General Government and Planning Committee

February 13, 2024 Summary and Motions

Chair Worley called the meeting to order at 1:02 p.m. Vice Mayor Wu and Committee Members J. Brown, Ellinger, Lynch, LeGris, Sheehan, Baxter, Reynolds, and Plomin were in attendance. Council members Fogle, Monarrez, Gray, and F. Brown were present as non-voting members.

I. January 16, 2024 General Government and Planning Committee Summary

Motion by Ellinger to approve the January 16, 2024, GGP Committee Summary. Seconded by Baxter. Motion passed without dissent.

II. Shelter Feasibility RFP

Commissioner Charlie Lanter presented on the Homeless Shelter Needs Request for Proposals (RFP). Council allocated \$200,000 from FY23 Fund Balance to finance a study that would look at the types of shelters needed in Lexington, where it should be located, the annual cost of operations, innovative solutions beyond typical congregate shelter, and options for populations that are not currently served. Currently, the Office of Housing Advocacy and Community Development has prepared a draft RFP that will be released the week of February 13, 2024.

The Office of Homelessness Prevention and Intervention will provide the vendor with an overview of the current providers/services and share the data from the annual Point in Time Count. The RFP review team consists of LFUCG staff, current providers, and elected officials. After the RFP is released, they expect to review proposals March/April 2024 and award the contract in May 2024. The project period will be from June 2024 to April 2025 and the findings will be presented in May 2025.

No action was taken on this item.

III. Master Plan Presentation

Chris Taylor with the Division of Planning gave an update on the Urban Growth Master Plan. The team for the Master Plan includes TSW, Gresham Smith, Partners for Economic Solutions, Southface, and CivicLex. Taylor reminded Council of the five areas selected for expansion. The process of developing the plan includes gathering information and input, building concepts and a draft plan, and performing a review. They kicked the project off with a community event at Greyline Station on December 6th, 2023. Taylor shared the timeline of the project and expressed that Planning Staff is happy to join any district meetings to engage with residents. A discussion about the survey and community engagement ensued.

No action was taken on this item.

IV. Urban Growth Ordinance ZOTA

Hal Baillie with the Division of Planning presented on behalf of this item. The purpose of this text amendment is to ensure new development is developed equitably and sustainably and to modernize the Zoning Ordinance while creating opportunities to implement the Goals and Objectives of the

Comprehensive Plan. There are 6 zoning reforms every municipality should adopt according to Strong Towns: Eliminate minimum parking requirements; legalize accessory dwelling units; reduce or eliminate minimum lot and unit size mandates; legalize home-based businesses; expand ministerial approvals; and legalize multifamily housing in commercial zones. Several of these reforms have already been adopted. There has been robust outreach and public work on this ZOTA and Planning has worked with numerous stakeholders.

Baillie shared the proposed text changes which includes changes to three residential zones, a creation of a new residential zone, and modifications to two commercial zones. The proposed changes within the text are specifically focused on the development of a more equitable, sustainable, and safer community as Lexington grows up and out. The residential changes were focused on the least utilized zones and will allow for moderate infill and redevelopment within the urban services boundary. These changes will allow for increased density, increased flexibility, and an increased mixture of housing types. Additionally, there is the creation of a commercial node zone which is specifically intended to pull transit to the zone and is designed to be more walkable. It also allows for a mixture of commercial and residential land uses.

In addition to the modifications to the residential zone, they are seeking to include Council's desire for more affordable housing options in the community. Therefore, they have included density bonuses incentivize the production of affordable housing and workforce housing. They selected the B-1 and B-3 zones because it allows for the realignment of permitted land uses to fit the context of the zone. There were some changes to the ZOTA as a result of community feedback and from discussions with Planning Commission.

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT BETWEEN LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT AND LYRIC THEATRE AND CULTURAL ARTS CENTER CORPORATION FOR THE ACCEPTANCE OF COUNCIL CAPITAL EXPENDITURE PROJECT FUNDS AND OTHER FUNDING PROVIDED BY THE LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Organization submitted a proposal to the Urban County Council for Council Capital Project Expenditure Funds to support a one-time capital project pursuant to Supplement C, Section 2 - Council Capital Project Expenditure Policy of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Council Rules and Procedures, and has further requested additional funding from LFUCG related to the proposal; and

WHEREAS, Organization's proposed capital project meets the criteria of the policy and is an appropriate expenditure of public funds; and

WHEREAS, LFUCG seeks to provide Council Capital Project Expenditure Funds to Organization, along with additional LFUCG funding in support of the proposal, subject to the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

STATEMENT OF AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, and in consideration of the foregoing and the mutual covenants set forth herein and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged, the parties understand and agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall be in effect through June 30, 2025 (the "Term"), but Organization's obligations set forth in Sections 3, 4, 6, and 8 below shall continue for a period of three (3) years beyond the expiration or termination of this Agreement.
- 2. <u>Proposal</u>. Organization's request for Council Capital Project Expenditure Funds and additional LFUCG funds, as approved by LFUCG (the "Proposal"), is attached hereto as <u>Exhibit "A"</u> and incorporated by reference as if fully set forth herein. Organization agrees that it will use the Council Capital Project Expenditure Funds and additional LFUCG funding provided under this Agreement in a manner that is substantially consistent with the Proposal.
- 3. Council Capital Expenditure Project Funds and Additional LFUCG Funds. LFUCG hereby grants to Organization a total amount not to exceed Eighty-Three Thousand

Dollars and 00/100 Cents (\$83,000.00) (the "Funds"), by a combination of Council Capital Project Expenditure Funds in the amount of Twenty-Three Thousand Dollars and 00/100 Cents (\$23,000) and additional LFUCG funds in the amount of Sixty Thousand Dollars and 00/100 Cents (\$60,000) for the purchase of a Theatrical Lighting Package and to support the Proposal. Organization understands and agrees that pursuant to Council Capital Project Expenditure Policy Section C.201, Council Capital Expenditure Project Funds may only be used for costs in the Proposal that:

- a. are one-time expenditures (not recurring or ongoing expenses); and
- b. for improvements to property for a public purpose primarily benefiting the public at-large.

Organization further acknowledges that the Funds awarded under this Agreement are public funds subject to all applicable state and local laws and regulations pertaining to the use of public funds. Organization shall spend the Funds prior to the end of the Term. Within 30 days of making a payment with the Funds, Organization shall provide to LFUCG a copy of any invoice and receipt evidencing payment thereof. Funds for which no approved expenditure has been or is planned to be incurred by June 1, 2025, shall be returned to LFUCG on or before June 30, 2025. In any written or oral communications, Organization shall identify LFUCG as the source of the Funds; however, Organization shall not identify individual Urban County Councilmember(s) as being responsible for the Funds.

- 4. <u>Disposition and/or Change in Usage of Property Purchased with the Funds</u>. Organization agrees that it shall only use the Funds for the expenditures set forth in the Proposal. Organization shall not:
 - a. spend the Funds on any other expenses or costs without first obtaining the written consent of LFUCG;
 - transfer, sell, abandon, destroy, or otherwise dispose, or enter into any contract or agreement to see or otherwise transfer, any of the property or assets purchased with the Funds without first obtaining the written consent of LFUCG; and/or
 - c. use the property or assets purchased with the Funds to promote a private purpose.
- 5. Termination; Breach and Cure; Recovery of Funds. LFUCG shall have the right to terminate this Agreement in the event that Organization defaults or is in material breach of its obligations under this Agreement. In the event of termination based upon a material condition of non-performance or default by Organization, LFUCG shall provide Organization with advance written notice specifying the nature of such breach. Organization shall have ten (10) days from the receipt of such notice to cure such breach. If more time is reasonably required for Organization's performance or ability to cure such breach, then Organization shall notify LFUCG in writing of its proposed schedule for performance and commence performance within such ten (10) day period; thereafter, Organization shall diligently proceed to completion. If Organization fails to cure or to commence cure within such ten (10) day period, then LFUCG shall have the right to terminate this Agreement immediately by serving Organization with written notice of termination. In the event that this Agreement is terminated, LFUCG shall be entitled to recover all funds advanced to Organization for which it has not yet expended on the Proposal in accordance with this Agreement.

- 6. Record Retention; Reporting; Access. Organization shall create, maintain, and preserve sufficient records of its expenditures to demonstrate compliance with the requirements of this Agreement. Organization shall provide such records to LFUCG promptly upon written request. Such records shall be maintained not less than five (5) years after the expiration or termination of this Agreement. Organization shall provide LFUCG with timely updates related to the completion of the Proposal in the form and manner reasonably specified by LFUCG. On or before June 30 of each of the following years: 2024 and 2025, Organization shall provide LFUCG with an Affidavit of Compliance, which is attached hereto as Exhibit "B" and incorporated by reference as if fully stated herein, acknowledging its continued compliance with the applicable terms and conditions of this Agreement. Organization shall provide LFUCG with all necessary access and/or documentation to verify its compliance with any provision of this Agreement and the Exhibits attached hereto.
- 7. Registration; Compliance; Authority to Sign. Organization shall be lawfully registered or authorized to do business in the Commonwealth of Kentucky and Lexington-Fayette County and shall at all times comply with any and all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, and regulations. LFUCG may request proof that Organization has timely filed federal, state, or local tax forms which shall be provided by Organization on a timely basis. The person signing this Agreement on behalf of Organization is fully authorized to do so.
- 8. Indemnity. Organization shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless LFUCG and/or its officers, agents, employees, representatives, assignees, and/or designees from any and all liability, actions, claims, demands, or suits, and all related costs, attorney fees, and expenses arising out of or resulting from this Agreement. Organization understands that LFUCG is a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and acknowledges and agrees that LFUCG is unable to provide indemnity or otherwise save, hold harmless, or defend the Organization in any manner associated with the use of the Funds.
- Open Records. Organization understands and agrees that this Agreement and any related documents may be subject to disclosure under the Kentucky Open Records Act and will comply with any reasonable request by LFUCG to provide assistance with such a request.
- 10. <u>Independent Contractors</u>. In no event shall the parties be construed, held or become in any way for any purpose the employee of the other party, or partners, associates or joint ventures in the conduct of their respective endeavors or otherwise in the performance of this Agreement.
- 11. Equal Opportunity; Fairness Ordinance. Organization shall provide equal opportunity in employment for all qualified persons, and shall (a) prohibit discrimination in employment because of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, or handicap, (b) promote equal employment through a positive, continuing program of equal employment, and (c) cause any subcontractor or agency receiving funds provided pursuant to this Agreement to do so. This program of equal employment opportunity shall apply to every aspect of its employment policies and practices. Organization agrees to comply with LFUCG's Fairness Ordinance (Ordinance No. 201-99) and all sources of applicable law, including those specified in any Exhibit attached to this Agreement and incorporated herein by reference.

- 12. <u>Sexual Harassment</u>. Organization must adopt or have adopted a written sexual harassment policy, which shall, at a minimum, contain a statement of current law; a list of prohibited behaviors; a complaint process; and a procedure which provides for a confidential investigation of all complaints. The policy shall be given to all employees and clients and shall be posted at all locations where Organization conducts business. The policy shall be made available to LFUCG upon request.
- 13. No Assignment: No Third Party Rights. Organization may not assign any of its rights and duties under this Agreement without prior written consent of LFUCG. This Agreement does not create a contractual relationship with or right of action in favor of a third party against either Organization or LFUCG.
- 14. <u>Law and Venue</u>. This Agreement shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. Venue for all actions arising under this Agreement shall lie in the Circuit Court of Fayette County, Kentucky.
- 15. <u>Amendments</u>. This Agreement may be amended or modified from time to time only by the mutual written agreement of the parties hereto. Organization acknowledges that LFUCG may make such changes only upon approval of its legislative authority, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Council, and the signature of its Mayor.
- 16. <u>Waiver</u>. The waiver by either party of any breach of any provision of this Agreement shall not constitute a continuing waiver or waiver of any subsequent breach by either party of either the same or another provision.
- 17. Notice. Any notice required by this Agreement shall be delivered via hand delivery or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the following:

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants set forth herein, the receipt and sufficiency of which are acknowledged, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE; TERM.</u> This Agreement shall commence on ______, 202__ and shall last for a period of 1 year(s) unless terminated by LFUCG at an earlier time.

- b. Organization shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless LFUCG and its elected and appointed officials, employees, agents, volunteers, and successors in interest, from and against any

and all liability, damages, and losses, including but not limited to: demands, claims, liens, suits, notices of violation from governmental agencies, obligations, causes of action, judgments, penalties, fines, liens, costs, expenses, interest, defense costs and reasonable attorney's fees that are in any way incidental to or connected with, or that arise or are alleged to have arisen, directly or indirectly, from or by Organization's performance of, or breach of this Agreement and/or the provision of goods or services, provided that (a) it is attributable to personal injury, bodily injury, sickness, or death, or to injury to or destruction of property (including the loss of use resulting therefrom), or to or from the negligent acts, errors or omissions or willful misconduct of Organization or its officials, employees, or agents; and (b) not caused solely by willful misconduct of LFUCG.

