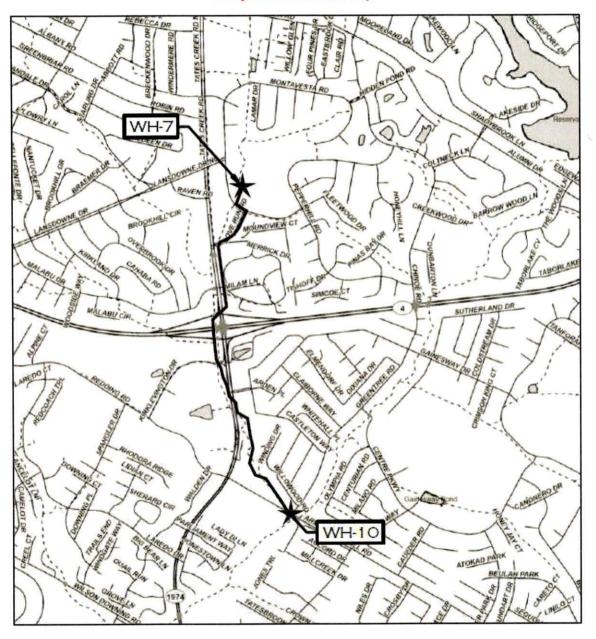

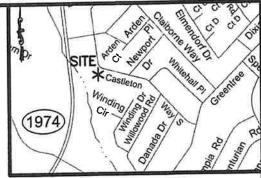

- A No New Laser provision applies to the 2026 stop loss policy period. The provision will be adjusted to reflect any changes related to basis, deductible, commission level, etc.
- HSA/HDHP plan benefits are subject to IRS guidelines and may change.
- This proposal assumes that Anthem will be the only Self Funded carrier offered and no fully-insured lives are covered.

Additional service fees

Runout Period Claims Processing Fee Types

Fees associated with claims processed during the runout period, including without limitation subrogation fees, recovery fees, and network access fees, will be charged during the runout period.

Runout Period Claims Processing Fee Costs

The cost of processing runout claims is excluded. The charge for processing 12 months of runout claims is 9.0% of all runout claims. In addition, direct charges may be incurred following termination that are not included in the standard runout processing fee (e.g., data feeds to other vendors).

Out of Network Savings Fees

The fee will be equal to 50% of the savings achieved on certain non-network claims.

No Surprises Act - Qualifying Payment Amount Fee

If program selected, the fee would be equal to 15% of the savings achieved on No Surprises Act claims priced using the Qualifying Payment Amount for provider reimbursement.

Traditional Network Provider Savings Fee

The fee will be equal to 50% of Traditional network discounts. Traditional network discount is the difference between billed charges for covered services and the traditional provider negotiated amount. Prescription drug claims, claims paid on a capitated basis and Payment Innovation program payments are excluded from the fee calculation.

BlueCard Fees

The following BlueCard fees will be included on the ASO invoice:

- The access fee is charged at a percentage no greater than 1.93% of the discount/differential subject to a maximum of \$2,000 per claim
- The AEA Fee is \$4.00 per professional provider claim and \$9.75 per institutional claim.
- Occasionally, Anthem and a Host Blue may contract for a lower fee by combining the Access Fee and the AEA fee.
- The Central Financial Agency fee is \$0.35 per payment notice. The ITS transaction fee is \$0.05 per claims transaction.
- BlueCard fees are not charged in Anthem states. For a complete description of these fees, please consult your ASO Agreement.

Enhanced Personal Health Care (EPHC) Program Administration

The fee for Anthem's oversight of EPHC with providers or vendors is 25% of the per attributed member per month amount charged to the Employer for the provider performance bonus portion of the EPHC program.

Subrogation services

The charge is 25% of gross subrogation recovery.

Overpayment Identification and Claims Prepayment Analysis Activities

The charge to Employer is 25% of (i) the amount recovered from review of Claims and membership data and audits of Provider and Vendor activity to identify overpayments and (ii) the difference between the amount Employer would have been charged absent prepayment analysis activities and the amount that was charged to Employer following performance of the prepayment analysis activities. This includes, but is not limited to, activities related to COB, Host Blue activities, contract compliance, and eligibility. The fee will not exceed \$25,000 per claim.

External appeals

The PPACA requires that ASO groups provide a process for external claims appeals to be available in situations where adverse benefit determinations have been made. Employer may contract with Anthem for this service or arrange to work directly with an external vendor. The fee will be \$500 per external appeal for the service contracted with Anthem.

Independent Dispute Resolution

Fee for Independent Dispute Resolution. Fees charged to Anthem as part of independent dispute resolution processes, including arbitrator fees, will be charged to Employer.

Reporting

Management reports (e.g., standard account reporting package, performance guarantee reporting, lag reports, online reporting tool/access are included in our fees. In addition to these reports, Anthem will provide 20 hours of time needed to generate custom or adhoc reports (e.g., care management and utilization review reports) at no charge per year. The charge beyond 20 hours per year is \$150 per hour of time needed to generate the custom or ad-hoc report.

Data Feeds

Anthem shall provide up to one Monthly data feed to a supported outside vendor in Anthem's standard format, not to exceed 12 feeds. The charge is \$1,000 for each additional feed. Each time a report is sent to a supported vendor electronically, it is considered a feed, even if the same report is sent to the same vendor monthly. For example, if monthly feeds are sent to two supported vendors, 24 electronic data feeds will have been used on an annual basis. The charge for Weekly data feeds to a single supported vendor, not to exceed 52 feeds, is \$15,000 annually. The charge for Daily data feeds to a single supported vendor, not to exceed 365 feeds, is \$20,000 annually. Additional fees would be required for Stop Loss interfaces, Rx integration feeds and telemedicine.

STOP LOSS POLICY

This policy is entered into by and between Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government ("Employer") and Anthem Insurance Companies Inc., 220 Virginia Ave, Indianapolis, IN 46204, d.b.a. Anthem Blue Cross and Blue Shield ("Anthem") for the purpose of establishing stop loss coverage and is effective as of 01/01/2024 upon the terms and conditions herein ("Policy").

If there are any inconsistencies between this Policy and any prior stop loss agreements or the Administrative Services Agreement between Anthem and Employer, the terms and conditions of this Policy shall control.

In consideration of the promises and the mutual covenants contained in this Policy, Anthem and Employer (the "Party" or "Parties" as appropriate) agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 DEFINITIONS

For purposes of this Policy and any amendments, attachments, or schedules to this Policy, the following words and terms have the following meanings unless the context or use clearly indicates another meaning or intent. If a term is not defined, the term shall have the same meaning as defined in the Administrative Services Agreement between the Parties.

DOMESTIC CLAIMS. Paid Claims for a service or supply provided by Employer or Employer's health system as the medical provider.

ELIGIBLE CLAIM DATE PERIOD. The dates during which Claims for benefits provided under the terms of the Plan must be Incurred and paid in order to be covered by this Policy.

ELIGIBLE CLAIMS EXPENSES. Benefits incurred by a Member that are payable under the Plan and that are not excluded under this Policy.

INCURRED. The date on which a supply is obtained or a service is rendered to a Member.

INVOICE DUE DATE. The date of the invoice provided to Employer indicating when payment is due.

LINES OF COVERAGE. The benefit plan(s) administered by Anthem and provided in Schedule A.

PAID CLAIM. A Claim for Covered Services rendered or supplies provided to a Member under the terms of the Plan, provided such Claim has been received, adjudicated, and paid by Anthem. Paid Claim shall have the same meaning as contained in the Administrative Services Agreement between the Parties, unless excluded as indicated in Sections 4(E) and 5(D) of Schedule A.

POLICY PERIOD. The period of time indicated in Section 1 of Schedule A.

SPECIFIC STOP LOSS LIMIT. The threshold total dollar amount of Paid Claims for which Employer is financially responsible with respect to a Subscriber or Member as indicated in Section 4(A) of Schedule A. Subject to the terms of this Policy, Anthem is financially responsible for Paid Claims in excess of the Specific Stop Loss Limit.

TRANSPLANT. A procedure or series of procedures by which an organ or tissue is either: (1) removed from the body of one person and implanted in the body of a Member; or (2) removed from and replaced in the Member's body.

USUAL AND CUSTOMARY. The most common charge for similar services, medicines, or supplies within the locality in which the charge is incurred.

Anthem Blue Cross and Blue Shield is the trade name of Anthem Insurance Companies, Inc. Independent licensee of the Blue Cross and Blue Shield Association. ANTHEM is a registered trademark of Anthem Insurance Companies, Inc. The Blue Cross and Blue Shield names and symbols are registered marks of the Blue Cross and Blue Shield Association.

