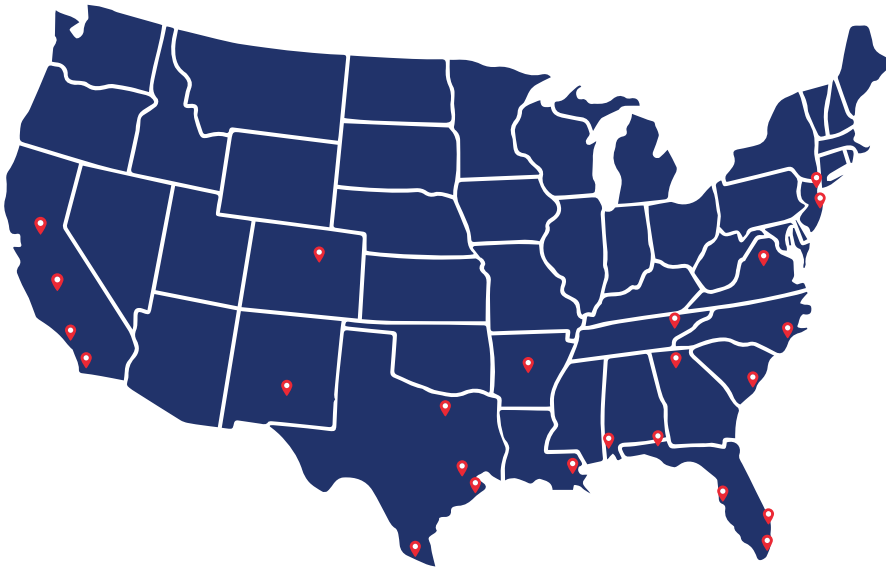

DRC is pleased to present our proposal to provide Storm & Disaster Response and Recovery Services & Equipment to Lexington-Fayette Urban County. We are confident that if awarded this contract, DRC will exceed the County's expectations.

DRC and LFUCG: A Winning Partnership

Following tornadoes in April and May of last year, DRC was activated by several Kentucky jurisdictions to provide Debris Removal Services. DRC executed contracts with the State of Kentucky, as well as Laurel County, Floyd County, and Knott County, KY. In total we removed nearly 70,000 cubic yards of tornado debris, including over 100 trees, on contracts worth over \$1,000,000.

DRC was also activated in 3 jurisdictions following a February flood in 2025. We performed Right-of-Way (ROW) Debris Removal, Reduction, and Site Restoration for Letcher County, KY, Pike County, KY, and the City of Coal Run, KY. 