- c. Organization understands and agrees that its obligation to defend LFUCG includes the obligation to investigate, handle, respond to, resist, provide a defense for, and defend claims, at Organization's expense, using attorneys approved in writing by the LFUCG, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- d. Organization further understands and agrees that its obligation to indemnify includes, but is not limited to: attorney fees and expenses, costs of litigation, court and administrative costs, expert witness fees and expenses, judgments, fines, penalties, interest, all environmental cleanups and remediation costs of whatever kind, and any liability arising from death, injury, or damage of any kind, to any person, including employees and agents of Organization and LFUCG, and damage to, or destruction of, any property, including the property of LFUCG.
- e. This provision shall in no way be limited by any financial responsibility or insurance requirements, and shall survive the termination of this Agreement.

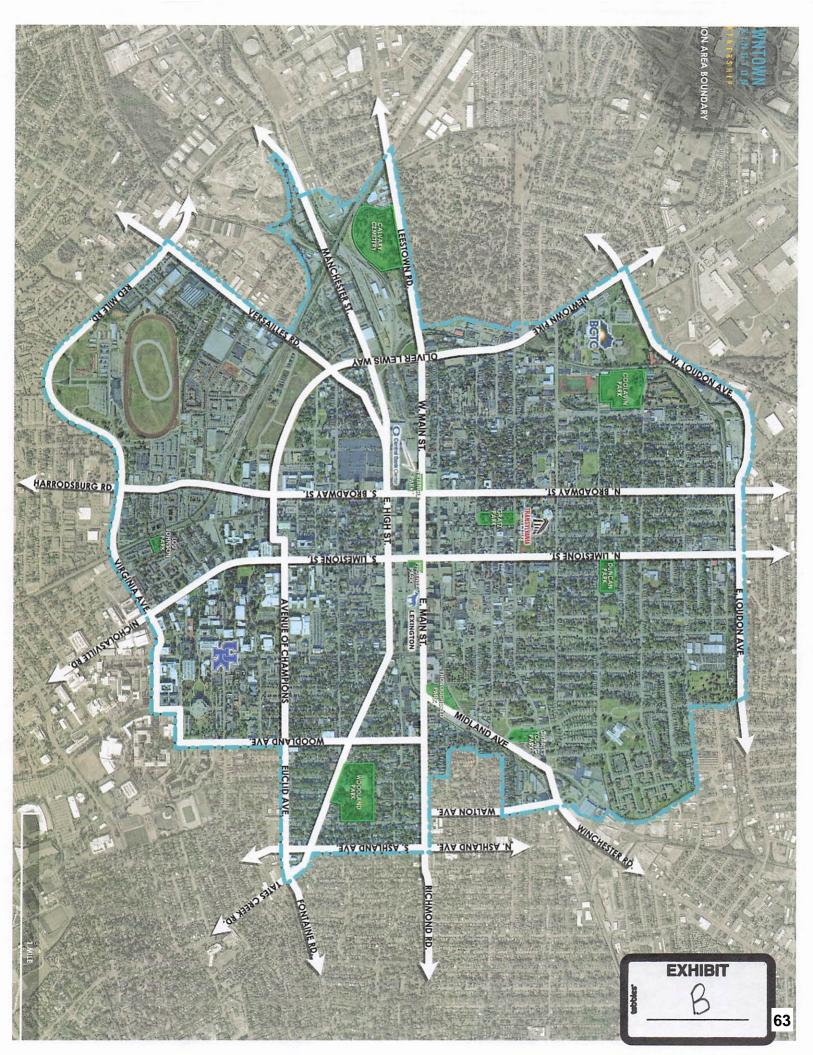

- 11. <u>CONTRACTUAL RELATIONSHIP ONLY.</u> In no event shall the parties be construed, held or become in any way for any purpose the employee of the other party, or partners, associates or joint ventures in the conduct of their respective endeavors or otherwise.
- 12. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY; FAIRNESS ORDINANCE. Organization shall provide equal opportunity in employment for all qualified persons, and shall (a) prohibit discrimination in employment because of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, age, sexual orientation, gender identity, or handicap, (b) promote equal employment through a positive, continuing program of equal employment, and (c) cause any subcontractor or agency receiving funds provided pursuant to this Agreement to do so. This program of equal employment opportunity shall apply to every aspect of its employment policies and practices. Organization agrees to comply with LFUCG's Fairness Ordinance (Ordinance No. 201-99) and all sources of applicable law, including those specified in any Exhibit attached to this Agreement and incorporated herein by reference.
- 13. <u>SEXUAL HARASSMENT.</u> Organization must adopt or have adopted a written sexual harassment policy, which shall, at a minimum, contain a statement of current law; a list of prohibited behaviors; a complaint process; and a procedure which provides for a confidential investigation of all complaints. The policy shall be given to all employees and clients and shall be posted at all locations where Organization conducts business. The policy shall be made available to LFUCG upon request.
- 14. ANNUAL AUDIT. Organization agrees that all revenue and expenditures related to this Agreement shall be audited at least annually by independent certified public accountants who shall express an opinion as to whether or not revenue and expenditures during the year audited have conformed to state and local law and regulation. A copy of this audit, or clean audit opinion letter from an independent certified public accountant, shall be submitted to LFUCG each year of the Agreement.
- 15. <u>INVESTMENT.</u> Any investment of the funds received pursuant to this Agreement must fully comply with any restrictions imposed by law.
- 16. NO ASSIGNMENT. Organization may not assign any of its rights and duties under this Agreement without the prior written consent of LFUCG.
- 17. NO THIRD PARTY RIGHTS. This Agreement does not create a contractual relationship with or right of action in favor of a third party against either Organization or LFUCG.
- 18. <u>KENTUCKY LAW AND VENUE</u>. This Agreement shall be governed in all respects by the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and venue for all actions shall lie in the Circuit Court of Fayette County, Kentucky.
- 19. <u>AMENDMENTS.</u> By mutual agreement, the parties to this Agreement may, from time to time, make written changes to any provision hereof. Organization acknowledges that LFUCG may make such changes only upon approval of its legislative authority, the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Council, and the signature of its Mayor.

20. <u>NOTICE</u>. Any written notice required by the Agreement shall be delivered by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the following:

- **ENTIRE AGREEMENT.** This Agreement shall constitute the entire agreement between the parties and no representations, inducements, promises or agreements, oral or otherwise, which are not embodied herein shall be effective for any purpose. This Agreement shall replace any previous agreement between the parties on the same subject matter.

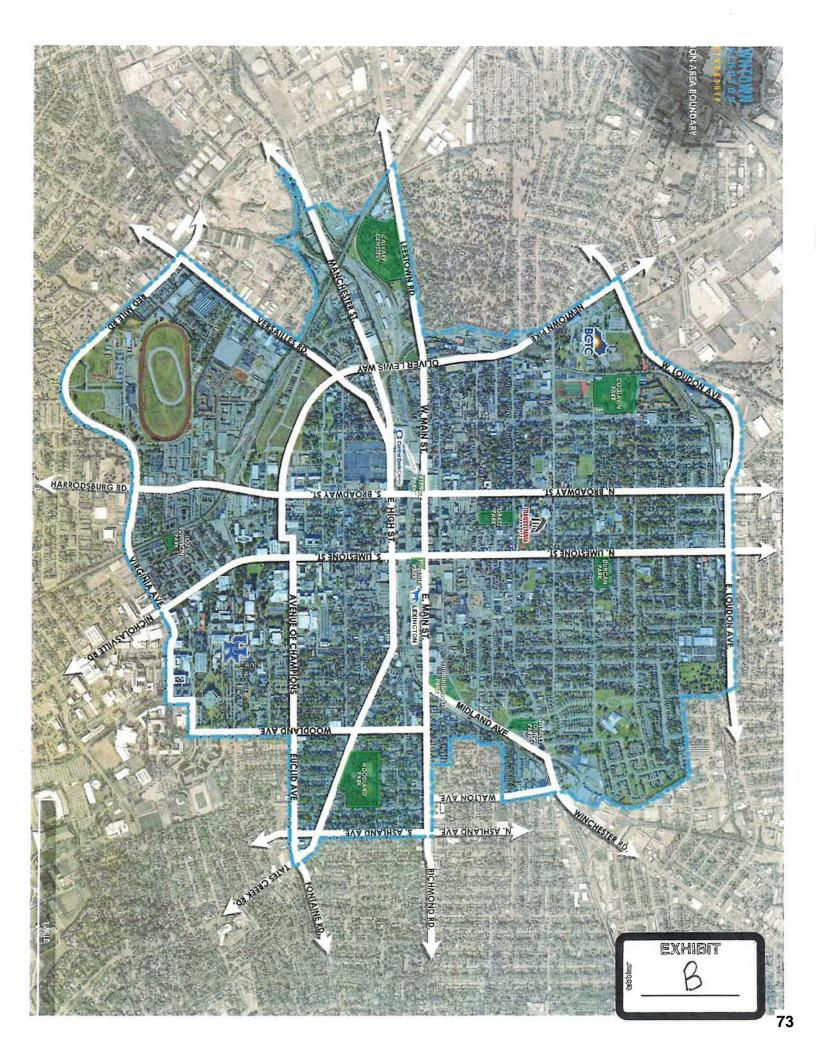

After extensive consultation with engineers and vendors of the pavilion pre-fabricated products, it has been determined the AVOL's property at Stonewall Terrace lacks the necessary soil quality and protection from wind that would allow the structure ongoing stability.

With that, we are proposing the following revision to our scope of work originally provided. We are also asking for an extension of time to complete the project through December 31, 2024.

\$1500 to install a **smart board** in AVOL's community room. A smart board will allow for improved technology in the delivery of educational programs and workshops.

Revision, we were gifted a large screen television and equipment that effectively
performs the same tasks as what he had hoped for the smart board. We would
like to re-program these funds to purchase a podium that will also hold the
computer equipment connected to the audio/visual, and other technology.

\$2500 to begin an **outdoor meditation garde**n space. A meditation space will provide a safe space for persons served by AVOL and Stonewall Terrace to enjoy the outdoors, view nature, and be revived and engaged.

• We would like to add an additional \$2,500 for plantings and other meditation garden elements for a total of \$5,000.

\$5000 to install an outdoor **picnic concrete pad.** A picnic area will allow our picnic tables to be installed on a solid surface out of the way of lawn mowers. A picnic area will allow for our clients, residents, and their families to further enjoy the beautiful outdoor space at Stonewall Terrace as well as for outdoor meetings and workshops.

• Revised, see gazebo revision; \$2,500 to meditation garden, and \$2,500 to replace gazebo plan with patio and picnic area plan.

\$15000 to install a **covered gazebo** to be installed on the above-mentioned concrete pad. A gazebo/pavilion will allow the picnic area and tables to be under cover out of the sun and weather.

We would like to reprogram the funds (\$15,000 for covered gazebo and \$2,500 from picnic concrete pad) to construct a sizeable patio area, adjacent to the medication garden, that includes patio block installed for picnic tables and outdoor gathering space for tenants and clients of AVOL Kentucky. At a later time we will explore adding shade sails and other embellishments.

We appreciate your consideration of any of these revisions for the \$24,700 in funding. All the above projects will enhance the Stonewall Terrace experience for those in our community seeking wellness. If AVOL Kentucky cannot expend all the funds pre-paid, the remaining funds will be returned to LFUCG.

PURCHASE OF SERVICE AGREEMENT

THIS PURCHASE OF SERVICE AGREEMENT ("Agreement") made and entered into on the first day of July, 2024, by and between the Lexington Fayette Urban County Government ("Urban Government") and the Hope Center, Inc. ("Hope Center") with offices located at 360 West Loudon Avenue, Lexington Kentucky 40588.