ARTICLE 2 SPECIFIC STOP LOSS COVERAGE

- 2.1 When the total amount of Paid Claims pertaining to Subscribers or Members and Lines of Coverage provided in Sections 4(A) and 4(B) of Schedule A exceeds the Specific Stop Loss Limit provided in Section 4(C) of Schedule A, Anthem shall reimburse Employer for such excess.
 - Anthem's reimbursement under this Article 2 shall begin with the invoice on which the Specific Stop Loss Limit is exceeded.
- 2.2 In the event that the Specific Stop Loss Limit is reached, no amount in excess of the Specific Stop Loss Limit shall be applied towards attainment of any Aggregate Stop Loss Limit.
- 2.3 Certain Paid Claims may be excluded from the specific stop loss coverage provided in this Policy. These exclusions are provided in Section 4(E) of Schedule A as applicable.
- For any reimbursement owed or made under this Article 2, Anthem shall be permitted to recoup or offset an amount equal to any prescription drug rebates received by Employer that are attributable to Eligible Claims Expenses of a Member whose Eligible Claims Expenses have met the Specific Stop Loss Limit, even if such rebates are received by Employer after the end of the Policy Period. The recoupment or offset shall be limited to the amount of the reimbursement that was made or would otherwise be made by Anthem absent the rebates. Employer shall provide documentation reasonably requested by Anthem as part of its Proof of Loss and within one year after payment under this Article 2 that demonstrates the value and the claims upon which any prescription drug rebates were received.

To the extent permitted by the Employer's PBM, Employer agrees to assign to Anthem its right to receive rebates from PBM that are attributable to Eligible Claims Expenses for Members whose Eligible Claims Expenses have met the Specific Stop Loss Limit, up to the limits set forth in the previous paragraph. Any payments of rebates pursuant to this assignment will continue to be credited to the amount of rebates paid by PBM to Employer pursuant to the administrative services agreement between PBM and Employer ("PBM ASA") and will be included in the calculation of any rebate guarantees offered to Employer under their PBM ASA.

ARTICLE 3 AGGREGATE STOP LOSS COVERAGE

This Article has been intentionally omitted.

ARTICLE 4 LIMITATIONS ON COVERAGE

- 4.1 Unless otherwise noted in Schedule A, Paid Claims for Members are covered under the term of the Eligible Claim Date Period of this Policy.
- 4.2 Claims that are covered by another contract shall not count toward the attainment of the stop loss limit(s) under this Policy. In addition, Paid Claims that are covered under the term of an Eligible Claim Date Period will not count toward attainment of any stop loss limit(s) under a subsequent Policy Period.
- 4.3 Under the Administrative Services Agreement, Employer may request Anthem to process and pay Claims that were denied by Anthem or take other actions with respect to the Plan that are not specifically provided in the Benefits Booklet. In such cases, payments shall not count toward the stop loss accumulators under this Policy unless otherwise agreed to in writing by Anthem.
- 4.4 If a Member does not enroll when first eligible or during a special enrollment period, the Member shall be considered a "Late Enrollee" as defined in the Benefits Booklet. Paid Claims for a Late Enrollee shall not apply towards the stop loss limits under this Policy unless Anthem first provides Employer with written approval and the effective date of coverage under this Policy. Anthem has the right to allow or deny stop loss coverage under this Policy for a Late Enrollee. Anthem shall not cover under this Policy any Late Enrollee not disclosed by Employer to Anthem.
- 4.5 A Claim incurred during the Eligible Claim Date Period but not paid until after the expiration of the Eligible Claim Date Period is not eligible for coverage under this Policy Period.

ARTICLE 5 SETTLEMENT

- 5.1 Within 120 days after the end of each Eligible Claim Date Period, Anthem shall furnish Employer with a settlement calculation and any additional data which, in Anthem's opinion, is needed to explain to Employer the settlement calculation. Anthem has the right to offset any amounts it owes to Employer under this Policy by any amount Employer owes under the Administrative Services Agreement, this Policy, or any other agreement with Anthem.
- 5.2 If, based on the settlement calculation for a Policy Period, Anthem must pay Employer an amount due under the terms of this Policy, Anthem shall pay Employer no later than 30 days after the settlement calculation subject to any right to offset any amounts owed to Employer.

If, based on the settlement calculation Employer must pay Anthem an amount under the terms of this Policy, then Employer shall pay Anthem no later than 30 days following receipt of the invoice.

ARTICLE 6 STOP LOSS PREMIUM RATES

The premium rates for the specific stop loss coverage provided in this Policy are indicated in Section 4(D) of Schedule A. The premium rates for the aggregate stop loss coverage provided in this Policy are indicated in Section 5(C) of Schedule A. Employer shall pay Anthem such amounts by the Invoice Due Date.

ARTICLE 7 LATE PAYMENT PENALTY

If Employer fails to timely pay any amount due to Anthem under this Policy, Employer shall pay a late payment penalty for each day the payment is late. The late payment penalty shall be calculated at the rate of 12% simple interest per annum (365 days), and shall be included on a subsequent invoice and payable by the Invoice Due Date. If applicable, Employer agrees to reimburse Anthem for any expenses charged to Anthem by a financial institution, Provider or Vendor due to Employer's failure to maintain sufficient funds in a designated bank account. Any acceptance by Anthem of late payments shall not be deemed a waiver of its rights to terminate this Policy for any future failure of Employer to make timely payments.

ARTICLE 8 CHANGES IN TERMS OR CONDITIONS

8.1 If Anthem offers to renew this Policy at the end of a Policy Period, then Anthem shall provide Employer with the terms and conditions of the proposed renewal in writing within the time period provided in Section 1 of Schedule A. Employer shall notify Anthem in writing of its selection from the renewal options by indicating its selection and signing Anthem's designated renewal form. If Anthem does not receive a signed acceptance of the renewal from Employer prior to the start of the next Policy Period, Employer's payment of the amounts provided in the renewal shall constitute Employer's acceptance of the terms. Anthem shall provide a revised Schedule A that will become part of this Policy without the necessity of securing Employer's signature.

8.2 Policy Changes

Anthem reserves the right to make changes to this Policy, to Schedule A, or other applicable Schedules at a time other than the start of a Policy Period upon the occurrence of one or more of the following events:

(1) a change to the Plan benefits initiated by Employer that results in a substantial change in the services as determined by Anthem; (2) a change in ownership (including but not limited to a merger, consolidation, or transfer of all or substantially all of Employer's assets); (3) a change in the total number of Members resulting in either an increase or decrease of 10% or more of the number of Members enrolled for coverage on the date the stop loss premium was last modified; (4) a change in Employer contribution; (5) a change in the nature of Employer's business resulting in a change in its designated Standard Industrial Classification ("SIC") code; or (6) a change in applicable law affecting this Policy or any of the Plan Documents.

Anthem shall provide Employer with at least 30 days' notice of changes and such change will be effective as of the date of any occurrence listed above. If such change is unacceptable to Employer, either Party shall have the right to terminate this Policy by giving written notice of termination to the other Party within 30 days of the change. If Employer accepts the proposed change, Anthem shall provide a revised Schedule A that will then become part of this Policy without the necessity of securing Employer's signature on the Schedule A.

8.3 Signature Requirements

No modification or change in any provision of this Policy, including but not limited to, changes at renewal, shall be effective unless and until approved in writing by an authorized representative of Anthem and evidenced by an amendment or new Schedule attached to this Policy.

Any payments made under this Policy shall only be for the benefit of Employer. Anthem has no obligation or liability under this Policy to provide benefits to Subscribers or Members. No Subscriber or Member shall have the right to any of the proceeds of any stop loss insurance obtained by Employer pursuant to this Policy.

ARTICLE 9 SUBROGATION AND OTHER RECOVERIES

Any subrogation or other recovery received by the Plan will not be used to satisfy any of the stop loss limits under this Policy. Anthem will first be repaid any amounts it has reimbursed under this Policy or under a previous stop loss agreement between the Parties. Any remaining recovery amounts shall be credited or paid to Employer as described in the Administrative Services Agreement.

ARTICLE 10 TERMINATION

- 10.1 This Policy automatically terminates as follows:
 - 10.1.1 At the end of each Policy Period unless the Policy is renewed pursuant to Article 8 of this Policy.
 - 10.1.2 Upon the termination of the Administrative Services Agreement.
 - 10.1.3 At the end of the month in which fewer than 100 Subscribers are covered under the Plan.
 - 10.1.4 If Employer changes to a third party administrator other than Anthem for the Claims that are subject to this Policy.

Upon termination of this Policy, the Parties shall remain liable for all payments due under this Policy.

- 10.2 Employer may terminate this Policy at any time other than at the end of a Policy Period by giving Anthem 90 days written notice of its intent to terminate.
- 10.3 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Article 10, this Policy automatically terminates, without further notice or action, if Employer fails to pay any premium amounts due under this Policy within 7 days of the date of Anthem's notice to Employer of a delinquent amount owed. Such termination shall be effective as of the last period for which full payment was made. Any acceptance of a delinquent payment by Anthem shall not be deemed a waiver of this provision for termination of this Policy. Delivery of payment to Anthem or Anthem's receipt and negotiation of a tendered payment through its automatic deposit procedures shall not be deemed acceptance or a waiver of such termination. If this Policy is terminated due to nonpayment of premium, Claims Run-out coverage, if any, will not apply.
- 10.4 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Policy, if Employer engages in fraudulent conduct or misrepresentation, Anthem may rescind, cancel, or terminate this Policy, effective on the date of the fraudulent conduct or misrepresentation regardless of the date Anthem discovered such conduct. Employer shall be liable to Anthem for any and all payments made, as well as losses or damages sustained by Anthem arising as a result of such Employer conduct.
- In the event that this Policy terminates or is terminated prior to the end of a Policy Period, the stop loss limits under this Policy shall not be prorated, and Anthem shall not reimburse Employer for any Paid Claims unless the Specific Stop Loss Limit and/or the Aggregate Stop Loss Limit or the Minimum Aggregate Stop Loss Limit, if greater, have been met. Only amounts accumulated towards any stop loss limits under this Policy through the date of termination will be used in the determination of whether such limits have been met. Anthem shall have no obligation to refund to Employer any stop loss premiums paid by Employer under this Policy.