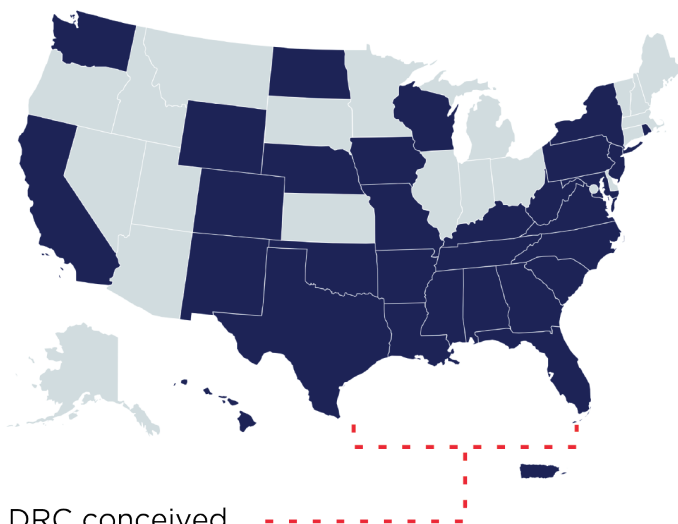

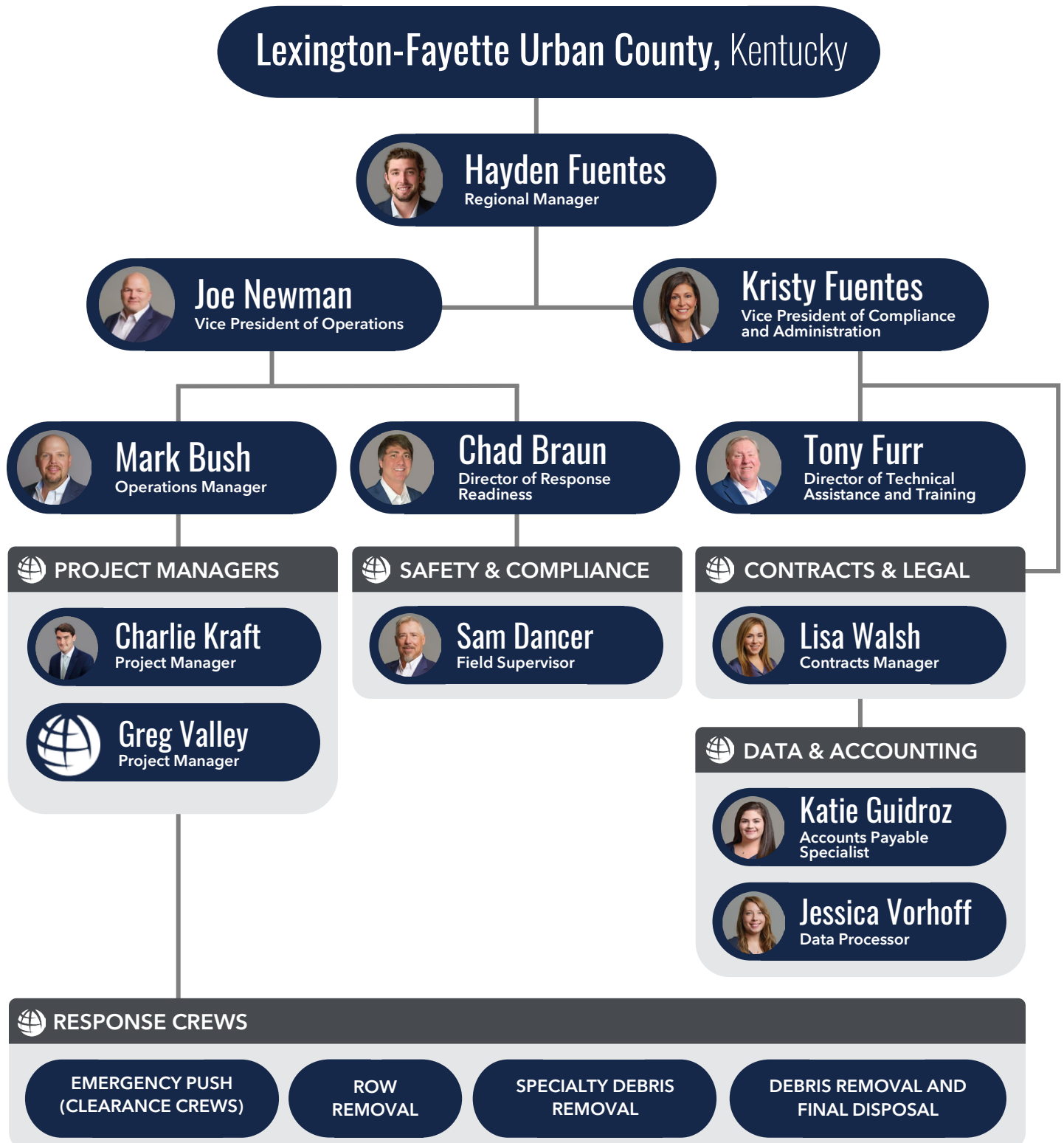
Since its inception, the DRC team has responded to major natural and man-made disasters occurring within the continental United States and its territories. DRC's personnel are trained, motivated, and available for immediate deployment in an emergency response. All assigned personnel will be available to the County as needed. Personnel are NIMS-certified and/or have specialized training in safety and asbestos management. They are equipped with utility vehicles; digital, handheld, multi-state, two-way radios; cellular communications; and handheld computers; as well as a DRC supervisor handbook including required reports and forms for successful disaster response and management. DRC personnel have the experience and/or training to respond **immediately** to disasters.

DRC employs more than 30 Regional and Project Managers. Regional Managers are assigned to specific geographic locations throughout the United States to assist, monitor and lead the project teams in response to emergency situations. In the event of a large-scale disaster, Regional Managers may be mobilized to support recovery efforts in any area of the country. Hayden Fuentes, the Regional Manager for Lexington-Fayette Urban County, is capable of responding to the needs of the County 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

FEMA PUBLIC ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

DRC Emergency Services, LLC has an established record of helping jurisdictions obtain the maximum FEMA reimbursement available under the Public Assistance (PA) Program. Our success reflects not only our operational capabilities, but also our strict adherence to federal guidelines and our commitment to employing experienced, principled professionals who understand the complexities of disaster recovery funding.