WITNESSETH

That for and in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein expressed, the Division and the Hope Center agree as follows:

- 1. The Urban Government hereby retains the Hope Center for the period beginning on July 1, 2024, and continuing for a period of twelve (12) months from that date unless within that period the Urban Government gives the Hope Center thirty (30) days written notice of termination of this Agreement in which case this Agreement shall terminate thirty (30) days from the date the notice is given.
- 2. The Urban Government shall pay the Hope Center the sum of Two Hundred Twenty-Eight Thousand Dollars (\$228,000) for the services required by this Agreement. Said service more particularly described in the Addendum attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Payment shall be made in 12 equal monthly installments of Nineteen Thousand Dollars (\$19,000) upon the submission of invoicing. A detailed quarterly program report shall be submitted to the Urban Government no later than October 15, 2024; January 15, 2025; April 15, 2025; and July 15 2025.
- 3. In the event of termination of this Agreement by the Urban Government as provided for in paragraph 1 above, the Hope Center shall be entitled to that portion of total compensation due under this Agreement as the service rendered bears to the service required herein.
- 4. The Hope Center shall perform all duties and services included in the Addendum attached hereto faithfully and satisfactorily at the time, place and for the duration prescribed herein. Compensation paid pursuant to this Agreement shall be used exclusively for the services set forth in the Addendum and for no other purpose. Any alteration in the nature of such services and duties constitutes an amendment to this Agreement and must be in writing signed by both parties. The Hope Center shall keep itself fully informed of all federal and state laws and all municipal ordinances and regulations, whether or not such laws, ordinances or regulations are mentioned herein, and shall indemnify the Urban Government, its officers, agents and employees against any claim or liability arising from and based on the Hope Center's violation of any such laws, ordinances or regulations.
- 5. All of the Hope Center employees, agents, and representatives, wishing to enter the Urban Government's detention facility must first receive a security clearance prior to entrance. Requests for security clearances will be done so by contacting the Division of Community Corrections at least three weeks prior to the intended entrance. The Urban Government

- reserves the right to refuse entrance to any person(s) not in possession of a security identification badge or to confiscate any security identification badge issued at its discretion.
- 6. The Urban Government may designate such persons as may be necessary to monitor and evaluate the services rendered by the Hope Center. The Urban Government, its agents and employees, shall, at all times, have unrestricted access to all places where or in which the services required hereunder are being carried on and conducted. Inspection and monitoring of the work by the Urban Government, or its designee, shall in no manner be presumed to relieve in any degree the responsibility or obligations of the Hope Center, nor to constitute the Hope Center as an agent of the Urban Government.
- 7. The Hope Center shall adopt a written sexual harassment policy, which shall, at a minimum, contain a statement of current law; a list of prohibited behaviors; a compliance process; and a procedure which provides for a confidential investigation of all complaints. The policy shall be given to all employees and clients and shall be posted at all locations where the Hope Center conducts business. The policy shall be submitted to the Urban Government for review within thirty (30) days of the execution of this Agreement.
- 8. This instrument, and the Addendum, incorporated herein, contains the entire agreement between the parties, and no statement, promises or inducements made by either party or agent of either party that is not contained in this written Agreement shall be valid and binding; and this Agreement may not be enlarged, modified or altered except in writing signed by the parties and endorsed hereon.

PROGRAM SUMMARY: Both innovative and creative, the Detention Recovery Programs provides daily, full-day recovery services Monday – Friday to inmates of the Fayette County Detention Center. To complete the program, participants take an average of 92 classes and attend 204 meetings. Program capacity is 15 women and 30 men, and the program serves about 106 participants annually. Program goals are success completion of all program components. All participants receive daily lessons in the 12-Steps and Recovery Dynamics, supplemented with additional classes. Community Meetings, held 2-3 times weekly, address issues that arise from day-to-day community living. Participants hold themselves and their peers accountable for conduct and a commitment to change. The community meetings help participants by identifying specific issues that may be impeding recovery, such as a loss of focus, reoccurring destructive behaviors or unacceptable program behavior. The community members make suggestion, and through a vote select a learning experience that will help the participant gain insight into the need for change. Cognitive Behavioral Intervention (CBI), is presented in two course, Thinking for a Change, and Problem Solving for Offenders. Both courses are endorsed by the National Institute of Corrections to promote effective changes in offender thinking patterns. The courses teach offenders to change and manage antisocial feelings and thinking; increase self-control, self-management and problem solving skills; and to recognize risky situations and develop plans to deal with them. Transition planning starts about halfway through the program.

The Detention Recovery Program addresses the bonus point-eligible need area of substance abuse; and we request these bonus points.

PURCHASE OF SERVICE AGREEMENT

THIS PURCHASE OF SERVICE AGREEMENT ("Agreement") made and entered into on the first day of July, 2024, by and between the Lexington Fayette Urban County Government ("Urban Government") and the Hope Center, Inc. ("Hope Center") with offices located at 360 West Loudon Avenue, Lexington Kentucky 40588.

WITNESSETH

That for and in consideration of the mutual promises and covenants herein expressed, the Division and the Hope Center agree as follows:

- 1. The Urban Government hereby retains the Hope Center for the period beginning on July 1, 2024, and continuing for a period of twelve (12) months from that date unless within that period the Urban Government gives the Hope Center thirty (30) days written notice of termination of this Agreement in which case this Agreement shall terminate thirty (30) days from the date the notice is given.
- 2. The Urban Government shall pay the Hope Center the sum of Two Hundred Twenty-Eight Thousand Dollars (\$228,000) for the services required by this Agreement. Said service more particularly described in the Addendum attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference. Payment shall be made in 12 equal monthly installments of Nineteen Thousand Dollars (\$19,000) upon the submission of invoicing. A detailed quarterly program report shall be submitted to the Urban Government no later than October 15, 2024; January 15, 2025; April 15, 2025; and July 15 2025.
- 3. In the event of termination of this Agreement by the Urban Government as provided for in paragraph 1 above, the Hope Center shall be entitled to that portion of total compensation due under this Agreement as the service rendered bears to the service required herein.
- 4. The Hope Center shall perform all duties and services included in the Addendum attached hereto faithfully and satisfactorily at the time, place and for the duration prescribed herein. Compensation paid pursuant to this Agreement shall be used exclusively for the services set forth in the Addendum and for no other purpose. Any alteration in the nature of such services and duties constitutes an amendment to this Agreement and must be in writing signed by both parties. The Hope Center shall keep itself fully informed of all federal and state laws and all municipal ordinances and regulations, whether or not such laws, ordinances or regulations are mentioned herein, and shall indemnify the Urban Government, its officers, agents and employees against any claim or liability arising from and based on the Hope Center's violation of any such laws, ordinances or regulations.
- 5. All of the Hope Center employees, agents, and representatives, wishing to enter the Urban Government's detention facility must first receive a security clearance prior to entrance. Requests for security clearances will be done so by contacting the Division of Community Corrections at least three weeks prior to the intended entrance. The Urban Government

- reserves the right to refuse entrance to any person(s) not in possession of a security identification badge or to confiscate any security identification badge issued at its discretion.
- 6. The Urban Government may designate such persons as may be necessary to monitor and evaluate the services rendered by the Hope Center. The Urban Government, its agents and employees, shall, at all times, have unrestricted access to all places where or in which the services required hereunder are being carried on and conducted. Inspection and monitoring of the work by the Urban Government, or its designee, shall in no manner be presumed to relieve in any degree the responsibility or obligations of the Hope Center, nor to constitute the Hope Center as an agent of the Urban Government.
- 7. The Hope Center shall adopt a written sexual harassment policy, which shall, at a minimum, contain a statement of current law; a list of prohibited behaviors; a compliance process; and a procedure which provides for a confidential investigation of all complaints. The policy shall be given to all employees and clients and shall be posted at all locations where the Hope Center conducts business. The policy shall be submitted to the Urban Government for review within thirty (30) days of the execution of this Agreement.
- 8. This instrument, and the Addendum, incorporated herein, contains the entire agreement between the parties, and no statement, promises or inducements made by either party or agent of either party that is not contained in this written Agreement shall be valid and binding; and this Agreement may not be enlarged, modified or altered except in writing signed by the parties and endorsed hereon.
- 9. Notice any written notice required by the Agreement shall be delivered by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the following:

DETENTION CENTER RECOVERY PROGRAM

PROGRAM SUMMARY: Both innovative and creative, the Detention Recovery Programs provides daily, full-day recovery services Monday – Friday to inmates of the Fayette County Detention Center. To complete the program, participants take an average of 92 classes and attend 204 meetings. Program capacity is 15 women and 30 men, and the program serves about 106 participants annually. Program goals are success completion of all program components. All participants receive daily lessons in the 12-Steps and Recovery Dynamics, supplemented with additional classes. Community Meetings, held 2-3 times weekly, address issues that arise from day-to-day community living. Participants hold themselves and their peers accountable for conduct and a commitment to change. The community meetings help participants by identifying specific issues that may be impeding recovery, such as a loss of focus, reoccurring destructive behaviors or unacceptable program behavior. The community members make suggestion, and through a vote select a learning experience that will help the participant gain insight into the need for change. Cognitive Behavioral Intervention (CBI), is presented in two course, Thinking for a Change, and Problem Solving for Offenders. Both courses are endorsed by the National Institute of Corrections to promote effective changes in offender thinking patterns. The courses teach offenders to change and manage antisocial feelings and thinking; increase self-control, self-management and problem solving skills; and to recognize risky situations and develop plans to deal with them. Transition planning starts about halfway through the program.