If, based on the settlement calculation, Anthem must pay Employer an amount due under the terms of this Policy, Anthem shall pay Employer no later than 30 days after the settlement calculation subject to any right to offset any amounts owed to Employer.

If, based on the settlement calculation Employer must pay Anthem an amount under the terms of this Policy, then Employer shall pay Anthem no later than 30 days following receipt of the invoice.

ARTICLE 11 NOTICES

- 11.1 Notices under this Policy shall be deemed sufficient when made in writing as follows: to Employer, by first class mail, personal delivery, electronic mail or overnight delivery with confirmation capability, to its principal office shown upon the records of Anthem; to Anthem, by first class mail, personal delivery, electronic mail or overnight delivery with confirmation capability, to the designated Anthem sales representative.
- 11.2 A notice or demand shall be deemed to have been given as of the date of deposit in the United States mail with postage prepaid or, in the case of delivery other than by mail, on the date of actual delivery at the appropriate address.

ARTICLE 12 GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 12.1 No failure or delay by either Party to exercise any right or to enforce any obligation herein and no course of dealing between Employer and Anthem shall operate as a waiver of such right or obligation or be construed as or constitute a waiver of the right to enforce or insist upon compliance with such right or obligation in the future. Any single or partial exercise of any right or failure to enforce any obligation shall not preclude any other or further exercise or the right to exercise any other right or enforce any other obligation.
- Unless it has first obtained the written consent of an officer of the other Party, neither Party may assign this 12.2 Policy to any other person. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Anthem may, with advance written notice to Employer, assign or otherwise transfer its rights and obligations hereunder, in whole or in part, to: (i) any affiliate of Anthem; or (ii) any entity surviving a transaction involving the merger, acquisition, consolidation, or reorganization of Anthem, or in which all or substantially all of Anthem's assets are sold. Additionally, Employer may, with advance written notice to Anthem, assign, delegate, or otherwise transfer its rights and obligations hereunder, in whole, to (i) any affiliate of Employer; or (ii) any entity surviving a transaction involving the merger, acquisition, consolidation or reorganization of Employer, or in which all or substantially all of Employer's assets are sold, provided that such affiliate or other assignee presents, in Anthem's opinion, an equivalent or better financial status and credit risk. Either Party is required to provide advance written notice under this provision only to the extent permissible under applicable law and the reasonable terms of the agreement(s) governing such merger, acquisition, consolidation, reorganization, or asset sale. If advance written notice is not allowed, notice shall be provided as soon as practicable. Upon receipt of notice of an assignment of this Policy, the other Party may terminate this Policy by providing the assigning Party with 30 days advance written notice of termination. Any assignee of rights or benefits under this Policy shall be subject to all of the terms and provisions of this Policy. Either Party may subcontract any of its duties under this Policy without the prior written consent of other Party; however, the Party subcontracting the services shall remain responsible for fulfilling its obligations under this Policy.
- The payment of amounts under this Policy will not include any taxes which might be paid or payable by Employer; or any tax liability, interest, penalty, or assessment imposed by any regulatory or taxing authority or any state or federal health insurance exchange, uninsured pool or any other similar state or federal program. Employer agrees to reimburse Anthem for any tax liability, assessment, fee or other amount paid or payable by Employer that is assessed against Anthem on the basis of the stop loss coverage provided to Employer, including any amounts related to the assessment by the Federal government under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and its amendments ("PPACA") and shall reimburse Anthem for the amount of any such tax liability incurred by Anthem and allocated to Employer as the result of such tax assessment. Such reimbursement shall be due and payable to Anthem by the Invoice Due Date.
- 12.4 No action by either Party alleging a breach of this Policy may be commenced after the expiration of 3 years from the date on which the claim arose.

STOP LOSS POLICY

This policy is entered into by and between Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government ("Employer") and Anthem Insurance Companies Inc., 220 Virginia Ave, Indianapolis, IN 46204, d.b.a. Anthem Blue Cross and Blue Shield ("Anthem") for the purpose of establishing stop loss coverage and is effective as of 01/01/2025 upon the terms and conditions herein ("Policy").

If there are any inconsistencies between this Policy and any prior stop loss agreements or the Administrative Services Agreement between Anthem and Employer, the terms and conditions of this Policy shall control.

In consideration of the promises and the mutual covenants contained in this Policy, Anthem and Employer (the "Party" or "Parties" as appropriate) agree as follows:

ARTICLE 1 DEFINITIONS

For purposes of this Policy and any amendments, attachments, or schedules to this Policy, the following words and terms have the following meanings unless the context or use clearly indicates another meaning or intent. If a term is not defined, the term shall have the same meaning as defined in the Administrative Services Agreement between the Parties.

ELIGIBLE CLAIM DATE PERIOD. The dates during which Claims for benefits provided under the terms of the Plan must be Incurred and paid in order to be covered by this Policy.

ELIGIBLE CLAIMS EXPENSES. Benefits incurred by a Member that are payable under the Plan and that are not excluded under this Policy.

INCURRED. The date on which a supply is obtained or a service is rendered to a Member.

INVOICE DUE DATE. The date of the invoice provided to Employer indicating when payment is due.

LINES OF COVERAGE. The benefit plan(s) administered by Anthem and provided in Schedule A.

PAID CLAIM. A Claim for Covered Services rendered or supplies provided to a Member under the terms of the Plan, provided such Claim has been received, adjudicated, and paid by Anthem. Paid Claim shall have the same meaning as contained in the Administrative Services Agreement between the Parties, unless excluded as indicated in Sections 4(E) and 5(D) of Schedule A.

POLICY PERIOD. The period of time indicated in Section 1 of Schedule A.

SPECIFIC STOP LOSS LIMIT. The threshold total dollar amount of Paid Claims for which Employer is financially responsible with respect to a Subscriber or Member as indicated in Section 4(A) of Schedule A. Subject to the terms of this Policy, Anthem is financially responsible for Paid Claims in excess of the Specific Stop Loss Limit.

TRANSPLANT. A procedure or series of procedures by which an organ or tissue is either: (1) removed from the body of one person and implanted in the body of a Member; or (2) removed from and replaced in the Member's body.

USUAL AND CUSTOMARY. The most common charge for similar services, medicines, or supplies within the locality in which the charge is incurred.

ARTICLE 2 SPECIFIC STOP LOSS COVERAGE

2.1 When the total amount of Paid Claims pertaining to Subscribers or Members and Lines of Coverage provided in Sections 4(A) and 4(B) of Schedule A exceeds the Specific Stop Loss Limit provided in Section 4(C) of Schedule A, Anthem shall reimburse Employer for such excess.

Anthem's reimbursement under this Article 2 shall begin with the invoice on which the Specific Stop Loss Limit is exceeded.

Anthem Blue Cross and Blue Shield is the trade name of Anthem Health Plans of Kentucky, Inc. Independent licensee of the Blue Cross and Blue Shield Association. - 2.4 For any reimbursement owed or made under this Article 2, Anthem shall be permitted to recoup or offset an amount equal to any prescription drug rebates received by Employer that are attributable to Eligible Claims Expenses of a Member whose Eligible Claims Expenses have met the Specific Stop Loss Limit, even if such rebates are received by Employer after the end of the Policy Period. The recoupment or offset shall be limited to the amount of the reimbursement that was made or would otherwise be made by Anthem absent the rebates. Employer shall provide documentation reasonably requested by Anthem as part of its Proof of Loss and within one year after payment under this Article 2 that demonstrates the value and the claims upon which any prescription drug rebates were received.

To the extent permitted by the Employer's PBM, Employer agrees to assign to Anthem its right to receive rebates from PBM that are attributable to Eligible Claims Expenses for Members whose Eligible Claims Expenses have met the Specific Stop Loss Limit, up to the limits set forth in the previous paragraph. Any payments of rebates pursuant to this assignment will continue to be credited to the amount of rebates paid by PBM to Employer pursuant to the administrative services agreement between PBM and Employer ("PBM ASA") and will be included in the calculation of any rebate guarantees offered to Employer under their PBM ASA.

ARTICLE 3 AGGREGATE STOP LOSS COVERAGE

This Article has been intentionally omitted.

