Amendment No. 1 to Agreement with the Cabinet for Health and Family Services Department of Aging and Independent Living for operation of the

Senior Citizens Center—FY 2017

Request:

Council authorization to execute Amendment No. 1 to Agreement with the Cabinet for Health and Family Services Department of Aging and Independent Living, accepting additional federal funds in the amount of \$3,186 for operation of the Senior Citizens Center—FY 2017

Purpose of Request:

On May 12, 2016 (Resolution No. 257-2016), Council approved acceptance of federal funds from the Cabinet for Health and Family Services Department of Aging and Independent Living under Title III of the Older Americans Act for operation of the Lexington Senior Citizens Center in FY 2017. The Lexington Senior Citizens Center is a multi-purpose community focal point for services to persons 60 and older in Fayette County. Basic center operations include advocacy, counseling, education, health promotion, access to legal assistance, outreach, recreation, and telephone reassurance. LFUCG staff includes a center director, Social Worker, a staff assistant senior, a part-time receptionist, and two part-time van drivers.

What is the cost in this budget year and future budget years?

Original award of federal funds was \$109,153. Amendment No. 1 will provide an additional \$3,186 in federal funds for a new award total of \$112,339. No additional local funds are required. Project funds are used for personnel costs and other operating costs of the center. Funding for future budget years is dependent upon available funding.

Are the funds budgeted? Budget amendment 7926 is in process.