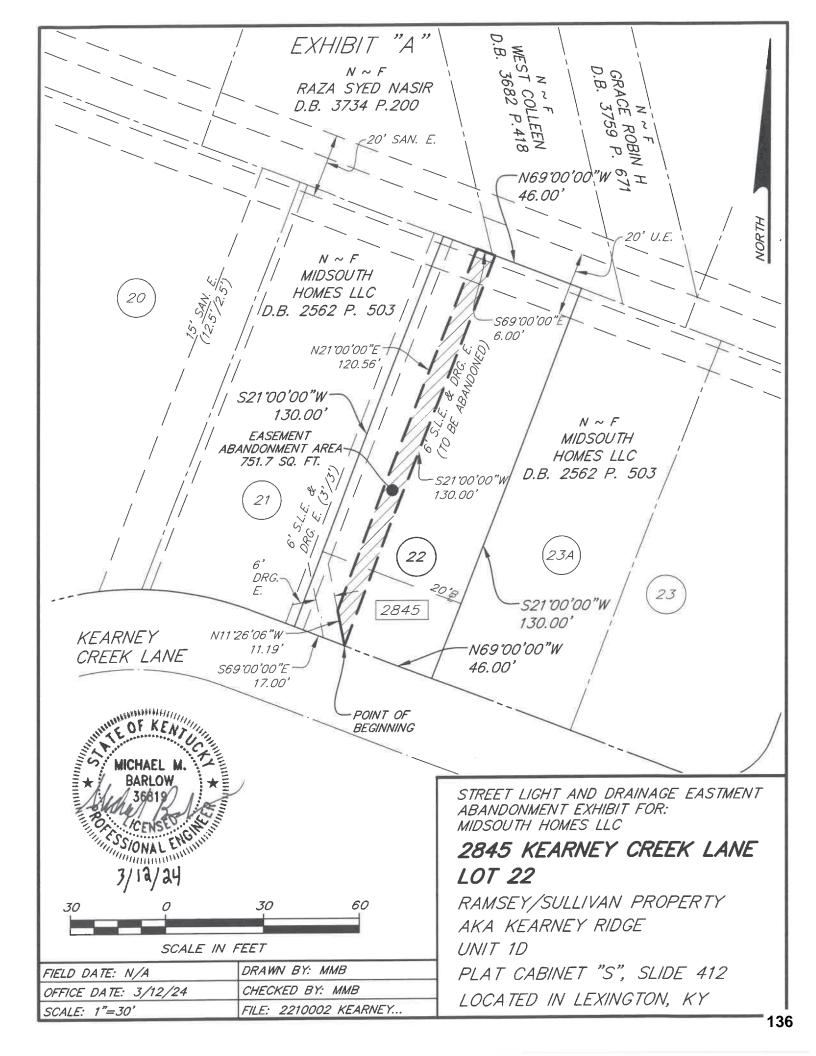


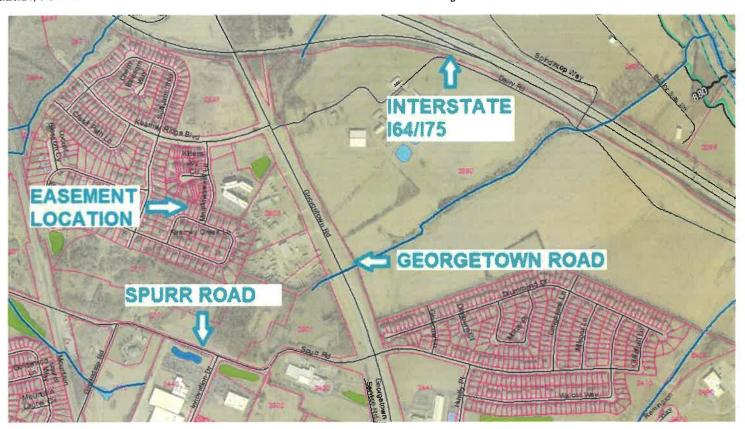

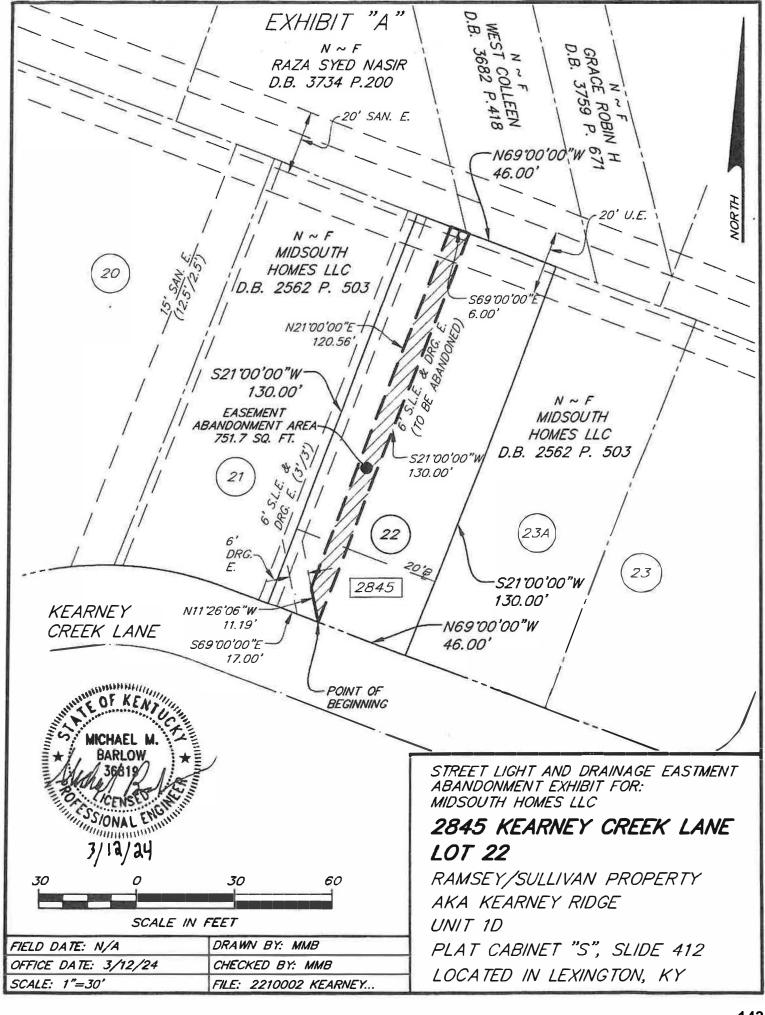

CITATION DATA TRANSFER

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into this 1st day of April, 2024, between the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC) and the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government (LFUCG). The purpose of this MOU is to establish a data set to be provided by the AOC to Recipient and to define Recipient's responsibilities with respect to the data provided by AOC.

WHEREAS, circuit court clerks are the official custodians of the records of Circuit and District Courts in each county;

WHEREAS, AOC is the administrative arm of the Kentucky Court of Justice (KCOJ);

WHEREAS, AOC maintains a database containing information about court records:

WHEREAS, AOC requires the data identified below for entry into its KYCourts 3 application so that it can be accessed by the Fayette Circuit Court Clerk;

WHEREAS, LPD has been identified as a source of these data elements;

NOW, THEREFORE, the following provisions are agreed to by the parties as witnessed by the signatures to this MOU. These provisions form the sole basis of the agreement, notwithstanding any other verbal or written assurance to the contrary:

I. Scope of Services

A. Data Structure

- Within 14 days of execution of this MOU, the AOC will provide LFUCG with access to a secure data transfer as set forth in the methodology document attached hereto and incorporated herein as Attachment 1.
- 2. AOC will import the data provided by LFUCG into KYCourts 3 daily.

- B. Assembly and transmittal of information:
- 1. All parties listed above will openly and expeditiously communicate any needs related to the compilation and acquisition of this data. Data sets will be distributed electronically as described in Attachment 1, according to the necessary standards, quidelines and methods provided by the AOC.
- 2. LFUCG shall use the data transfer protocol set forth in Attachment 1 only for purposes explicitly authorized by this Agreement.
 - C. All communications concerning this MOU shall be made to the AOC through: Daniel Sturtevant, Data Officer, AOC, Division of Research and Statistics at danielsturtevant@kycourts.net.

V. Handling of Open Records

In order for the AOC to maintain control and integrity of its records, Recipient agrees that any Open Records Request seeking access to data or documents provided by the AOC will be referred for response to the AOC.

VII. Term

This MOU shall commence April 1, 2024 and continue until canceled by either party.

VIII. Cancellation

Either party may cancel this MOU at any time for cause or may cancel without cause with thirty (30) days prior written notice.

VII. Standard Terms and Conditions

- A. No charge will be assessed by the either party.
- B. Both parties shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws.
- C. Neither party shall represent that a working copy, draft, or the finalized version of this MOU is identical to a previous iteration of this MOU if the party has made edits since the last iteration. Both parties shall clearly present all edits either through editing functions in word processing software or as a list provided contemporaneously with the most recently edited iteration.
- D. At no point shall any Recipient personnel be considered an employee of the AOC, for any purpose, including but not limited to unemployment, taxes, withholding,

health insurance, liability, retirement, workers' compensation, vacation, sick or other leave, the Family Medical Leave Act, accrued benefits, evaluations, or any other purpose. At all times, any such individual shall be considered and deemed to be an employee of Recipient.

- E. In no event shall any individual or entity be deemed to be a third-party beneficiary of this MOU.
- F. Each party shall provide a contact to resolve any and all issues related to this MOU and promptly update the contact information as necessary. AOC's point of contact is listed in Section I.C of this MOU.
- G. All notices under this MOU shall be given in writing. Electronic mail constitutes a writing.
- H. No change, waiver, or discharge of any liability or obligation under this MOU on any one or more occasions shall be deemed a waiver of performance of any continuing or other obligation, or shall prohibit enforcement of any obligation, on any other occasion.
- I. No party shall assign its respective rights or obligations under this MOU without prior written consent of the other party. Any purported assignment or delegation in violation of this MOU is void.
- J. This MOU shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
- K. The parties agree that any claim, action, or lawsuit arising under this MOU must be brought in Franklin Circuit Court in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
- L. If any term or provision or any part of this MOU is declared invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this MOU shall not be affected, and each term and provision of this MOU shall be valid and enforceable to the fullest extent permitted by the law.
- M. This MOU is the final and exclusive agreement between the parties. All prior negotiations and agreements are superseded by this MOU.

Data Exchange Description

An application programming interface (API) is established between Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government (LFUCG) and the Administrative Office of the Courts to allow data related to paper citations entered by the Lexington Police Department (LPD) to be received by the Fayette County Circuit Clerk's Office and incorporated into the KYCourts 3 application.

API Process

LPD enters data into the Tyler Technologies *Computer Aided Dispatch* record management system. Data with the structure described below is compiled into a comma-separated value (csv) file. This file is uploaded to AOC's secure File Transfer Protocol (FTP) site.

A daily job imports this data to KYCourts 3 each morning.

Staff in the Fayette County Circuit Clerks Office access this data in KYCourts 3 with the *Citation Add* function. Entering a citation number populates information from the imported data matching this citation number which may then be modified and saved to be part of the KYCourts 3 Charge data.

This Contract should be purchased on the Covered Equipment's original purchase date from an Authorized Dealer. Certain fees, penalties and coverage availability limits may apply for Contracts requested after the original purchase date.

For **New Extended Service Coverage (ESC)**, the Coverage Period under this Contract starts at the Delivery Date of the Covered Equipment. No claim will be paid until this Contract is registered. Pre-existing claims, claims originating prior to the registration of this ESC, will not be paid.

For **Advantage ESC**, the Coverage Period under this Contract starts:

- The date of successful completion of the Advantage Certification Inspection for Covered Equipment not awaiting resale; or
- Within twelve (12) months from the original date of the Advantage Certification Inspection for Covered Equipment in dealer inventory awaiting resale, or
- On the date of transfer of coverage from an Authorized Dealer to Customer.

Under this Contract, coverage Upgrade or Coverage Continuation for New or Advantage ESC starts at the date of registration of the changed coverage for claims reimbursement. Pre-existing claims, prior to the registration of the coverage Upgrade or Coverage Continuation, that would not have been paid under the original coverage, will not be paid.  "DPF" means diesel particulate filter, which is an Aftertreatment component included in the Technical Marketing Information (TMI) as-shipped consist or Order Invoice with Engineering Breakdown. The DPF and related systems are designed to reduce Particulate Matter (PM) emissions levels. DPF coverage must be ordered with engine coverage and can be ordered in

- combination with SCR coverage.
- "SCR" means selective catalytic reduction system, which is an Aftertreatment component included
 in the Technical Marketing Information (TMI) as-shipped consist or Order Invoice with Engineering
 Breakdown. The SCR and related urea-based diesel exhaust fluid systems are used to reduce
 Oxides of Nitrogen (NOx) emissions levels in engines. SCR coverage must be ordered with engine
 coverage and can be ordered in combination with DPF coverage.
- "DOC" means diesel oxidation catalysts, which is an Aftertreatment component designed to convert carbon monoxide (CO) and hydrocarbons into carbon dioxide (CO2) and water. The DOC can be used as a standalone component or in conjunction with a SCR and/or DPF.
- "Authorized Dealer" means a dealer authorized by the Manufacturer to sell, service and repair Covered Equipment.
- "Authorized Representative" means a representative authorized by Provider to act on Provider's behalf.
- "Caterpillar" means Caterpillar Inc. and any of its direct or indirect subsidiaries.
- "Cost" means the usual and customary charges as determined by the Manufacturer for parts, labor, and other allowances necessary to repair or replace the Covered Components. Replacement parts will be genuine Caterpillar manufactured parts, when performing repairs. Genuine Caterpillar parts include new, remanufactured or Caterpillar approved repaired components.
- "Coverage Fees" means the amount paid for the ESC.
- "Coverage Period" means the period that commences with the Coverage Start Date and expires when the duration or usage hours, as specified on the Registration Certificate, are reached, whichever occurs first.
- "Coverage Start Date" begins on the Delivery Date of the Covered Equipment for NEW ESC and on the date of the completed Advantage Inspection Certification of the Covered Equipment for Advantage ESC.
- "Covered Component" means the components listed and identified for the appropriate level of coverage in Section XV. COVERED COMPONENTS.
- "Covered Equipment" means the equipment identified by serial number for this Contract as recorded on the Registration Certificate and accepted by Provider.
- "Customer" means Customer name on this Contract.
- "Deductible" is the amount Customer agrees to pay per failure for a Mechanical Breakdown.
- "Delivery Date" is the beginning date of the Caterpillar standard factory warranty period to the initial user for new product.
- "Eligibility Start Date" means the date on which a Customer is eligible to sign up for ESC, which is the date of delivery of Covered Equipment for New ESC, or the date of inspection for Advantage ESC.
- **"ESC"** means extended service coverage, which provides protection for Customer against unexpected repair Costs for Covered Components, as further described in this Contract.
- "Manufacturer" means Caterpillar Inc. or any of its subsidiaries that manufacture Covered Equipment.

January 1, 2021

"Mechanical Breakdown" means the failure, due to a defect in material or workmanship, of any Covered Component to work as it was designed to work in normal service, provided it has received customary maintenance as recommended in the Manufacturer's Operation & Maintenance Manual (OMM).

"New ESC" means extended service coverage available for Covered Equipment within the standard factory warranty period.

"OEM" means original equipment manufacturer, which can include Manufacturer [or other manufacturers].

"Pre-Existing Claim" is a claim filed for a failure which occurred prior to the execution of this Contract and prior to registration of ESC for the Covered Equipment.

"Provider" means the entity issuing this Contract and further defined in Section XIII. PROVIDER.

"Repairer" means a business entity approved or authorized as a repair facility by Manufacturer or an Authorized Dealer.

"Registration Certificate" means page one (1) of this Contract, or as generated by the Contract administrator's quoting and registration platform.

"Sanctions" means economic or financial sanctions or trade embargoes imposed, administered or enforced from time to time by (a) the United States (U.S.) government, including those administered by the Office of Foreign Assets Control of the U.S. Department of Treasury or by the U.S. Department of State; or (b) the United Nations Security Council, the European Union, or Her Majesty's Treasury of the United Kingdom.

"Sanctioned Person" means, at any time, (I) a person listed in any sanctions-related list of designated persons maintained by the U.S. Department of the Treasury, the U.S. Department of Commerce, the U.S. Department of State, or by the United Nations Security Council, the European Union or any EU member state, or (II) any person owned or controlled by any such person.

"Upgrade" or "Coverage Continuation" is a change to one or more of the existing Contract terms that results in a higher price for the coverage.

"Warranty" or "Warranties" means the Manufacturer's standard factory warranty or a Repairer's guarantee or warranty.