ARTICLE 4 LIMITATIONS ON COVERAGE

- 4.1 Unless otherwise noted in Schedule A, Paid Claims for Members are covered under the term of the Eligible Claim Date Period of this Policy.
- 4.2 Claims that are covered by another contract shall not count toward the attainment of the stop loss limit(s) under this Policy. In addition, Paid Claims that are covered under the term of an Eligible Claim Date Period will not count toward attainment of any stop loss limit(s) under a subsequent Policy Period.
- Under the Administrative Services Agreement, Employer may request Anthem to process and pay Claims that were denied by Anthem or take other actions with respect to the Plan that are not specifically provided in the Benefits Booklet. In such cases, payments shall not count toward the stop loss accumulators under this Policy unless otherwise agreed to in writing by Anthem.
- 4.4 If a Member does not enroll when first eligible or during a special enrollment period, the Member shall be considered a "Late Enrollee" as defined in the Benefits Booklet. Paid Claims for a Late Enrollee shall not apply towards the stop loss limits under this Policy unless Anthem first provides Employer with written approval and the effective date of coverage under this Policy. Anthem has the right to allow or deny stop loss coverage under this Policy for a Late Enrollee. Anthem shall not cover under this Policy any Late Enrollee not disclosed by Employer to Anthem.
- 4.5 A Claim incurred during the Eligible Claim Date Period but not paid until after the expiration of the Eligible Claim Date Period is not eligible for coverage under this Policy Period.
- 4.6 Eligible Claims Expenses in excess of Usual and Customary charges.

ARTICLE 5 SETTLEMENT

- 5.1 Within 90 days after the end of each Eligible Claim Date Period, Anthem shall furnish Employer with a settlement calculation and any additional data which, in Anthem's opinion, is needed to explain to Employer the settlement calculation. Anthem has the right to offset any amounts it owes to Employer under this Policy by any amount Employer owes under the Administrative Services Agreement, this Policy, or any other agreement with Anthem.

If applicable, Employer agrees to reimburse Anthem for any expenses charged to Anthem by a financial institution, Provider or Vendor due to Employer's failure to maintain sufficient funds in a designated bank account. Any acceptance by Anthem of late payments shall not be deemed a waiver of its rights to terminate this Policy for any future failure of Employer to make timely payments.

ARTICLE 8 CHANGES IN TERMS OR CONDITIONS

8.1 If Anthem offers to renew this Policy at the end of a Policy Period, then Anthem shall provide Employer with the terms and conditions of the proposed renewal in writing within the time period provided in Section 1 of Schedule A. Employer shall notify Anthem in writing of its selection from the renewal options by indicating its selection and signing Anthem's designated renewal form. If Anthem does not receive a signed acceptance of the renewal from Employer prior to the start of the next Policy Period, Employer's payment of the amounts provided in the renewal shall constitute Employer's acceptance of the terms. Anthem shall provide a revised Schedule A that will become part of this Policy without the necessity of securing Employer's signature.

- 10.3 Notwithstanding any other provision of this Article 10, this Policy automatically terminates, without further notice or action, if Employer fails to pay any premium amounts due under this Policy within 7 days of the date of Anthem's notice to Employer of a delinquent amount owed. Such termination shall be effective as of the last period for which full payment was made. Any acceptance of a delinquent payment by Anthem shall not be deemed a waiver of this provision for termination of this Policy. Delivery of payment to Anthem or Anthem's receipt and negotiation of a tendered payment through its automatic deposit procedures shall not be deemed acceptance or a waiver of such termination. If this Policy is terminated due to nonpayment of premium, Claims Run-out coverage, if any, will not apply.
- Notwithstanding any other provision of this Policy, if Employer engages in fraudulent conduct or misrepresentation, Anthem may rescind, cancel, or terminate this Policy, effective on the date of the fraudulent conduct or misrepresentation regardless of the date Anthem discovered such conduct. Employer shall be liable to Anthem for any and all payments made, as well as losses or damages sustained by Anthem arising as a result of such Employer conduct.
- In the event that this Policy terminates or is terminated prior to the end of a Policy Period, the stop loss limits under this Policy shall not be prorated, and Anthem shall not reimburse Employer for any Paid Claims unless the Specific Stop Loss Limit and/or the Aggregate Stop Loss Limit or the Minimum Aggregate Stop Loss Limit, if greater, have been met. THIRD PARTY ADMINISTRATOR ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICE AGREEMENT S105 HEALTH REIMBURSEMENT ARRANGEMENT PLAN

Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government

1. Introduction

> TPA Service Statement

Chard, Snyder & Associates, LLC provides TPA expertise to Plan Sponsors for the alleviation of administrative requirements related to qualified and non-qualified employee benefit plans under current laws and regulations.

> Administrative Agreement Description

This Agreement outlines applicable services and fees offered by Chard, Snyder & Associates, LLC for the implementation and administration of a Section 105 Health Reimbursement Arrangement Plan ("HRA" or "Plan"). Request for services must be authorized by execution of this Agreement by Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government ("Plan Sponsor" or "Employer") and Chard, Snyder & Associates, LLC ("TPA").

2. TPA Service Package Synopsis

Services Offered

TPA will provide the services described in Schedule A. These services will be based upon information supplied by the Plan Sponsor and its Participants. The TPA shall perform services in the order work is received.

> Services Unavailable

TPA will not provide the following services:

- o Legal services such as Plan drafting and/or legal counsel;
- o Services required of the ERISA Plan Administrator as "defined in the Plan";
- Services pertaining to COBRA Administration as "defined in the Plan" unless the Plan Sponsor has signed a full or FSA-only COBRA Administrative Agreement for the TPA

3. Plan Sponsor Responsibilities

The Plan Sponsor shall be responsible for the following activities associated with the setup, administration and implementation of a Section 105 Health Reimbursement Arrangement Plan:

- O Provide the TPA with any information deemed necessary, including, but not limited to, employee census records, plan year enrollment data, checking account and bank related information relating to the Plan, and changes in employment status and/or contributions of the Plan's Participants. The TPA relies on the accuracy of the information furnished by the Plan Sponsor or the Plan Sponsor's advisors. The TPA will not be responsible for errors due to reliance upon information provided by the Plan Sponsor. Corrections of such errors, and information not provided in a compatible electronic format may cause extraordinary labor charges and may be subject to additional billable fees as described in the Fee Statement;
- O Provide Payroll Contribution Reporting to TPA each pay period in order for TPA to post participant contribution amounts to participant accounts each pay period and for the Plan Sponsor to verify and report to TPA participant status such as active or termination and contribution amount changes. For eligible Plans that set up Recurring Contribution Reporting, Plan Sponsor will provide a Payroll Contribution Report as of the first payroll at the beginning of the plan year. The TPA will then automatically post recurring contributions to the Plan each pay period throughout the remainder of the plan year on behalf of the Plan Sponsor. Plan Sponsors that set up Recurring Contribution Reporting will be responsible for reporting to TPA participant changes such as status changes and contribution amount changes. TPA will process contributions to the Plan based on the Recurring Contribution Report received for the first payroll each pay period and treat all participants as active unless otherwise notified by the Plan Sponsor;
- o Payment of validated claims made pursuant to the Plan;
- o Payment of expenses incidental to the Plan, except for expenses specifically assumed by the TPA in this Agreement;
- o Delegation of the responsibilities of ERISA Plan Administration;
- o Delegation of the responsibilities of COBRA Plan Administration;
- o Timely and accurate filing of requisite reports. Most reports subject to penalty for late filing;

 Compliance with Plan regulations under the Internal Revenue Code, as amended and any other governing regulations and/or entities.

4. TPA Account Funding and Payment

TPA will operate an account to pay claims approved by Plan Sponsor (the "TPA's Account"). Plan Sponsor authorizes TPA to pay approved claims by checks issued from the TPA's Account, or ACH transfers issued from the TPA's Account, and payable to corresponding Plan participants. The Plan Sponsor shall enter into such agreements and provide instructions to its bank as are necessary to implement this section of the Agreement.

Funding for any payment approved to pay claims under the Plan is the sole responsibility of the Plan Sponsor, and the Plan Sponsor agrees to accept liability for, and provide sufficient funds to satisfy, all payments to Participants under the Plan. If the Plan Sponsor does not satisfy the requirements set forth herein in a timely fashion, the TPA reserves the right to suspend its services until such obligations are met.

If the Plan Sponsor has chosen the weekly funding option, the following shall apply: (1) at least one week prior to the date on which TPA first provides the Services, Plan Sponsor will make a deposit into the TPA's Account in an amount equal to 5% of the expected annual elections; and (2) deposits into the TPA's Account will be processed as selected by the Plan Sponsor in the implementation papers regarding commencement of the services under this Agreement. If the Plan Sponsor has chosen the daily funding option, the following shall apply: (1) Plan Sponsor will deposit funds into the TPA Account to cover benefit claims incurred by Plan participants on a daily basis; (2) such daily deposit shall be processed in an amount equal to the total benefit claims approved for reimbursement during that day; and (3) TPA will notify the Plan Sponsor as of the closing of operations the total amount of claims pending to be reimbursed processed during that working day. Please refer to the Plan's implementation papers for additional fund processing details.

