Lexington's CERT team began in 2003 with a Homeland Security grant. Beginning in 2004, we've offered an average of two CERT classes every calendar year. In the 20 years since the program began, we have trained almost 500 people.

While the number of students can vary, we hope to teach at least 20 students per class.

Our classes follow the standard FEMA curriculum, but we have tailored portions of it to apply to Lexington more specifically. Classes are taught by a variety of partners in the community. Our internal emergency management staff coordinates the program and teaches sessions on Disaster Preparedness, Psychological First Aid, and facilitates the final disaster exercise. We partner with radio specialists from E911 to teach the Team Organization session and the Radio Operations session, which we have added to the standard curriculum. We partner with the Chief of Pediatrics at the University of Kentucky Children's Hospital to teach Disaster Medical Operations 1 and 2. We have added Stop-the-Bleed to the standard FEMA curriculum for these sessions. We partner with the Division of Fire for the sessions on Fire Suppression, Search and Rescue, and the final disaster exercise. We are fortunate to have a retired military intelligence operator on staff who teaches the Terrorism session.

In addition to the standard CERT training, which is held one night a week for eight weeks with each session lasting approximately three hours, we have periodic "refresher" trainings. These trainings provide additional individual and community preparedness topics such as weather spotter training, moulage, pandemic preparedness, and first aid and CPR training, among others.

Living in Fayette County, we are lucky to have large numbers of well-trained professional first responders. Though we have only sporadically deployed our CERT teams to assist the city with disaster response, we utilize them heavily for preparedness activities.

We also firmly believe that by developing disaster preparedness and response skills, our CERT members are better able to take care of themselves and their families, and by doing so, allow our first responders to more efficiently help those who aren't able to take care of themselves. By better preparing our households and families, our community is better able to respond to disasters when they occur.

We provide each CERT graduate a backpack of disaster response supplies. Our grant request will include the cost of this equipment per student for five CERT training classes as well as the administrative costs of teaching the class. We are also including a request for a First Aid/CPR/AED course.

Funding is requested for five CERT classes at 20 students each (100 students).