III. PROVIDER RESPONSIBILITIES

- When a Mechanical Breakdown occurs, Provider will reimburse the Cost, less any applicable
 Deductible, to repair, replace or rebuild the Covered Component, and to the extent such Mechanical
 Breakdown causes damage to the Covered Equipment, Provider will reimburse the Cost, less the
 Deductible, to repair, replace or rebuild the Covered Equipment, this Cost not to exceed Caterpillar's
 list price for the equivalent Covered Equipment. This work will be reimbursed at normal working hour
 labor rates at a Repairer's place of business.
- Provider will provide, at Provider's choice, new, remanufactured or repaired components when
 replacing or repairing any Covered Components. Further, Provider will also reimburse for any
 component with a Caterpillar part number that is rendered unserviceable by a Covered Component
 and/or Mechanical Breakdown and reasonable labor to complete the repair.
- Provider will restore the Covered Equipment to its operating condition immediately prior to the Mechanical Breakdown by repairing and/or replacing only the required Covered Components and

- any component with a Caterpillar part number that was rendered unserviceable as a consequence of the Mechanical Breakdown, which would be necessary to correct the defect in the Covered Equipment.
- Provider will reimburse the reasonable labor to disconnect and reconnect the Covered Equipment to
 its attached equipment, mounting, and support systems, if required. Other parts or components
 removed in the process of the repair will be reinstalled as is, unless Customer authorizes and pays
 the additional expense to repair or replace the other parts.
- Provider will also pay the reasonable Costs of any consumables made unusable as a result of a Mechanical Breakdown.
- Provider will reimburse applicable transportation and importation Costs at standard factory warranty approved levels.

IV. CUSTOMER RESPONSIBILITIES

- Customer shall operate, repair, and perform all recommended maintenance for the Covered Equipment according to the guidelines and recommendations as specified in the Manufacturer's OMM.
- Customer shall utilize an Authorized Dealer for all scheduled oil sampling (S.O.S.) as specified in the Manufacturer's OMM, by submitting samples promptly with necessary sample information at the specified service intervals, and take the appropriate action as recommended by Authorized Dealer based on the S.O.S. results.
- Customer shall be responsible for labor and material Costs for the removal and reinstallation of Covered Equipment, except as stated in Section III. PROVIDER RESPONSIBILITIES, or in Section XVI. ADDITIONAL COVERAGE, if applicable.
- Customer shall be responsible for all Costs not covered by this Contract.
- Customer shall be responsible for maintaining reasonable documentation of all scheduled
 maintenance and repairs of the Covered Equipment, such as receipts or copies of work orders or
 invoices from Repairers or Authorized Dealers showing the maintenance and services performed
 pursuant to the Manufacturer's OMM recommendations. In the event of a Mechanical Breakdown,
 Customer may be required to present documentation of scheduled maintenance and repairs.
- Customer shall only use the Covered Equipment for its intended application and shall follow guidelines of the Manufacturer's OMM.
- Customer shall ensure operators have training on proper operation of the Covered Equipment and follow guidelines of the Manufacturer's OMM.
- Customer shall confirm that neither Customer, nor any of Customer's respective directors, officers
 or employees, or any guarantor of this Contract, or to Customer's knowledge, any agent or subsidiary
 of Customer's that will act in any capacity in connection with or benefit from this Contract and the
 services hereunder, is at any time identified as a Sanctioned Person.
- Customer shall assume full responsibility for any damages and associated repair Costs attributable
 to any failure associated with operating a generator set in Emergency Override System (EOS)
 mode. Further, Customer will defend, indemnify and hold harmless Caterpillar and the Dealer and
 their respective parents, affiliates, subsidiaries, successors, directors, officers, employees, and
 agents from and against all third-party claims, actions, demands, damages and liabilities of any kind
 arising out of or related to operation of the generator set in EOS mode.

In the event of a failure of the Covered Equipment, Customer shall:

- Take all reasonable steps to protect and safeguard the Covered Equipment.
- Report the failure promptly to Provider or a Repairer.
- Promptly make the Covered Equipment available to a Repairer for examination and repairs and provide proof of this Contract by presenting Customer's copy of the Registration Certificate.
- Furnish Provider or a Repairer with such information as may be reasonably required to assess the failure
- Provide needed documentation or information upon request.

V. COVERAGE TERRITORY

This Contract applies to Covered Equipment worldwide except when coverage provided by this Contract would be in violation of Sanctions. In such case, this Contract shall be null and void. Similarly, any coverage relating to or referred to in any certificates or other evidence of coverage or any claim that would be in violation of Sanctions shall be null and void.

VI. EXCLUSIONS AND LIMITATIONS

This Contract does not cover a failure caused by:

- Wear-out and normal deterioration in performance, including oil consumption and gasket or seal leaks:
- Wear-out or failure of components due to (i) operation beyond the design and/or capacity of the product, (ii) operator abuse, (iii) improper operation technique, or (iv) application not approved by Caterpillar;
- Corrosion and physical or mechanical erosion;
- Operating equipment with improper, contaminated, or improper levels of fuel, fluids, coolants, lubricants, or the use of improper filters;
- Repairer workmanship;
- Modifications, unless the modifications were authorized at the request of Manufacturer and performed at an approved repair facility;
- Abuse, neglect, or any failure to inspect, observe and comply with maintenance and servicing practices, specifications, intervals and requirements recommended or directed by the Manufacturer or Provider;
- Any failure to test oil samples according to an oil sampling program or analysis (including infrared analysis) as recommended or directed by the Manufacturer;
- Failure of a component which is not a Covered Component;
- Resultant damage caused by a component, which is not a Covered Component; including filter failures, clogging or blockage;
- Use or establishment of fuel settings for Covered Equipment which are inconsistent with settings recommended by Provider or the Manufacturer; or
- Operating the product at performance settings other than the standard Manufacturer specification.

This Contract also does not pay for the Costs arising from:

- Acts of God, acts of nature, acts of war, vermin, collision, fire, theft, vandalism, riot, or explosion;
- · Performance-related complaints, including, but not limited to, adjustments to fuel settings or fuel

- injectors/nozzles;
- The supply or consumption of lube oils, grease, coolant or air conditioner refrigerant, unless otherwise provided in this Contract or agreed by Provider;
- Any Costs incurred to improve operation performance;
- Any Costs for load or performance testing, even when Caterpillar guidelines call for such testing following a covered repair;
- Work associated with performing a Product Improvement Program (PIP) or Product Support Program (PSP);
- Any loss of or damage to a Covered Component occurring or arising outside the coverage territory, as stated in Section V. COVERAGE TERRITORY;
- Routine maintenance items, normally scheduled preventive maintenance, or maintenance services
 as explained in the Manufacturer's OMM, including but not limited to, valve lash adjustments or
 replacements of filters, fuel nozzles, fuel injectors, thermostats, seals, gaskets, hoses, vee-belts,
 batteries, and clutches;
- Storage of Covered Equipment;
- Miscellaneous shop supplies;
- · Steel shims and cast-iron block inserts;
- Clamps and other fasteners not specified in Section XV. COVERED COMPONENTS
- Any Costs associated with Mechanical Breakdowns covered under any Warranty whether enforceable or not; including Emissions Warranty or Repairer's guarantee regardless of whether the Warranty or Repairer's guarantee is honored;
- Parts shipping charges and service charges unless provided by coverage type as described in Section XVI. ADDITIONAL COVERAGE;
- Anv and all taxes:
- Any Costs associated with loss of time, inconvenience, downtime or downtime-related expenses or other incidental or consequential loss;
- Physical damage not related to Mechanical Failure;
- Any repairs if the service meter has been stopped or altered or misrepresents the Covered Equipment's actual usage;
- · Reimbursement for meals or overnight lodging;
- Failures associated with enclosures, containers, undercarriage, ladders, lights, wheels, axles, brakes, tires, sound attenuation, sound reduction, material, insulation, stabilizing jacks, fire suppression, and fire extinguishers;
- Contingent damage to component(s) which were not part of the original factory consist;
- Failure or damage to the generator set incurred as a result of operating the generator set in EOS mode;
- Additional Cat components installed by the Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEM), any Cat dealer, any authorized second level dealer or Customer after the in-service date of the engine, except where specified under Section XV. Covered components; or
- OEM components made a part of the Caterpillar factory as-shipped consist of the generator set through the Design to Order (DTO) process are not covered unless Caterpillar has given prior written approval to include the OEM components in the coverage.

Failure to provide reasonable documentation of required maintenance, as required in **Section IV. CUSTOMER RESPONSIBILITIES** may result in partial or non-payment of claim.

Coverage may be discontinued if an overhaul to the Covered Equipment becomes necessary as defined by key measures explained in the Manufacturer's OMM for the model and application, as indicated on the Registration Certificate. These key measures include, but are not limited to, valve recession, oil consumption, blow by, Scheduled Oil Sample (S.O.S) recommendations, total fuel consumed or service hours.

VII. UPGRADE OR COVERAGE CONTINUATION

Subject to the limitations outlined in this Section, Customer may Upgrade or extend the following terms of coverage indicated on Customer's Registration Certificate:

- Coverage level (Silver, Gold, Platinum, or Platinum Plus),
- Coverage months (Duration),
- · Coverage hours (Usage), or
- Deductible level.

Eligibility guidelines for a coverage upgrade are as follows:

A. For New ESC:

- 1. An Upgrade to the coverage level or Deductible level is eligible during the Covered Equipment's standard factory warranty period.
- 2. An increase to the coverage months or hours (Coverage Continuation) or a decrease in Deductible amount is eligible any time while under standard factory warranty or an active ESC.
- B. For Advantage ESC:
- 1. Upgrades in coverage level are not permitted.
- 2. An increase to the coverage months or hours Coverage Continuation or a decrease in Deductible amount is eligible any time during the active ESC up to specified limits. Restrictions apply.

Changes to the existing Contract terms may require Provider's approval, may result in additional testing requirements, and will result in an adjustment in price for the program coverage.

Provider reserves the right to deny an Upgrade request based on the claims' history of the Covered Equipment.

This Contract's terms cannot be reduced once enrolled.

VIII. TRANSFER OR ASSIGNMENT OF EXTENDED SERVICE COVERAGE

The remaining coverage of this Contract may be transferred or assigned to subsequent owners, at Provider's sole discretion and at no extra charge provided the usage application is not different and the transfer or assignment would not violate Sanctions. The new owner of the Covered Equipment must present a copy of the current Registration Certificate to Provider within thirty (30) days of the transfer of the Covered Equipment's title and Provider may approve the transfer or assignment of the coverage.

IX. TERMINATIONS AND REFUNDS

 Customer may cancel this Contract by providing written notice of intent to cancel and returning this Contract to the Contract administrator. Cancellation will be effective on the date the Contract

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- administrator receives the written cancellation notice.
- Refund and Administration Fee. If Provider receives Customer's written cancellation notice and returned this Contract within ten (10) days of the registration signature date as indicated on the bottom of the Registration Certificate, Provider will provide a refund in the amount of the Coverage Fees, less any claims paid and less a \$125.00 administration fee.
- If Provider receives Customer's written cancellation notice and returned this Contract more than ten (10) days after the registration signature date, as indicated on the bottom of the Registration Certificate, the pro-rated refund will be based on the lesser of months or hours of unused coverage less any claims paid and less a \$125.00 administration fee. If Provider receives Customer's written cancellation notice and returned this Contract more than thirty (30) days after the registration signature date, as indicated on the bottom of the Registration Certificate, Customer's refund will be reduced a further ten percent (10%).
- No refund is available if coverage is transferred or assigned to a subsequent owner.
- Provider may cancel this Contract without notice for the following reasons:
 - The Coverage Fee for this Contract has not been paid by Customer;
 - The standard factory warranty has been cancelled or voided;
 - Customer has substantially breached Customer's duties relating to the Covered Equipment or its use; or
 - Caterpillar or Provider determine that continuing this Contract would result in a violation of Sanctions.
- If there is a material misrepresentation in the Registration Certificate, Provider may void this Contract without written notice and Customer will not be charged the Coverage Fee.
- Provider may cancel this Contract without notice if the condition of an overhaul occurs. In the case of
 an overhaul occurring, Customer may receive residual Contract value as calculated above and
 applied to the continuation of coverage under the Overhaul (OVH) ESC Contract for Caterpillar
 Commercial Engines. The new term of coverage under the OVH ESC program may be selected per
 available terms if OVH ESC eligibility requirements have been met.

In the event Provider cancels this Contract, Provider will return any pro-rated refund, if applicable, based on the lesser of months or hours of unused coverage, less any claims paid, and less a \$125.00 administration fee.

X. DISCLAIMERS

- Provider responsibilities and Customer remedies under this Contract are limited to the provisions as specified herein.
- Provider disclaims any expressed or implied warranties in connection herewith including any warranty
 of merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose.
- Provider is not responsible for incidental or consequential damages, except as stated in Section III.
 PROVIDER RESPONSIBILITIES.
- Replacement parts furnished under the terms of this Contract are covered under the applicable replacement parts warranty.
- This Contract does not supersede the Emissions Warranty for emissions-related components.
- Misrepresentation of the Covered Equipment's eligibility for ESC, or the actual accumulated miles, kilometers, hours, fuel burn or age shall result in cancellation of this Contract by Provider or nonpayment of a claim, as determined by Provider.
- Provider shall be entitled to all other remedies.

XI. CUSTOMER ASSISTANCE

For the U.S. and Canada, when a problem arises concerning the operation of Customer's Covered Equipment or concerning the service of Customer's Covered Equipment, the problem will normally be managed by the Authorized Dealer in Customer's area.