TPA shall have sole authority to provide whatever notifications, instructions or directions as may be necessary to accomplish the disbursement of such Plan Sponsor funds to pay for approved claims. TPA is merely a collections agent for the Plan Sponsor and any funds collected belong to the Plan Sponsor (and not to TPA or the Plan). Plan Sponsor agrees to sufficiently fund the bank account from which funds will be transferred to TPA, remove any filters to prevent TPA from conducting an ACH Pull, and monitor its balance to prevent overdraft.

Notwithstanding the preceding, Plan Sponsor and TPA agree that funds submitted by Plan Sponsor in accordance with the terms specific in this section are general assets of Plan Sponsor and not "Plan assets" as defined in the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA") and regulations thereunder. Plan Sponsor warrants that the funds transferred to TPA in accordance with the terms specified in this section are not deposited in an account, fund, or trust under the name of the Plan. As of the termination of this Agreement, TPA agrees to return to Plan Sponsor any unused funds after all Plan claims pending to be reimbursed are paid to Plan participants and after all invoices for services rendered by TPA are paid in full by Plan Sponsor.

5. Reports and Data, Ownership

All reports, data, and Plan-related information shall remain the sole property of the Plan Sponsor. The TPA will provide the Plan Sponsor with any requested information using the electronic or printed format as used by the TPA for administration procedures.

6. Termination of this Agreement

> Willful Execution and Termination

This Agreement will be in effect beginning the date the Plan Sponsor and the TPA (the Parties of this Agreement) provide written execution and will end upon termination. Either Party may terminate this Agreement as of the first day of any Plan Year by providing a sixty (60) day prior written notice. Either Party may terminate this Agreement during the Plan Year if the other Party has materially breached this Agreement. In that case, the breaching Party will have thirty (30) days to correct the breach. If the breaching Party does not correct the breach within that time, the non-breaching Party will have the right to terminate the Agreement. If TPA is the breaching Party and does not correct the breach in accordance with this Section, then TPA agrees to waive termination fees listed in Schedule 1 that are normally applied to terminating groups.

> Automatic Termination

This Agreement shall automatically terminate as of:

- The effective date of any legislation which makes the Plan and/or this Agreement illegal;
- The date the Plan Sponsor becomes insolvent, bankrupt, or subject to liquidation, receivership, or conservatorship; or
- The termination date of the Plan (not to be misconstrued with the end of a Plan Year), subject to any Agreement between the Parties regarding the adjudication of Plan Benefits after the Plan is terminated.

> Modifications and Amendments

This Agreement (and the attached Schedules) represents the entire Agreement between both Parties and may not be modified or amended by Plan Sponsor without written consent of TPA. TPA may amend this Agreement from time to time upon written notice to Plan Sponsor; provided, however, that if the Plan Sponsor objects to any such amendment or modification, it may exercise its termination rights under this Agreement.

Rights of Assignment

This Agreement cannot be assigned by the Plan Sponsor without TPA's written consent.

7. Fee Schedule and Terms of Payment

> Fees Statement and Guarantees

The Plan Sponsor agrees to pay TPA appropriate fees as indicated in Schedule 1 and deemed necessary by this Agreement. Fees are based upon the scope of services to be performed. To the extent Plan Sponsor has prefunded amounts as forth Section 4 above, any undisputed TPA invoice for services rendered that remains unpaid by Plan Sponsor after thirty (30) days or more past due may be deducted from the TPA's Account by the TPA through an ACH Pull. The TPA reserves the right to require additional fees for extraordinary expenses which include but are not limited to multi- location groups, groups which necessitate travel expenses, customized and/or TPA nonstandard Plan Sponsor requested materials, IRC changes to the Plan that required plan design changes which may cause extraordinary labor, plan document revisions and mailing expenses, corrections of errors and information not provided in a compatible format by the Plan Sponsor which may cause extraordinary labor, TPA approved and reasonable changes to prototype plan documents requested by the Plan Sponsor, and services in addition to what is provided with this Agreement. Prior notification will be given, if applicable. The fees stated in this Agreement are guaranteed for a period of 36 months, commencing on the date of this agreement.

> Fee Frequency

The TPA will provide billing for services as follows:

- Plan Document Fees, and Installation and Implementation Fees will be billed at or before the first month of the Plan Year:
- O Base Annual Fee will be billed at or before the first month of the Plan Year:
- o Monthly Administrative Fees for services incurred will be calculated and billed at the end of each Plan Month;
- o Termination Fees for services will be billed at time of Plan Termination;
- Additional Fees for extraordinary expenses as described in the Fee Statement will be billed in accordance with services incurred.

> Payment Requirements

The TPA provides the following payment requirements for the administration of a Section 105 Health Reimbursement Arrangement Plan:

- Monthly Administrative Fees shall be based on number of Participants. Participants are defined as all eligible employees who have submitted an election form (or other conveyance of enrollment as deemed by the Plan Sponsor) expressing intent to participate in the Plan's Health Reimbursement Arrangement Account for the Plan Year. The Participant count obtained from results of the enrollment process shall be commensurate of the regular monthly Administrative Fee for the entire Plan Year. Additional consideration will be given for mergers, spin-offs, acquisitions, partial terminations (layoffs) and high enrollment periods throughout the Plan Year.
- Amounts outstanding over 60 (sixty) days will be considered delinquent. Failure to make timely payments can and will result in work being stopped. TPA reserves the right to charge a 1.5% finance fee on unpaid balances that are ninety (90) days or more past due.

8. Statement of Disclosure

The services provided are not designed for the disclosure of errors, fraud, and / or illegal acts that may exist, nor can they be relied on for such disclosure. In addition, the TPA has no responsibility to identify and communicate significant deficiencies or material weaknesses in the Plan Sponsor's internal control.

9. Indemnification

Plan Sponsor agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold TPA, its representatives and employees harmless and to reimburse TPA for any losses TPA might suffer as a result of the Plan Sponsor's failure to comply with its representations and warranties and with the terms and conditions of this Agreement, or to otherwise timely provide TPA with information and/or documentation reasonably requested by TPA that is necessary for TPA to fulfill the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The terms of this paragraph will remain in effect indefinitely regardless of why and when this Agreement terminates.

10. Consequential Damages, Limitation of Liability

> Consequential Damages

Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, TPA will not be liable to the Plan Sponsor for any special, indirect, incidental, consequential or similar damages, including lost revenue, lost profits and lost or damaged data, even if TPA was advised of the possibility of such damages.

> Limitation of Liability

Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, in no event will TPA's aggregate liability under this Agreement for all damages permitted under this Agreement exceed the annual service fee paid by the plan sponsor to TPA during the 12 months before TPA receives written notice of the first damages claim. This limitation on TPA's liability for permitted damages will not apply to permitted damages caused by TPA's fraud, gross negligence or willful misconduct.

11. Waiver of Class Action / Disclosure

This section contains provisions regarding a waiver of class and collective or group actions.

Each Party may bring claims against the other only in its individual capacity and not as a plaintiff, representative or named Party in any putative class or representative proceeding.

Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government

1. Introduction

> TPA Service Statement

Chard, Snyder & Associates, LLC provides TPA expertise to Plan Sponsors for the alleviation of administrative requirements related to qualified and non-qualified employee benefit plans under current laws and regulations.

> Administrative Agreement Description

This Agreement outlines applicable services and fees offered by Chard, Snyder & Associates, LLC for the implementation and administration of a Section 105 Health Reimbursement Arrangement Plan ("HRA" or "Plan"). Request for services must be authorized by execution of this Agreement by Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government ("Plan Sponsor" or "Employer") and Chard, Snyder & Associates, LLC ("TPA").

2. TPA Service Package Synopsis

> Services Offered

TPA will provide the services described in Schedule A. These services will be based upon information supplied by the Plan Sponsor and its Participants. The TPA shall perform services in the order work is received.

> Services Unavailable

TPA will not provide the following services:

- o Legal services such as Plan drafting and/or legal counsel;
- o Services required of the ERISA Plan Administrator as "defined in the Plan";
- Services pertaining to COBRA Administration as "defined in the Plan" unless the Plan Sponsor has signed a full or FSA-only COBRA Administrative Agreement for the TPA

3. Plan Sponsor Responsibilities

The Plan Sponsor shall be responsible for the following activities associated with the setup, administration and implementation of a Section 105 Health Reimbursement Arrangement Plan:

- Provide the TPA with any information deemed necessary, including, but not limited to, employee census records, plan year enrollment data, checking account and bank related information relating to the Plan, and changes in employment status and/or contributions of the Plan's Participants. The TPA relies on the accuracy of the information furnished by the Plan Sponsor or the Plan Sponsor's advisors. The TPA will not be responsible for errors due to reliance upon information provided by the Plan Sponsor. Corrections of such errors, and information not provided in a compatible electronic format may cause extraordinary labor charges and may be subject to additional billable fees as described in the Fee Statement;
- Provide Payroll Contribution Reporting to TPA each pay period in order for TPA to post participant contribution amounts to participant accounts each pay period and for the Plan Sponsor to verify and report to TPA participant status such as active or termination and contribution amount changes. For eligible Plans that set up Recurring Contribution Reporting, Plan Sponsor will provide a Payroll Contribution Report as of the first payroll at the beginning of the plan year. The TPA will then automatically post recurring contributions to the Plan each pay period throughout the remainder of the plan year on behalf of the Plan Sponsor. Plan Sponsors that set up Recurring Contribution Reporting will be responsible for reporting to TPA participant changes such as status changes and contribution amount changes. TPA will process contributions to the Plan based on the Recurring Contribution Report received for the first payroll each pay period and treat all participants as active unless otherwise notified by the Plan Sponsor;
- o Payment of validated claims made pursuant to the Plan;
- o Payment of expenses incidental to the Plan, except for expenses specifically assumed by the TPA in this Agreement;
- o Delegation of the responsibilities of ERISA Plan Administration;
- o Delegation of the responsibilities of COBRA Plan Administration;
- o Timely and accurate filing of requisite reports. Most reports subject to penalty for late filing;



 Compliance with Plan regulations under the Internal Revenue Code, as amended and any other governing regulations and/or entities.

