**SUBJECT: Agreement with Lexington-Fayette County Health Department**

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**Request:** Council authorization to execute agreement with the Lexington-Fayette County Health Department in the amount of \$262,800 for the First Responders and Community Partners Overdose Prevention funded under the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services First Responders - Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act Grant Program.

**Purpose of Request:** On November 1, 2018 (Resolution #663-2018), Council approved acceptance of federal funds from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for operating the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government's First Responders - Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act Program.

Through the First Responders and Community Partners Overdose Prevention Project, the Lexington-Fayette County Health Department will be responsible for dispensing naloxone to first responders (Office of the Fayette County Sheriff), community members and individuals utilizing the needle exchange program, which is a key component of the grant program.

**What is the cost in this budget year and future budget years?** \$262,800 is budgeted. Future budget years will depend on additional grant funding.

**Are the funds budgeted?** Yes. Funds are budgeted as follows: 3190-606105-0001-75101 – SAMHSA\_2019.