Customer satisfaction is a primary concern of Caterpillar and Provider's Authorized Dealers. If a problem has not been handled to Customer's complete satisfaction, follow these steps:

- 1) Discuss the problem with a manager from Provider's Authorized Dealer.
- If the problem cannot be resolved at the Authorized Dealer level without additional assistance, contact a service representative with the Contract administrator (Service Representative) at 1-888-614-4328.

Outside the U.S. and Canada, if a problem arises concerning the operation of Customer's Covered Equipment or the service of Customer's Covered Equipment, Customer should contact the nearest Authorized Dealer or Service Representative.

XII. PRIVACY NOTICE

Provider or its Authorized Representative may collect Customer's name, address, phone number, payment information, product data (including geolocation and operational data) and email address ("Personal Data") from Customer to complete and process the Registration Certificate and to administer this Contract.

Provider may collect non-public Personal Data and other data necessary for Customer's Contract coverage from the following sources:

- 1) Information that Provider receives from Customer on registrations, applications or other forms, such as Customer's name, address, assets and income;
- 2) Information about Customer transactions with Provider, Provider's subsidiaries, Provider's affiliates (received only with Customer's express consent), Authorized Representative; and
- 3) Information from a Consumer reporting agency.

Provider processes Personal Data for the following purposes:

- 1) To execute and administer this Contract, including processing of claims;
- 2) To administer additional services requested in conjunction with this Contract;
- 3) To respond to Customer inquiries and provide customer support;
- 4) To enforce Provider's rights in the case of Customer default under this Contract or a breach by Customer of any of its responsibilities or obligations;
- 5) To comply with legal and regulatory obligations;
- 6) To conduct surveys, including through electronic means, to ascertain Customer satisfaction with Provider's coverage and services;
- 7) To contact Customer with details of Customer's existing or expiring coverage; and
- 8) To contact Customer with details of products and services offered by Provider and other parties.

In addition to the purposes outlined above, data may be de-identified, in which case it is no longer Personal Data, and may be processed for other purposes.

In order to process Personal Data, Provider may rely on different legal basis, including:

- 1) The necessity for completion of pre-contractual measures, executing and administering a contract, and exercising Provider's rights thereunder;
- 2) The necessity for Provider to comply with legal obligations;
- 3) The necessity to pursue legitimate interests, including to improve the products and services Provider offers to Customer and to provide Customer with information about the products and services that Provider offers; and
- 4) Customer consent. If Provider relies on Customer consent as a legal basis for processing Customer data, Customer may withdraw consent at any time.

Provider will share Personal Data with third parties, including the Contract administrator, located in the United States of America (U.S.A.) who acts as a data controller and may process Customer Personal Data for any of the above referenced purposes. Customer may obtain additional details on the specific measures the Contract administrator uses to ensure compliance with applicable data protection requirements, and to maintain the security and protection of Customer data, by accessing the Contract administrator's global privacy notice (https://www.caterpillar.com/dataprivacy).

The failure to provide Personal Data would in some cases have the consequence that this Contract is not concluded, including:

- Where processing is necessary to the administration of this Contract or the conducting of precontractual measures; and
- 2) Where processing is necessary to fulfil Provider's legal and regulatory obligations or to exercise Provider's legal rights.

XIII. PROVIDER

In the United States (U.S.) and its territories of Guam, America Samoa, the Northern Mariana Islands and U.S. Minor Outlying Islands: The Provider of this Contract is Caterpillar Inc.

In Canada excluding Alberta: The Provider of this Contract is the Cat Dealer.

In Alberta, Canada: The Provider of this Contract is Caterpillar of Canada.

In All Other Countries and the U.S. territories of Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands: The Provider of this Contract is the Cat Dealer.

XIIIA. NOTICE FOR U.S. CONTRACTS ONLY

Obligations of the Provider under this Contract are backed only by the full faith and credit of the Provider (issuer) and are not guaranteed under a Contract reimbursement insurance policy.

XIV. ENDORSEMENTS, APPLICABLE TO U.S.A. ISSUED SERVICE CONTRACTS ONLY

In Georgia: Paragraph **IX. TERMINATIONS AND REFUNDS** the subparagraphs Refund and Administration Fee and Cancellation by Provider are replaced by the following:

- **Refund and Administration Fee**. If Customer cancels this Contract, the pro-rated refund will be based upon the lesser of months, miles or hours of unused coverage provided.
- Cancellation by Provider. Provider may only cancel this Contract for fraud, material
 misrepresentation or non-payment. If Provider cancels this Contract, Provider will give written notice
 of cancellation at least:

- 1) Ten (10) days before the effective date of cancellation if Provider cancels for non-payment of Coverage Fees or,
- Thirty (30) days before the effective date of cancellation if Provider cancels for any other reason. The pro-rated refund will be based upon the lesser of months, miles or hours of unused coverage provided.

In Hawaii: Paragraph **IX. TERMINATIONS AND REFUNDS**, the subparagraph Cancellation by Provider is replaced by the following:

- Cancellation by Provider. Upon cancellation of a service contract by the Provider, the Provider, at least five days prior to cancellation, shall mail to the contract holder at the contract holder's last known address, a written prior notice of cancellation that states the effective date of the cancellation; provided that prior notice under this subsection shall not be required if cancellation is for:
 - Nonpayment of the Provider's fee for the service provided under the service contract;
 - A material misrepresentation by the contract holder to the Provider; or
 - A substantial breach of duties of the contract holder under the service contract, relating to a covered product or its use.

In Hawaii and Wyoming: Paragraph IX. TERMINATIONS AND REFUNDS, the subparagraph Refund and Administration Fee is replaced by the following:

• Refund and Administration Fee. If no claims have been made under this Contract delivered at the time of sale and Customer cancels this Contract by returning it to Provider within twenty (20) days of purchase, Customer's refund shall be the Coverage Fees, or between twenty (20) and thirty (30) days of purchase, Customer's refund shall be the Coverage Fees less a \$25.00 administration fee. If Customer cancels this Contract by returning it to Provider after thirty (30) days from purchase, the pro-rated refund will be based on the lesser of months, miles or hours of unused coverage provided less any claims paid and a \$25.00 administration fee. No refund is available if coverage is transferred or assigned to a subsequent owner. A ten percent (10%) penalty shall be added to the refund if not paid within thirty (30) days from the time this Contract was returned to Provider.

In Wisconsin: Paragraph **IX. TERMINATION AND REFUNDS** the subparagraphs Refund and Administration Fee and Cancellation by Provider are replaced by the following:

- Refund and Administration Fee. If Customer cancels this Contract by returning it to Provider within fifteen (15) days after Customer receives this Contract, Customer's refund shall be the Coverage Fees less a \$35.00 administration fee. If Customer cancels this Contract by returning it to Provider after fifteen (15) days from the date Customer receives this Contract, the pro-rated refund will be based on the lesser of months, miles or hours of unused coverage provided less a \$35.00 administration fee. If Provider cancels this Contract, Provider will provide Customer with written notice and Provider will not deduct any claims paid from Customer's refund. A ten percent (10%) penalty shall be added to the refund if not paid within thirty (30) days from the time this Contract was returned to Provider. All other terms and conditions apply.
- Cancellation by Provider. Provider may cancel this Contract with written notice to Customer and
 return to Customer the pro-rated refund based on the lesser of months, miles or hours of unused
 coverage provided and a \$25.00 administration fee for the following reasons: the Coverage Fee for
 this Contract has not been paid by Customer, the standard factory warranty has been canceled or
 voided, or a substantial breach of duties by Customer relating to the Covered Equipment or its use.

If there is a material misrepresentation with intent to deceive by Customer in the Registration Certificate, Provider may void this Contract with written notice and Customer will not be charged the Coverage Fee.

XV. COVERED COMPONENTS

<u>Silver and Gold Covered Components</u>: Covered Components under Silver and Gold levels of ESC are listed in the table attached as **Exhibit A**. If a component is not specifically listed in **Exhibit A**, it is not covered under Silver or Gold levels of ESC.

<u>Platinum Level Covered Components</u>: All as-shipped consist from the factory with Caterpillar part numbers, including DOC (when DOC is not part of a DPF) are Covered Components with the exception of the following: DPF and SCR, filters, fluids, vee-belts, hoses, power take-offs, paint, batteries, and clutches. New replacement EMCP control panels with Cat part numbers installed on electric power generator sets by an authorized dealer are covered components.

Platinum Plus Level Coverage Components: All as-shipped consist from the factory with Caterpillar part numbers including DOC (when DOC is not part of a DPF) are Covered Components with the exception of the following: filters, fluids, vee-belts, hoses, power take-offs, paint, batteries and clutches. Platinum Plus also covers additional components with Caterpillar part numbers that are installed by an Authorized Dealer and accepted by the Contract administrator through the Platinum Plus Additional Coverage Component List and Approval Verification form, LEYH0001. New replacement EMCP control panels with Cat part numbers installed on electric power generator sets by an authorized dealer are covered components.

ESC Aftertreatment DPF and/or ESC Aftertreatment SCR component coverage is optional and additional to the base engine coverage and is for the specified system. ESC Aftertreatment DPF and/or ESC Aftertreatment SCR is the same for Silver, Gold, Platinum, and Platinum Plus. If purchased with engine coverage, travel time and mileage extend to these optional Aftertreatment coverages.

Aftertreatment DPF and/or ESC Aftertreatment SCR must be ordered with the engine coverage and will have the same start and end date as the engine coverage.

ESC Aftertreatment DPF Component Coverage is for the original as-shipped consist, which includes the DPF / DOC and housing, radio frequency antennas, back pressure sensors, regeneration system and DPF-related electronic components, but excludes consumable and normal wear items (e.g., clamps, catalyst and filter substrate), and filter cleaning.

ESC Aftertreatment SCR Component Coverage is for the original as-shipped consist, which includes the SCR catalyst, AMOX catalysts, reactor housing, mixing pipe, Urea-based diesel emission fluid injection system hoses, nozzle or injector, pump, tank, NOx sensor, sensors and SCR-related electronic components, but excludes consumable and normal wear items (e.g., fluids, clamps, catalyst substrate).

It is the responsibility of the Authorized Dealer to provide the following documents to Caterpillar:

- 1) A copy of the ESC Registration Certificate and
- 2) The approval list of Caterpillar components, complete with the Caterpillar part numbers.

These documents will become part of the permanent history of the Covered Equipment.

Rental Allowance for Standby Applications: Standby Platinum Level Coverage: Additional allowance is granted if repairs cannot be completed within 96 hours of the Authorized Dealer technician's initial visit for the covered Mechanical Breakdown due solely to the nature of the Mechanical Breakdown or Cat's inability to supply the required repair components. The dollar allowance for Rental Generator set expenses, from an Authorized Dealer is defined as the reasonable and customary rental charge, mileage and the necessary labor for connection and disconnection to Customer facility of the Rental Generator set from the closest Authorized Dealer.

- For Cat generator sets up to 4 liters, the maximum dollar allowance is \$2,500 (USD).
- For Cat generator sets greater than 4liters and up to 7.5 liters displacement the maximum dollar allowance is \$5,000 (USD).
- For Cat generator sets greater than 7.5 liters and up to 34 liters displacement, the maximum dollar allowance is \$10,000 (USD).
- For Cat generator sets greater than 34 liters displacement, the maximum dollar allowance is \$15,000 (USD).

The following items are included as additional coverage under Platinum Plus level ESC only, subject to the limitations outlined herein.

Remote Troubleshooting:

Remote Troubleshooting Fees, up to a maximum of \$50.00 per claim, will be covered under Platinum Plus coverage only when a failed component is identified and repaired as part of the report.

Additional Disconnect and Connect Allowance:

Electric Power engines registered in Platinum Plus level ESC, will receive up to a maximum of \$1,500.00 additional allowance for labor to remove and reinstall Covered Components from the Covered Equipment, mounting and support systems, subject to the review and agreement by the Contract administrator, in its sole discretion, of the reasonableness of the additional labor Costs. This additional labor allowance may be applied to OEM components, which are required to be removed and reinstalled to complete the covered repair. This allowance supersedes **Section IV. CUSTOMER RESPONSIBILITIES** regarding

removal and reinstallation.

Overtime Allowance:

For Covered Equipment registered in Platinum Plus level coverage up to \$3,000.00 in overtime labor may be claimed for the incremental Cost of performing the repair outside of normal business hours, subject to the review and agreement by the Contract administrator, in its sole discretion, of the plausibility that the work could not be done within normal business hours. Incremental labor Cost hours must be in consecutive shifts to standard labor hours. This allowance modifies **Section III. PROVIDER RESPONSIBILITIES**, regarding repairs being done during normal business hours. This allowance is payable when it is not reasonably practical for the covered repair to be completed during normal business hours. Refer to industry addendum for incremental Costs reimbursement allowed.