4. TPA Account Funding and Payment

TPA will operate an account to pay claims approved by Plan Sponsor (the "TPA's Account"). Plan Sponsor authorizes TPA to pay approved claims by checks issued from the TPA's Account, or ACH transfers issued from the TPA's Account, and payable to corresponding Plan participants. The Plan Sponsor shall enter into such agreements and provide instructions to its bank as are necessary to implement this section of the Agreement.

Funding for any payment approved to pay claims under the Plan is the sole responsibility of the Plan Sponsor, and the Plan Sponsor agrees to accept liability for, and provide sufficient funds to satisfy, all payments to Participants under the Plan. If the Plan Sponsor does not satisfy the requirements set forth herein in a timely fashion, the TPA reserves the right to suspend its services until such obligations are met.

If the Plan Sponsor has chosen the weekly funding option, the following shall apply: (1) at least one week prior to the date on which TPA first provides the Services, Plan Sponsor will make a deposit into the TPA's Account in an amount equal to 5% of the expected annual elections; and (2) deposits into the TPA's Account will be processed as selected by the Plan Sponsor in the implementation papers regarding commencement of the services under this Agreement. If the Plan Sponsor has chosen the daily funding option, the following shall apply: (1) Plan Sponsor will deposit funds into the TPA Account to cover benefit claims incurred by Plan participants on a daily basis; (2) such daily deposit shall be processed in an amount equal to the total benefit claims approved for reimbursement during that day; and (3) TPA will notify the Plan Sponsor as of the closing of operations the total amount of claims pending to be reimbursed processed during that working day. Please refer to the Plan's implementation papers for additional fund processing details.

TPA shall have sole authority to provide whatever notifications, instructions or directions as may be necessary to accomplish the disbursement of such Plan Sponsor funds to pay for approved claims. TPA is merely a collections agent for the Plan Sponsor and any funds collected belong to the Plan Sponsor (and not to TPA or the Plan). Plan Sponsor agrees to sufficiently fund the bank account from which funds will be transferred to TPA, remove any filters to prevent TPA from conducting an ACH Pull, and monitor its balance to prevent overdraft.

Notwithstanding the preceding, Plan Sponsor and TPA agree that funds submitted by Plan Sponsor in accordance with the terms specific in this section are general assets of Plan Sponsor and not "Plan assets" as defined in the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 ("ERISA") and regulations thereunder. Plan Sponsor warrants that the funds transferred to TPA in accordance with the terms specified in this section are not deposited in an account, fund, or trust under the name of the Plan. As of the termination of this Agreement, TPA agrees to return to Plan Sponsor any unused funds after all Plan claims pending to be reimbursed are paid to Plan participants and after all invoices for services rendered by TPA are paid in full by Plan Sponsor.

5. Reports and Data, Ownership

All reports, data, and Plan-related information shall remain the sole property of the Plan Sponsor. The TPA will provide the Plan Sponsor with any requested information using the electronic or printed format as used by the TPA for administration procedures.

6. Termination of this Agreement

➤ Willful Execution and Termination

This Agreement will be in effect beginning the date the Plan Sponsor and the TPA (the Parties of this Agreement) provide written execution and will end upon termination. Either Party may terminate this Agreement as of the first day of any Plan Year by providing a sixty (60) day prior written notice. Either Party may terminate this Agreement during the Plan Year if the other Party has materially breached this Agreement. In that case, the breaching Party will have thirty (30) days to correct the breach. If the breaching Party does not correct the breach within that time, the non-breaching Party will have the right to terminate the Agreement. If TPA is the breaching Party and does not correct the breach in accordance with this Section, then TPA agrees to waive termination fees listed in Schedule 1 that are normally applied to terminating groups.



> Automatic Termination

This Agreement shall automatically terminate as of:

- The effective date of any legislation which makes the Plan and/or this Agreement illegal;
- The date the Plan Sponsor becomes insolvent, bankrupt, or subject to liquidation, receivership, or conservatorship; or
- o The termination date of the Plan (not to be misconstrued with the end of a Plan Year), subject to any Agreement between the Parties regarding the adjudication of Plan Benefits after the Plan is terminated.

> Modifications and Amendments

This Agreement (and the attached Schedules) represents the entire Agreement between both Parties and may not be modified or amended by Plan Sponsor without written consent of TPA. TPA may amend this Agreement from time to time upon written notice to Plan Sponsor; provided, however, that if the Plan Sponsor objects to any such amendment or modification, it may exercise its termination rights under this Agreement.

> Rights of Assignment

This Agreement cannot be assigned by the Plan Sponsor without TPA's written consent.

7. Fee Schedule and Terms of Payment

> Fees Statement and Guarantees

The Plan Sponsor agrees to pay TPA appropriate fees as indicated in Schedule 1 and deemed necessary by this Agreement. Fees are based upon the scope of services to be performed. To the extent Plan Sponsor has prefunded amounts as forth Section 4 above, any undisputed TPA invoice for services rendered that remains unpaid by Plan Sponsor after thirty (30) days or more past due may be deducted from the TPA's Account by the TPA through an ACH Pull. The TPA reserves the right to require additional fees for extraordinary expenses which include but are not limited to multi-location groups, groups which necessitate travel expenses, customized and/or TPA nonstandard Plan Sponsor requested materials, IRC changes to the Plan that required plan design changes which may cause extraordinary labor, plan document revisions and mailing expenses, corrections of errors and information not provided in a compatible format by the Plan Sponsor which may cause extraordinary labor, TPA approved and reasonable changes to prototype plan documents requested by the Plan Sponsor, and services in addition to what is provided with this Agreement. Prior notification will be given, if applicable. The fees stated in this Agreement are guaranteed for a period of 36 months, commencing on the date of this agreement.

> Fee Frequency

The TPA will provide billing for services as follows:

- o Plan Document Fees, and Installation and Implementation Fees will be billed at or before the first month of the Plan Year;
- o Base Annual Fee will be billed at or before the first month of the Plan Year;
- o Monthly Administrative Fees for services incurred will be calculated and billed at the end of each Plan Month;
- o Termination Fees for services will be billed at time of Plan Termination;
- Additional Fees for extraordinary expenses as described in the Fee Statement will be billed in accordance with services incurred.

> Payment Requirements

The TPA provides the following payment requirements for the administration of a Section 105 Health Reimbursement Arrangement Plan:

- Monthly Administrative Fees shall be based on number of Participants. Participants are defined as all eligible employees who have submitted an election form (or other conveyance of enrollment as deemed by the Plan Sponsor) expressing intent to participate in the Plan's Health Reimbursement Arrangement Account for the Plan Year. The Participant count obtained from results of the enrollment process shall be commensurate of the regular monthly Administrative Fee for the entire Plan Year. Additional consideration will be given for mergers, spin-offs, acquisitions, partial terminations (layoffs) and high enrollment periods throughout the Plan Year.
- Amounts outstanding over 60 (sixty) days will be considered delinquent. Failure to make timely payments can and will result in work being stopped. TPA reserves the right to charge a 1.5% finance fee on unpaid balances that are ninety (90) days or more past due.



8. Statement of Disclosure

The services provided are not designed for the disclosure of errors, fraud, and / or illegal acts that may exist, nor can they be relied on for such disclosure. In addition, the TPA has no responsibility to identify and communicate significant deficiencies or material weaknesses in the Plan Sponsor's internal control.

9. Indemnification

Plan Sponsor agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold TPA, its representatives and employees harmless and to reimburse TPA for any losses TPA might suffer as a result of the Plan Sponsor's failure to comply with its representations and warranties and with the terms and conditions of this Agreement, or to otherwise timely provide TPA with information and/or documentation reasonably requested by TPA that is necessary for TPA to fulfill the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The terms of this paragraph will remain in effect indefinitely regardless of why and when this Agreement terminates.

10. Consequential Damages, Limitation of Liability

> Consequential Damages

Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, TPA will not be liable to the Plan Sponsor for any special, indirect, incidental, consequential or similar damages, including lost revenue, lost profits and lost or damaged data, even if TPA was advised of the possibility of such damages.

> Limitation of Liability

Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, in no event will TPA's aggregate liability under this Agreement for all damages permitted under this Agreement exceed the annual service fee paid by the plan sponsor to TPA during the 12 months before TPA receives written notice of the first damages claim. This limitation on TPA's liability for permitted damages will not apply to permitted damages caused by TPA's fraud, gross negligence or willful misconduct.