The FEMA Public Assistance Program provides financial assistance to state and local governments and certain nonprofit organizations for debris removal, emergency protective measures, and the repair or replacement of disaster-damaged public infrastructure. DRC performs all work in full compliance with the current Public Assistance Program and Policy Guide (PAPPG), FEMA Policy 104-009-2, Version 5.0 (issued January 6, 2025), which governs disasters declared on or after that date. Our team continuously reviews FEMA policy updates to ensure every project aligns with the most current regulatory requirements.

STATE AND FEDERAL PROGRAMS

State emergency management agencies administer Public Assistance funding in coordination with FEMA. These programs mirror the federal framework and are designed to expedite recovery while maintaining compliance with federal regulations. Key programs aligned with FEMA include:

PUBLIC ASSISTANCE GRANTS - Administered by the State to reimburse eligible costs for debris removal, emergency protective measures, and infrastructure restoration. These grants restore essential public services and stabilize impacted communities.

HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM (HMGP) - Provides funding for projects that reduce long-term risk to people and property from natural hazards. Eligible projects may include flood control improvements, structural retrofits, drainage enhancements, and property acquisition.

COMMUNITY DISASTER LOANS (CDL) - Offers financial assistance to local governments experiencing revenue shortfalls due to disaster impacts, allowing them to maintain essential services until revenues recover. In addition to FEMA PA funding, applicants may leverage:

- Federal Public Assistance Grants (up to 75% federal share, or higher if authorized)
- State or Local Matching Funds
- Hazard Mitigation Grant Funding
- HUD Community Development Block Grant (CDBG-DR) Funds
- NRCS Emergency Watershed Protection (EWP) Funding

DRC works closely with applicants and their financial representatives to ensure proper coordination among funding sources while preventing duplication of benefits.

REIMBURSEMENT PROCESS

The FEMA reimbursement process requires careful documentation, compliance, and coordination. DRC guides jurisdictions through each phase:

ELIGIBILITY DETERMINATION - Ensuring debris removal and emergency work meet FEMA's eligibility criteria, including disaster causation, location, and regulatory compliance.

PROJECT FORMULATION - Assisting with development of detailed project documentation outlining scope, quantities, costs, and supporting records.

OBLIGATION OF FUNDS - Supporting timely review and approval so FEMA may obligate the federal share of eligible costs.

DOCUMENTATION AND RECORDKEEPING - Maintaining accurate procurement records, load tickets, equipment logs, labor documentation, disposal records, and invoicing to withstand audit review.

Our disciplined documentation practices help prevent de-obligation and reduce audit risk, ensuring clients receive the reimbursement to which they are entitled.

DEBRIS MONITORING AND COMPLIANCE

Debris removal is often the most visible and immediate recovery activity following a disaster. Proper monitoring is essential to ensure compliance and protect reimbursement eligibility. DRC understands the critical role debris monitoring plays in the FEMA reimbursement process. Monitors serve as the verification link between the contractor, the applicant, and FEMA. Key responsibilities include:

- Verifying eligibility of debris and work locations
- Ensuring contractor compliance with contract terms and FEMA requirements
- Documenting load quantities, debris types, and disposal methods
- Confirming environmental and regulatory compliance
- Performing quality assurance and safety oversight

Accurate, real-time documentation supports project validation and substantiates reimbursement claims. DRC coordinates closely with monitoring firms and the applicant's Public Assistance consultants to reconcile load tickets and project records prior to submission, significantly reducing delays or funding disputes.

EXPERIENCE WITH STATE AND LOCAL AGENCIES

For more than 20 years, DRC has partnered with local governments, state emergency management agencies, and federal officials across the country. Our experience enables us to integrate seamlessly into each jurisdiction's recovery structure.

We coordinate daily with the Applicant, the State Public Assistance Office, FEMA representatives, debris monitoring firms, and the jurisdiction's PA consultant to ensure that every ticket, cost, and line item is reviewed for eligibility prior to submission. This proactive reconciliation process expedites project approval and strengthens documentation integrity.

DRC maintains a strong record of maximizing eligible reimbursement with no de-obligations on properly documented work. Our management team actively participates in state and national emergency management conferences and remains engaged with evolving policies, funding mechanisms, and compliance requirements.