Crane and Rigging Allowance for Standby Applications:

Standby Platinum Plus Level Coverage: Additional allowance for crane and rigging expense is granted if repairs cannot be completed within 48 hours of the Authorized Dealer technician's initial visit for the covered Mechanical Breakdown due solely to the nature of the Mechanical Breakdown or Cat's inability to supply the required repair components. The allowance for crane and rigging expenses is covered only if the crane and rigging is required to more cost effectively access the failed unit to perform covered repairs.

The dollar allowance for Rental Generator set expenses from and Authorized Dealer is defined as the reasonable and customary rental charge, mileage, and the necessary labor for connection and disconnection to Customer facility of the Rental Generator set from the closest Authorized Dealer.

- For Cat generator sets up to 4 liters, the maximum allowance is \$5,000 (USD).
- For Cat generator sets greater than 4 liters and up to 7.5 liters displacement the maximum dollar allowance is \$10,000 (USD).
- For Cat generator sets greater than 7.5 liters and up to 34 liters displacement, the maximum dollar allowance is \$20,000 (USD).
- For Cat generator sets greater than 34 liters displacement, the maximum dollar allowance is \$40,000 (USD).

XVII. EXTENDED SERVICE COVERAGE CONDITIONS

New ESC Eligibility Requirements:

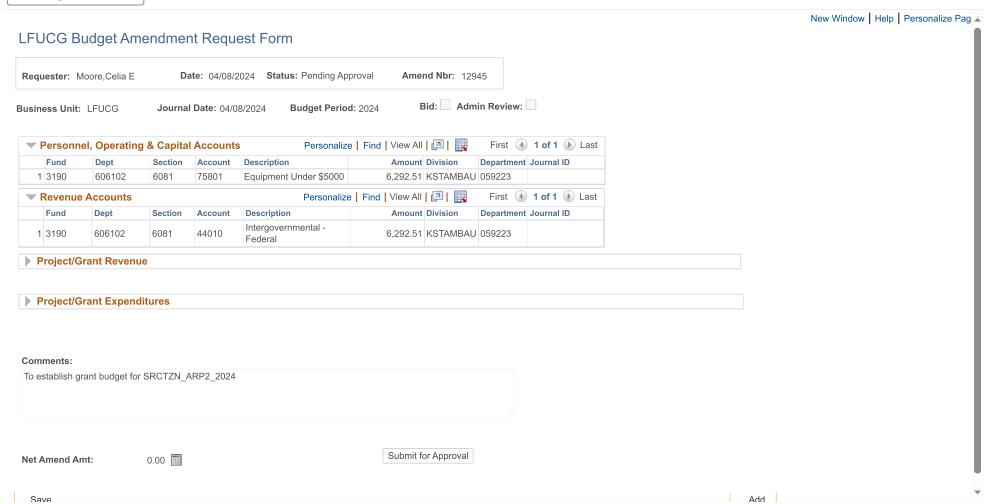

Please find attached a price proposal for Contract Modification No. 3 for Town Branch Trail Phase 4 & 5 design services.

To insure the post-construction integrity of the closed Old Frankfort Pike landfill, we will subcontract Kenvirons to evaluate the project's short and long-term impact on the landfill, and provide a report of their findings. Kenvirons' price proposal is attached to this letter.

Due to the potential for multiple utility relocations within the project corridor and outside public right-of-way, we are proposing to perform physical utility locations at this stage to more accurately assess the potential for utility conflicts. Utilities within the areas identified in the attached scope will be clearly marked, then a subcontractor will hydro-excavate the identified utilities within each area. Surveyors will then collect horizontal and vertical data for each excavated utility, and the data will added to the design drawings to further assess potential conflicts at each location. The utility location work is being proposed as an allowance and will be billed at a daily rate. The unit prices shown in the attached scope may vary from the actual work performed, e.g. Maintenance of Traffic may not be required on some work days. Unit pricing includes site restoration for excavation activities. Invoices for this contract modification will be based on actual amount billed by the subcontractor, but total cost of the utility location work for this contract modification is not to exceed \$36,000.

Please find attached a price proposal for Contract Modification No. 3 for Town Branch Trail Phase 4 & 5 design services.

To insure the post-construction integrity of the closed Old Frankfort Pike landfill, we will subcontract Kenvirons to evaluate the project's short and long-term impact on the landfill, and provide a report of their findings. Kenvirons' price proposal is attached to this letter.

Due to the potential for multiple utility relocations within the project corridor and outside public right-of-way, we are proposing to perform physical utility locations at this stage to more accurately assess the potential for utility conflicts. Utilities within the areas identified in the attached scope will be clearly marked, then a subcontractor will hydro-excavate the identified utilities within each area. Surveyors will then collect horizontal and vertical data for each excavated utility, and the data will added to the design drawings to further assess potential conflicts at each location. The utility location work is being proposed as an allowance and will be billed at a daily rate. The unit prices shown in the attached scope may vary from the actual work performed, e.g. Maintenance of Traffic may not be required on some work days. Unit pricing includes site restoration for excavation activities. Invoices for this contract modification will be based on actual amount billed by the subcontractor, but total cost of the utility location work for this contract modification is not to exceed \$36,000.

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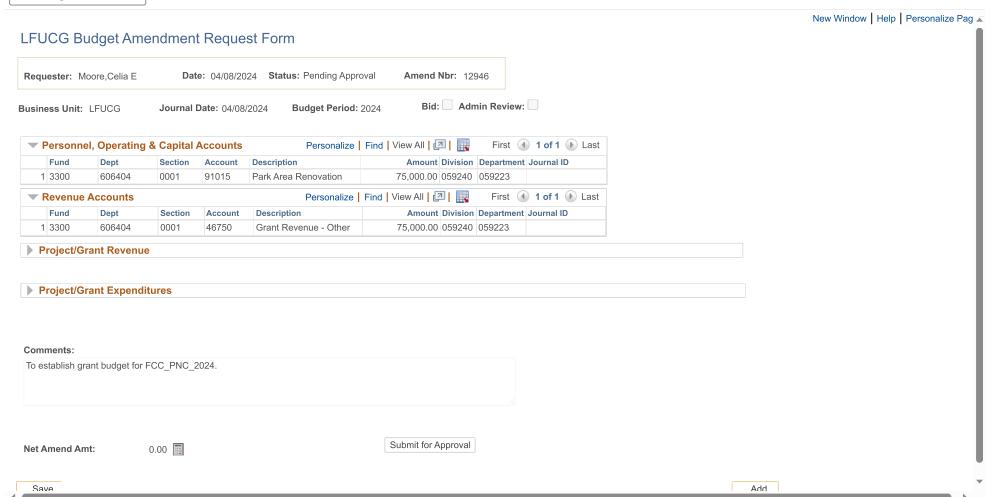

Purpose of Request: Kentucky Cleaner Water Grant 21CWS027 awarded \$11,868,095 for the design and construction of ultraviolet disinfection systems at each wastewater treatment plant. Construction cost estimates developed during the design phase determined that the original grant award was less than the estimated total project cost. Water Quality proposed that grant funding for a different, less critical treatment plant project (Grant 22CWS006) be reallocated to cover the estimated shortfall. The Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) approved this reallocation in the form of grant 22CWS171.

This project is part of the Consent Decree Remedial Measures Plan (RMP) project schedule approved by the Commonwealth and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA). The project is scheduled for completion by December 31, 2026.

What is the cost in this budget year and future budget years? \$1,165,178 has been awarded for FY2024. No match is required. Future budget year's funds are dependent upon availability of grant funds.

GRANT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government

The Conditional Commitment Letter and a subsequent Assistance Agreement between the Grantee and the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority shall be subject, but not limited, to the timely compliance with the following terms and conditions.

Terms

- 1. The grant award shall not exceed \$1,165,178 and shall be used solely for the designated project, unless otherwise permitted in writing by the Authority. Any reallocation requests should request signature approval by the original consensus approval group.
- 2. The grant funds shall be obligated by December 31, 2024. Any grant funds not obligated by December 31, 2024 will not be available for use by the Grantee and will not be available for the project.
- 3. Grant funds obligated by December 31, 2024 must be expended by the Grantee by December 31, 2026. Any obligated funds not fully expended by December 31, 2026 will not be available for use by the Grantee and will not be available for the project.
- 4. The grant must be reviewed and approved by the Capital Projects and Bond Oversight Committee of the Kentucky Legislature prior to the Authority's execution of the Assistance Agreement.
- 5. The Assistance Agreement must be executed within six (6) months from project bid opening.
- 6. Grant funds will only be disbursed after execution of the Assistance Agreement as project costs are incurred.
- 7. All approvals required by the Kentucky Division of Water (DOW), if any, shall be obtained by the Grantee prior to project bid. All approvals required by the Kentucky Public Service Commission, if any, shall be obtained prior to commencement of project construction.
- 8. All acquisitions of easements or purchases of land shall be completed prior to commencement of construction.
- 9. Cleaner Water Program grant funds are federal funds. If more than \$750,000 of federal funds including all sources are disbursed to the Grantee in any one fiscal year, the Grantee is required to have a single or program-specific audit conducted

for that year in accordance with 2 CFR 200 Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards.

- 10. If the grant funds are used in conjunction with any other federal funds including but not limited to programs of the EPA, USDA, HUD, CDBG, ARC or other federal agencies, the Cleaner Water Program funds shall comply with these agencies' program requirements, regulations, and laws such as compliance with the Davis-Bacon Act, the Federal Environmental Protection Act and others.
- 11. <u>SAM.gov Requirements</u>. Grantees are required to have an active registration with the System for Award Management (SAM) (https://www.sam.gov).
- 12. All correspondence and document sharing between the Authority and the Grantee shall be by email and portable document format (.pdf) attached to email.

Conditions

The following is a list of the standard conditions to be satisfied either prior to execution of the Assistance Agreement or incorporated in the Assistance Agreement. The Grantee shall provide completed documentation marked with the corresponding Exhibit Number related to each condition. Forms and document templates for each condition are provided in Attachment C. All required documentation must be submitted to the staff member of the Authority assigned to the Grantee.

- 1. The Project Profile (SX21067064) shall be updated to accurately reflect project data, including the budget and mapping information, effective as of the date certified in **Exhibit 1**.
 - Documentation of final funding commitments from all parties other than the Authority as identified on the Project Budget (Attachment B) and in the Budget Tab of the updated Project Profile shall be provided prior to execution of the Assistance Agreement and disbursement of grant funds. Any subsequent changes in the anticipated project funding shall be immediately reported to the Authority and may cause this grant to be subject to further consideration.
- 2. The Grantee shall obtain a Vendor Number from the Finance and Administration Cabinet of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and provide that Vendor Number to the Authority as **Exhibit 2**.
- 3. The project shall comply with the reporting requirements of the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act (FFATA). The Grantee shall complete the Transparency Act Reporting Information Form and return it to the Authority as **Exhibit 3**.

Exhibits 1 – 3 must be completed and returned to the Authority with this signed Conditional Commitment Letter.

After providing the Authority with the signed Conditional Commitment Letter and Exhibits 1 through 3, the Authority will forward to the Grantee the Grant Assistance Agreement. Upon completion by the Grantee of Exhibits 4, 5, and 7, the Authorized Official shall sign the Assistance Agreement and forward the Exhibits, with supporting documentation, and the signed Assistance Agreement to the Authority for execution. The Grantee shall continue to complete the remaining Exhibits (6 and 8 through 10).

- 4. After receiving the Grant Assistance Agreement: At an official meeting of its governing body, the Grantee shall approve acceptance of the Grant and the Assistance Agreement, amend its annual budget accordingly, and designate an Authorized Official to sign all appropriate documents. The resolution and the certificate of Recording Officer are submitted as **Exhibit 4**.
- 5. After receiving the Grant Assistance Agreement: Legal Counsel for the Grantee must provide an opinion to the Authority as to the legality of Grantee accepting the grant and approving the Assistance Agreement as **Exhibit 5**.
- 6. The Grantee shall contract with an Engineer licensed in Kentucky **Exhibit 6A** and agree to the fee amount limitation as determined by the most recent USDA Rural Development Utility Program Fee Guide by jointly signing **Exhibit 6B**.
 - The Grantee may request 50% of the engineering design fee as budgeted in the Project Profile when the Project plans and specifications are submitted to the Kentucky Division of Water (DOW). The balance of that fee may be requested once the Grantee provides a copy of the plans approval letter from DOW to the Authority.
- 7. The Grantee shall provide documentation of Kentucky eClearinghouse Endorsement and eClearinghouse Comments as **Exhibit 7**.
 - Any significant changes or additions to the Project, deviating from the original scope of work described in the Project Profile, may require a new or amended eClearinghouse Endorsement, as determined by the eClearinghouse or the Authority.
- 8. The Grantee shall submit the DOW Plans approval letter to the Authority as **Exhibit 8**.
- 9. The Grantee shall complete and submit the bid package **(Exhibit 9)** to the Authority within 14 days of bid opening, which bid package shall include:
 - a. Engineer's Approval of "as-bid" project budget, with Engineer's signature;
 - b. Affidavit of Publication with Tear Sheet of Advertisement;
 - c. Certified Bid Tabs with Engineer's seal, number and signature;
 - d. Clear Site Certificates for each parcel of real property and easements, with date and signatures of the Grantee (Exhibit 9A) and Title Counsel (Exhibit 9B).