11. Waiver of Class Action / Disclosure

This section contains provisions regarding a waiver of class and collective or group actions.

Each Party may bring claims against the other only in its individual capacity and not as a plaintiff, representative or named Party in any putative class or representative proceeding.



SCHEDULE A, TPA ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES S105 HEALTH REIMBURSEMENT ARRANGEMENT PLAN

The attached action is requesting authorization to amend the authorized strength in the Division of Waste Management by abolishing one hundred twenty (120) classified Resource Recovery Operator positions (Grade 515N) and one (1) unclassified Resource Recovery Operator positions (Grade 515N), creating one hundred twenty (120) classified Resource Recovery Operator positions (Grade 518N) and one (1) unclassified Resource Recovery Operator position (Grade 518N), and transferring the incumbents to the new positions. This action also is requesting authorization to amend the authorized strength in the Division of Waste Management by abolishing nine (9) classified Public Service Supervisor Sr. positions (Grade 518N), creating nine (9) classified Resource Recovery Operator Supervisor Sr. positions (Grade 520N) and transferring the incumbents to the new positions. There are four (4) Public Service Supervisor Sr. positions that do not supervise Resource Recovery Operators and their pay grade and title will remain the same. The effective date of these actions is December 30, 2024.

Why are you requesting?

We advertise for vacant Resource Recovery Operator positions monthly; however, we continue to maintain approximately a twenty-three percent (23%) vacancy rate. Currently, twenty-eight (28) out of one hundred twenty-one (121) authorized Resource Recovery Operator positions are vacant. This is due to an ongoing shortage of CDL drivers in our employment market and our rate of pay for Resource Recovery Operators.





Upon the request of the Department of Environmental Quality and Public Works, with the approval of the CAO, and in accordance with the Code of Ordinances, the Division of Human Resources conducted a classification study on the requested positions. The result of the study recommended the following:

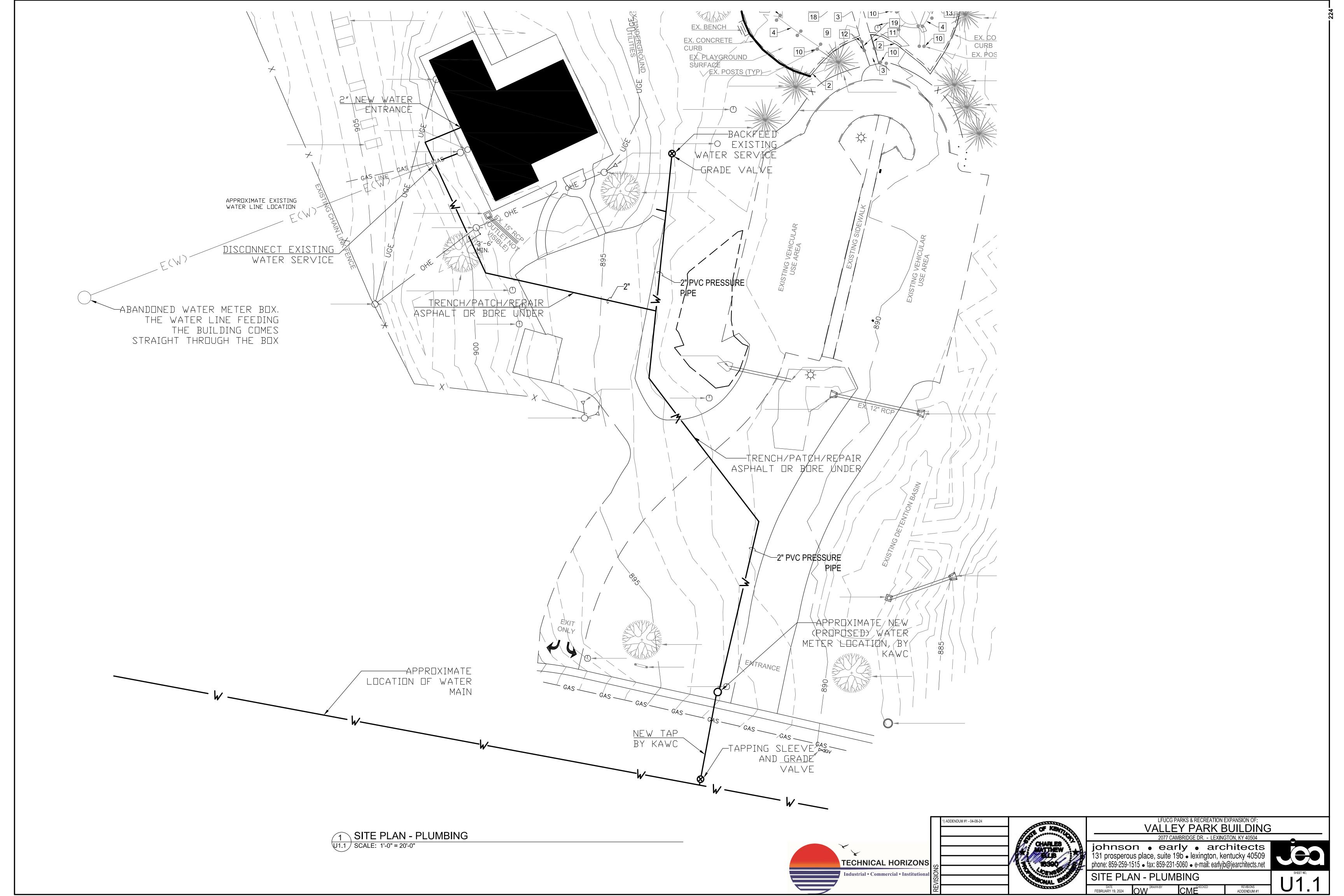

Upon removal of existing ceilings the existing sheathing could be fully observed from the underside. It has been noted that the sheathing currently in-place is a mixture of thicknesses ranging from 3/8" - 3/4" and has large areas of water damage/deterioration. This combination of factors makes it impossible to patch back only portions of the roof that are damaged, and maintaining the planarity of the roof sheathing.

- Approximately 25% of the existing roof sheathing has water damage or deterioration due to prolonged water exposure. These areas were not observable prior to demolition of the ceilings areas below.
- An unknown quantity of the roof sheathing appears to be 3/8" which does not meet the current building code.
- Total roof area to be replaced outside of what was included in the contract documents is approximately 3,697sf.