/ FINANCIAL STRENGTH & STABILITY

DRC is one of the most **financially sound and stable companies** in the disaster response industry. With a **bonding capacity of over \$1 billion** and access to dedicated cash and credit lines **of more than \$500 million**, DRC has the ability to manage and complete multiple projects simultaneously without being hindered by a lack of operating capital. During high storm seasons over the past decade, DRC operated substantially out of pocket prior to client payment, yet remained fully capable of providing the critical services necessary to complete all contracts.

- DRC's combined contract total for 2024 is valued at over \$870,000,000. During this time, DRC removed and disposed of more than 20,000,000 cubic yards of debris across ten states.
- In 2021, DRC removed 18,000,000 cubic yards of debris and managed 93 debris management sites in response to Hurricane Ida alone. Our combined contract total for 2021 was valued at over \$402,000,000.

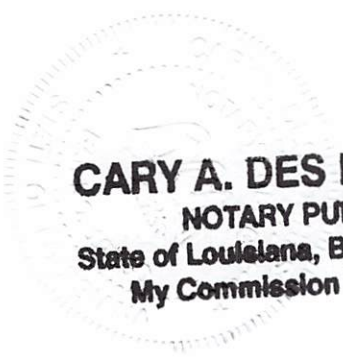

The proposal, when opened, will then be corrected in accordance with such written request(s), provided that the written request is contained in a sealed envelope which is plainly marked "modifications of proposal".
7. Clarification of Submittal: LFUCG reserves the right to obtain clarification of any point in a bid or to obtain additional information from a Respondent.
8. Bribery Clause: By his/her signature on the bid, Respondent certifies that no employee of his/hers, any affiliate or Subcontractor, has bribed or attempted to bribe an officer or employee of the LFUCG.

9. 10. Ambiguity, Conflict or other Errors in RFP: If a Respondent discovers any ambiguity, conflict, discrepancy, omission or other error in the RFP, it shall immediately notify LFUCG of such error in writing and request modification or clarification of the document if allowable by the LFUCG.
11. Agreement to Bid Terms: In submitting this proposal, the Respondent agrees that it has carefully examined the specifications and all provisions relating to the work to be done attached hereto and made part of this proposal. - (d) Failure to diligently advance the work under a contract for construction services;
- (e) The filing of a bankruptcy petition by or against the contractor; or
- (f) Actions that endanger the health, safety or welfare of the LFUCG or its citizens.


B. At Will Termination

Notwithstanding the above provisions, the LFUCG may terminate this contract at will in accordance with the law upon providing thirty (30) days written notice of that intent, Payment for services or goods received prior to termination shall be made by the LFUCG provided these goods or services were provided in a manner acceptable to the LFUCG. Payment for those goods and services shall not be unreasonably withheld.

13. **Assignment of Contract:** The contractor shall not assign or subcontract any portion of the Contract without the express written consent of LFUCG. Any purported assignment or subcontract in violation hereof shall be void. In the event of any proceedings regarding this Contract, the Parties agree that the venue shall be the Fayette County Circuit Court or the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky, Lexington Division. All parties expressly consent to personal jurisdiction and venue in such Court for the limited and sole purpose of proceedings relating to this Contract or any rights or obligations arising thereunder. Service of process may be accomplished by following the procedures prescribed by law.
17. **Ability to Meet Obligations:** Respondent affirmatively states that there are no actions, suits or proceedings of any kind pending against Respondent or, to the knowledge of the Respondent, threatened against the Respondent before or by any court, governmental body or agency or other tribunal or authority which would, if adversely determined, have a materially adverse effect on the authority or ability of Respondent to perform its obligations under this Contract, or which question the legality, validity or enforceability hereof or thereof.
18. Contractor understands and agrees that its employees, agents, or subcontractors are not employees of LFUCG for any purpose whatsoever. Contractor is an independent contractor at all times during the performance of the services specified.
19. If any term or provision of this Contract shall be found to be illegal or unenforceable, the remainder of the contract shall remain in full force and such term or provision shall be deemed stricken.
20. Contractor [or Vendor or Vendor's Employees] will not appropriate or make use of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government (LFUCG) name or any of its trade or service marks or property (including but not limited to any logo or seal), in any promotion, endorsement, advertisement, testimonial or similar use without the prior written consent of the government. If such consent is granted LFUCG reserves the unilateral right, in its sole discretion, to immediately terminate and revoke such use for any reason whatsoever. Contractor agrees that it shall cease and desist from any unauthorized use immediately upon being notified by LFUCG.
