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Mr. Morton announced that a neighborhood event, Oakwood Day, would be held September 20, 2025, from 12:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. at Briarwood Dr., and that the Castlewood Neighborhood Association would hold a meeting on Tuesday, September 23, 2025, at 6:00 p.m. at the Loudon House. He thanked the Div. of Engineering and Comm. Chris Ford, Dept. of General Services, for a recent presentation that was given at the Winburn Neighborhood Association meeting about the Winburn Extension project. Lastly, he offered words of support regarding the recent shooting that happened on Winburn Dr.

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Mr. Hale encouraged the Dist. 7 constituents to attend the fall district-wide meeting that would be held on Monday, October 7, 2025, from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at Edythe J. Hayes Middle School and shared that staff from the Div. of Planning would attend.

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Ms. Lynch reminded Dist. 2 residents that a noise variance had been approved and to expect noise from a construction crew between September 15, 2025, and September 27, 2025. She also shared that the Pride Run 5k would take place on Saturday, September 20, 2025, from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at Coldstream Park, and the Masterson Station Neighborhood would hold its annual neighborhood-wide yard sale on Saturday, September 20, 2025.

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Kaelin Reynolds, Dist. 10, spoke about the war in Gaza. He urged the Council to act on behalf of the victims of the war.

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Liam Sturgill, Dist. 9, spoke about the war in Gaza. He spoke in opposition to Israel's actions and urged the Council to act on behalf of the victims of the war.

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Logan R, Dist. 3, spoke in opposition to the war in Gaza, and in opposition to violence here and abroad. He urged the Council to consider legislation that would sever ties with any company that may contribute to the combat.

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Eli Wrinn, Dist. 5, spoke in opposition to the war in Gaza and urged the Council to act on behalf of the victims of war. He opined that the USA, through its power, could do more to compel the fighting to stop.

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Upon motion by Vice Mayor Wu, seconded by Ms. Higgins-Hord, and approved by unanimous vote, the meeting adjourned at 7:43 p.m.