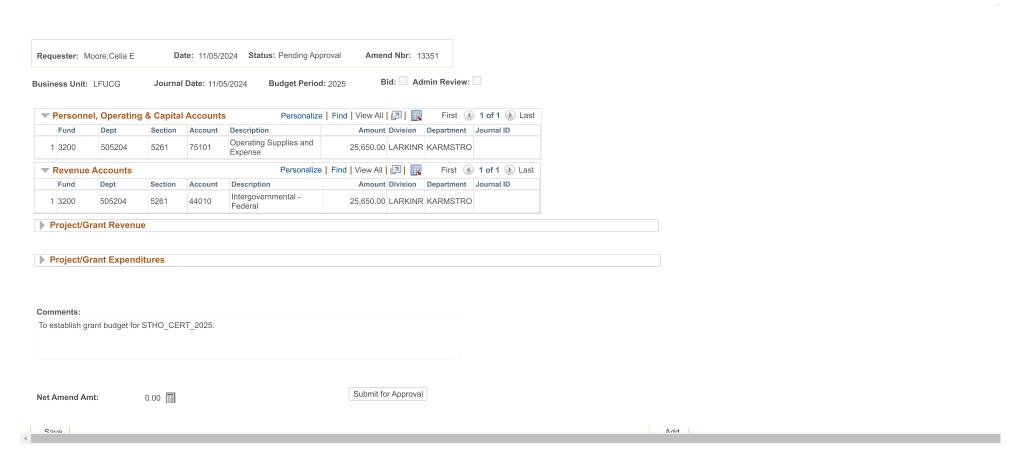

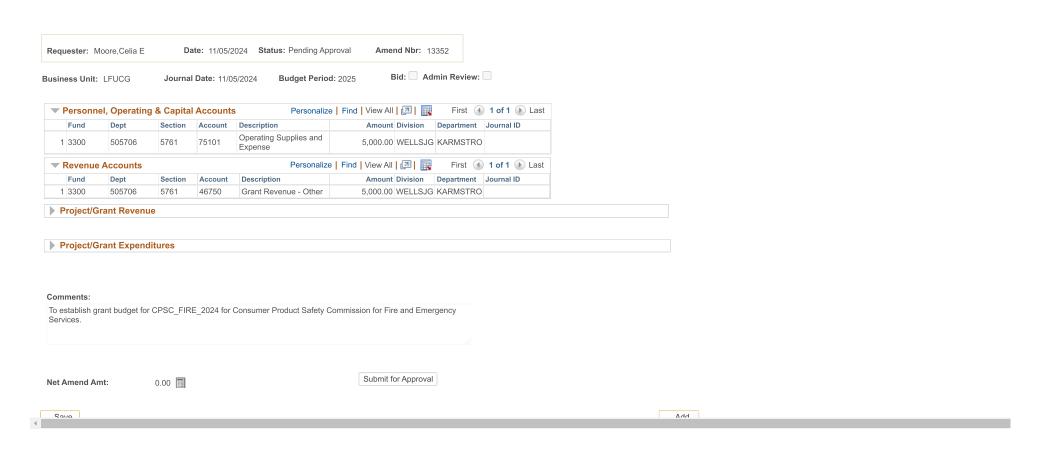

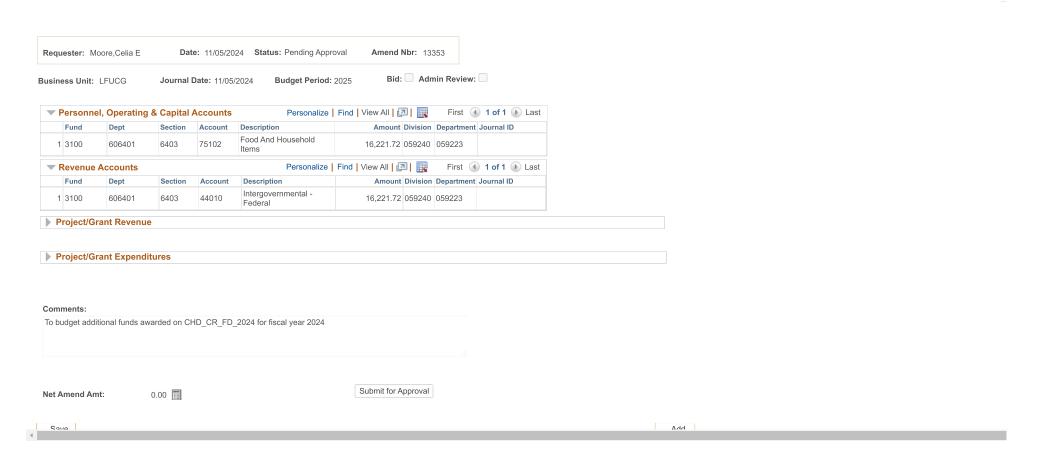

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT, made and entered into on the <u>21st</u> day of <u>November 2024</u>, and between the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, an urban county government of the Commonwealth of Kentucky pursuant to KRS Chapter 67A, and located at 200 East Main Street, Lexington, Fayette County, Kentucky 40507 (hereinafter referred to as "Government") and Marinda Beasley, 1237 Spring Run Road, Lexington, KY 40514 (hereinafter referred to as "Contractor")

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the Government has been awarded federal funds from the Commonwealth of Kentucky Justice Cabinet for the implementation and operation of a Forensic Nursing Advocacy Program;

WHEREAS, the Government seeks qualified Forensic Nursing Advocates willing to provide advocacy and administrative services in support of the Lexington Police Department's Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) Program;

WHEREAS, the Contractor has been selected as an independent contractor for the performance of advocacy and administrative services;

WHEREAS, the parties have negotiated the Contractor's rate of pay;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and mutually agreed upon promises, conditions and covenants hereinafter set forth, the parties hereto agree as follows:

SECTION I

OBLIGATIONS OF GOVERNMENT

- 1. Government agrees to pay Contractor \$220.00 for each scheduled work shift. A "work shift" is defined as a 4-hour period agreed to by both the Contractor and the Government in which the Contractor performs advocacy and administrative services. Payment shall be made within 30 days of invoice.
- 2. Government agrees to reimburse Contractor in an amount not to exceed the reasonable cost of a prepaid annual premium for herein described medical liability insurance upon receipt of certificate of insurance and submission of invoice. Reimbursement shall be made within 30 days of invoice.
- 3. Government agrees to pay Contractor for the preparation and provision of professional testimony in a court of law in the amount of \$150 per request. Payment shall be made within 30 days of invoice.

SECTION II

OBLIGATIONS OF CONTRACTOR

- 1. Contractor agrees to provide his or her availability weekly and to otherwise consult with the Government's Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner Manager to establish the Contractor's work shifts based on the Contractor's availability and the Government's needs.
- 2. The Government's Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner Manager shall supervise the Contractor's performance of advocacy and administrative duties to ensure high standards are maintained.
- 3. Contractor agrees to initiate prompt follow-up contact with Sexual Assault Survivors, contact local resources to address survivor post-examination needs, review and evaluate historical case files, provide follow-up forensic and investigative recommendations, use digitization equipment and software to archive historical case files, and complete daily activity reports.
- 4. Contractor agrees to participate in training coordinated by the Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner Manager related to nursing and advocacy topics.
- 5. Contractor agrees to cooperate with the Government's Division of Police, all other law enforcement agencies utilizing the services, all county attorneys, all Commonwealth Attorneys, the Bluegrass Rape Crisis Center, and employees of the Saint Joseph Health System. Contractor agrees to maintain medical liability insurance, throughout the term of the Agreement, in the principal amount of not less than Five Hundred Thousand (\$500,000) Dollars per occurrence and One Million (\$1,00,000) Dollars aggregate, per policy year, for any act or omission in the furnishing of professional medical services. Said policy of insurance shall name the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government and Saint Joseph Health System as 'additional insureds' thereunder. Contractor shall negotiate and contract with an insurance company for this coverage and deliver proof of insurance to the Government. If this Agreement is terminated before the expiration of the prepaid period by either party for any reason, insurance shall be cancelled with pro rata amount being refunded to the Government.
- 6. Contractor agrees to submit invoices to the Government for all work shifts at least once per month, no later than the tenth day of the following month.
- 7. As criminal cases may take a significant amount of time to be adjudicated, Contractor agrees to maintain contact with the Government for a period of three years following termination of his or her agreement, at no additional cost. Such contact includes but is not necessarily limited to notification of current home address, telephone number, and place of employment for the three-year period. Contractor agrees to comply with all subpoenas for all cases in which he or she performed examinations for the three-year period at no additional cost.

SECTION III

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. This Agreement shall be effective from November 21, 2024 through September 30, 2025.
- 2. This Agreement may be terminated by either party for any reason upon thirty (30) written day notice to the other party. In the event of termination, the Contractor shall be paid in full for all services performed to the date of such termination in accordance with Section I, Paragraph 1 and Paragraph 2.

- 3. The Government acknowledges and agrees that this professional services agreement shall not in any way interfere with or prevent the engagement of the Contractor in other employment, presently or otherwise. Such other employment is not to interfere with the performance of duties under this Professional Services Agreement.
- 4. The Contractor acknowledges that he or she is an independent contractor under this agreement and not any employee of the Government for any purpose.
- 5. The Contractor certifies, in accordance with Executive Order 12549 (Debarment and Suspension February 18, 1986) that to the best of his or her knowledge and belief, that he or she:

Is not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared negligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions or contract by and Federal department or agency for noncompliance with the Federal Labor Standards, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 as amended, Executive Order 11246 as amended or any other federal law;

- a. Has not within a three-year period preceding this proposal been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against his or her for commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (Federal, State, or local) transaction or contract under a public transaction; violation of federal or state antitrust statues or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements, or receiving stolen property;
- b. Is not presently indicted for or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a government entity (Federal, State, or local) with commission of any of the offenses enumerated in paragraph (a) of this certification; and
- c. Has not within a three-year period preceding this proposal had one or more public (Federal, State, or local) transactions or contracts terminated for cause or default.
- 6. This Professional Services Agreement represents the entire and integrated agreement between the Government and the Contractor and supersedes all prior negotiations or agreements, either written or oral. This Agreement may be amended only by written instrument signed by both the Contractor and the Government.
- 7. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

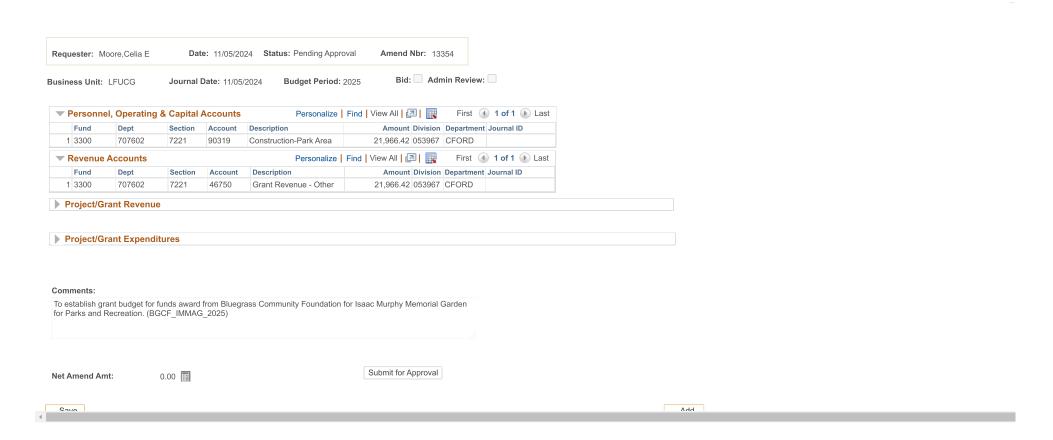
