


Figure 4: TIP Projects Map

RESOLUTION OF THE TRANSPORTATION POLICY COMMITTEE OF THE

LEXINGTON AREA METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION CERTIFICATION OF THE URBAN TRANSPORTATION PLANNING PROCESS

WHEREAS, the Lexington Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is the officially designated agency for transportation planning in the Lexington Urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, the federal regulations pertaining to Urban Transportation Planning, published as 23 CFR 450.334, require the MPO and the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) to certify that the transportation planning process be carried on cooperatively in conformance with the regulations; and

WHEREAS, the federal regulations also require that the metropolitan transportation planning process be carried out in accordance with all applicable requirements including:

- (1) 23 U.S.C. 134, 49 U.S.C 5303; and 23 CFR part 450 Subpart C (450.300 450.340);
- (2) Sections 174 and 176 (c) and (d) of the Clean Air Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. 7504, 7506(c) and (d)) and 40 CFR part 93;
- (3) Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (42 U.S.C. 2000d-1) and 49 CFR part 21;
- (4) 49 U.S.C. 5332, prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, or age in employment or business opportunity;
- (5) Section 1101 (b) of the FAST-ACT (Pub. L. 114-357) and 49 CFR part 26 regarding the involvement of disadvantaged business enterprises in USDOT funded projects;
- (6) 23 CFR part 230, regarding the implementation of an equal employment opportunity program on Federal and Federal-aid highway construction contracts;
- (7) The provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.) and 49 CFR parts 27, 37, and 38;
- (8) The Older Americans Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. 6101), prohibiting discrimination based on age in programs-or activities receiving Federal financial assistance;
- (9) Section 324 of title 23 U.S.C. regarding the prohibition of discrimination based on gender; and
- (10) Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794) and 49 CFR part 27 regarding discrimination against individuals with disabilities.

WHEREAS, the U.S Department of Transportation conducted an on-site certification review at the Lexington Area MPO offices in June, 2019, and issued a subsequent finding that the Lexington Area MPO was fully certified as meeting all pertinent requirements; and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Lexington Area MPO Transportation Policy Committee (TPC) at its regular public meeting of October 28, 2020 certifies, in consideration of the requirements listed herein and to the degree appropriate for the size of the area and the complexity of its transportation problems, that the urban transportation planning process is being carried out in conformance with all the applicable federal requirements.

WHEREAS, Section 134, Title 23, USC requires a continuing comprehensive transportation planning process be carried on cooperatively in areas of more than 50,000 populations; and

WHEREAS, Section 134, Title 23, USC further requires that the urban transportation planning process shall include development of a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) which shall be a staged multi-year program of transportation improvement projects consistent with the transportation plan; and