- 10. The Grantee shall certify that its accounting system for water treatment and distribution and sewer service is maintained separately from its accounting for all other operations, and that its service rates are based on the cost of providing the service and, that its utility operations are audited at least every two years as **Exhibit 10**.
- 11. Upon project completion, the Grantee shall submit, to the Authority, the Certificate of Project Completion, signed by the project Engineer, the Authorized Official and the Project Administrator as **Exhibit 11**.

- 5) To the best of my knowledge after due inquiry there is no action, suit, proceedings or investigation at law or in equity before any court, public board or body pending or threatened against, affecting or questioning (i) the valid existence of the Grantee, (ii) the right or title of the members and officers of Grantee to their respective positions, (iii) the authorization, execution, delivery or enforceability of the Agreement or the application of any monies or security therefore, (iv) the construction of the Project, or (v) that would have a material adverse impact on the ability of the Grantee to perform its obligations under the Agreement.
- 6) None of the proceedings or authority heretofore had or taken by the Grantee for the authorization, execution or delivery of the Agreement has or have been repealed, rescinded, or revoked.
- 7) All proceedings and actions of the Grantee with respect to which the Agreement is to be delivered were in place or taken at meetings properly convened and held in substantial compliance with the applicable provisions of Sections 61.805 to 61.850 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes.

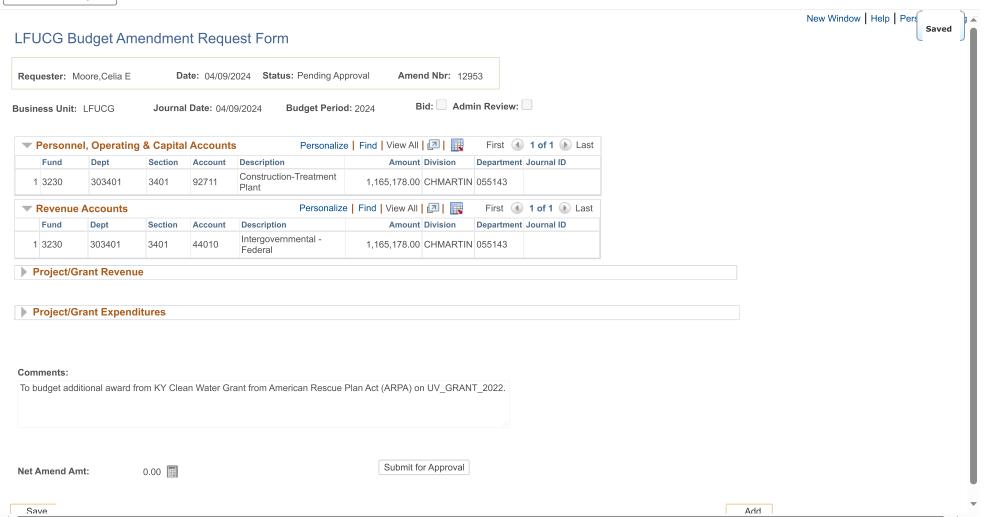

ATTACHMENT A

GRANT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government

The Conditional Commitment Letter and a subsequent Assistance Agreement between the Grantee and the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority shall be subject, but not limited, to the timely compliance with the following terms and conditions.

Terms

- 1. The grant award shall not exceed \$1,165,178 and shall be used solely for the designated project, unless otherwise permitted in writing by the Authority. Any reallocation requests should request signature approval by the original consensus approval group.
- 2. The grant funds shall be obligated by December 31, 2024. Any grant funds not obligated by December 31, 2024 will not be available for use by the Grantee and will not be available for the project.
- 3. Grant funds obligated by December 31, 2024 must be expended by the Grantee by December 31, 2026. Any obligated funds not fully expended by December 31, 2026 will not be available for use by the Grantee and will not be available for the project.
- The grant must be reviewed and approved by the Capital Projects and Bond Oversight Committee of the Kentucky Legislature prior to the Authority's execution of the Assistance Agreement.
- 5. The Assistance Agreement must be executed within six (6) months from project bid opening.
- 6. Grant funds will only be disbursed after execution of the Assistance Agreement as project costs are incurred.
- 7. All approvals required by the Kentucky Division of Water (DOW), if any, shall be obtained by the Grantee prior to project bid. All approvals required by the Kentucky Public Service Commission, if any, shall be obtained prior to commencement of project construction.
- 8. All acquisitions of easements or purchases of land shall be completed prior to commencement of construction.
- 9. Cleaner Water Program grant funds are federal funds. If more than \$750,000 of federal funds including all sources are disbursed to the Grantee in any one fiscal year, the Grantee is required to have a single or program-specific audit conducted

- for that year in accordance with 2 CFR 200 Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards.
- 10. If the grant funds are used in conjunction with any other federal funds including but not limited to programs of the EPA, USDA, HUD, CDBG, ARC or other federal agencies, the Cleaner Water Program funds shall comply with these agencies' program requirements, regulations, and laws such as compliance with the Davis-Bacon Act, the Federal Environmental Protection Act and others.
- 11. <u>SAM.gov Requirements</u>. Grantees are required to have an active registration with the System for Award Management (SAM) (https://www.sam.gov).
- 12. All correspondence and document sharing between the Authority and the Grantee shall be by email and portable document format (.pdf) attached to email.

Conditions

The following is a list of the standard conditions to be satisfied either prior to execution of the Assistance Agreement or incorporated in the Assistance Agreement. The Grantee shall provide completed documentation marked with the corresponding Exhibit Number related to each condition. Forms and document templates for each condition are provided in Attachment C. All required documentation must be submitted to the staff member of the Authority assigned to the Grantee.

- 1. The Project Profile (SX21067064) shall be updated to accurately reflect project data, including the budget and mapping information, effective as of the date certified in **Exhibit 1**.
 - Documentation of final funding commitments from all parties other than the Authority as identified on the Project Budget (Attachment B) and in the Budget Tab of the updated Project Profile shall be provided prior to execution of the Assistance Agreement and disbursement of grant funds. Any subsequent changes in the anticipated project funding shall be immediately reported to the Authority and may cause this grant to be subject to further consideration.
- 2. The Grantee shall obtain a Vendor Number from the Finance and Administration Cabinet of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and provide that Vendor Number to the Authority as **Exhibit 2**.
- The project shall comply with the reporting requirements of the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act (FFATA). The Grantee shall complete the Transparency Act Reporting Information Form and return it to the Authority as **Exhibit 3**.

Exhibits 1 – 3 must be completed and returned to the Authority with this signed Conditional Commitment Letter.

After providing the Authority with the signed Conditional Commitment Letter and Exhibits 1 through 3, the Authority will forward to the Grantee the Grant Assistance Agreement. Upon completion by the Grantee of Exhibits 4, 5, and 7, the Authorized Official shall sign the Assistance Agreement and forward the Exhibits, with supporting documentation, and the signed Assistance Agreement to the Authority for execution. The Grantee shall continue to complete the remaining Exhibits (6 and 8 through 10).

- 4. After receiving the Grant Assistance Agreement: At an official meeting of its governing body, the Grantee shall approve acceptance of the Grant and the Assistance Agreement, amend its annual budget accordingly, and designate an Authorized Official to sign all appropriate documents. The resolution and the certificate of Recording Officer are submitted as **Exhibit 4**.
- 5. After receiving the Grant Assistance Agreement: Legal Counsel for the Grantee must provide an opinion to the Authority as to the legality of Grantee accepting the grant and approving the Assistance Agreement as **Exhibit 5**.
- 6. The Grantee shall contract with an Engineer licensed in Kentucky **Exhibit 6A** and agree to the fee amount limitation as determined by the most recent USDA Rural Development Utility Program Fee Guide by jointly signing **Exhibit 6B**.
 - The Grantee may request 50% of the engineering design fee as budgeted in the Project Profile when the Project plans and specifications are submitted to the Kentucky Division of Water (DOW). The balance of that fee may be requested once the Grantee provides a copy of the plans approval letter from DOW to the Authority.
- 7. The Grantee shall provide documentation of Kentucky eClearinghouse Endorsement and eClearinghouse Comments as **Exhibit 7**.
 - Any significant changes or additions to the Project, deviating from the original scope of work described in the Project Profile, may require a new or amended eClearinghouse Endorsement, as determined by the eClearinghouse or the Authority.
- 8. The Grantee shall submit the DOW Plans approval letter to the Authority as **Exhibit 8**.
- 9. The Grantee shall complete and submit the bid package (Exhibit 9) to the Authority within 14 days of bid opening, which bid package shall include:
 - a. Engineer's Approval of "as-bid" project budget, with Engineer's signature;
 - b. Affidavit of Publication with Tear Sheet of Advertisement;
 - c. Certified Bid Tabs with Engineer's seal, number and signature;
 - d. Clear Site Certificates for each parcel of real property and easements, with date and signatures of the Grantee (Exhibit 9A) and Title Counsel (Exhibit 9B).

- 10. The Grantee shall certify that its accounting system for water treatment and distribution and sewer service is maintained separately from its accounting for all other operations, and that its service rates are based on the cost of providing the service and, that its utility operations are audited at least every two years as **Exhibit 10**.
- 11. Upon project completion, the Grantee shall submit, to the Authority, the Certificate of Project Completion, signed by the project Engineer, the Authorized Official and the Project Administrator as **Exhibit 11**.

Laws and Regulations

All applicable state laws, municipal ordinances and regulations of all authorities having jurisdiction over the project shall apply to the contract, and shall be deemed to be incorporated herein by reference.

Equal Employment Opportunity

The Entity (regardless of whether construction contractor, non-construction contractor or supplier) agrees to provide equal opportunity in employment for all qualified persons, to prohibit discrimination in employment because of race, color, religion, sex (including pregnancy, sexual orientation or gender identity), national origin, disability, age, genetic information, political affiliation, or veteran status, and to promote equal employment through a positive, continuing program from itself and each of its sub-contracting agents. This program of equal employment opportunity shall apply to every aspect of its employment policies and practices.

Kentucky Equal Employment Opportunity Act

The Kentucky Equal Employment Opportunity Act of 1978 (KRS 45.560-45.640) requires that any "county, city, town, school district, water district, hospital district, or other political subdivision of the state shall include in directly or indirectly publicly funded contracts for supplies, materials, services, or equipment hereinafter entered into the following provisions:

"During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:

- (1) The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, age, or national origin;
- (2) The contractor will state in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractors that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, age, or national origin;
- (3) The contractor will post notices in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, setting forth the provision of the nondiscrimination clauses required by this section; and
- (4) The contractor will send a notice to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under the nondiscrimination clauses."

The Act further provides:

"KRS 45.610. Hiring minorities -- Information required

- (1) For the length of the contract, each contractor shall hire minorities from other sources within the drawing area, should the union with which he has collective bargaining agreements be unwilling to supply sufficient minorities to satisfy the agreed upon goals and timetables.
- (2) Each contractor shall, for the length of the contract, furnish such information as required by KRS 45.560 to KRS 45.640 and by such rules, regulations and orders issued pursuant thereto and will permit access to all books and records pertaining to

his employment practices and work sites by the contracting agency and the department for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with KRS 45.560 to 45.640 and such rules, regulations and orders issued pursuant thereto.

KRS 45.620. Action against contractor -- Hiring of minority contractor or subcontractor

- (1) If any contractor is found by the department to have engaged in an unlawful practice under this chapter during the course of performing under a contract or subcontract covered under KRS 45.560 to 45.640, the department shall so certify to the contracting agency and such certification shall be binding upon the contracting agency unless it is reversed in the course of judicial review.
- (2) If the contractor is found to have committed an unlawful practice under KRS 45.560 to 45.640, the contracting agency may cancel or terminate the contract, conditioned upon a program for future compliance approved by the contracting agency and the department. The contracting agency may declare such a contractor ineligible to bid on further contracts with that agency until such time as the contractor complies in full with the requirements of KRS 45.560 to 45.640.
- (3) The equal employment provisions of KRS 45.560 to 45.640 may be met in part by a contractor by subcontracting to a minority contractor or subcontractor. For the provisions of KRS 45.560 to 45.640, a minority contractor or subcontractor shall mean a business that is owned and controlled by one or more persons disadvantaged by racial or ethnic circumstances.

KRS 45.630 Termination of existing employee not required, when

Any provision of KRS 45.560 to 45.640 notwithstanding, no contractor shall be required to terminate an existing employee upon proof that employee was employed prior to the date of the contract.

KRS 45.640 Minimum skills

Nothing in KRS 45.560 to 45.640 shall require a contractor to hire anyone who fails to demonstrate the minimum skills required to perform a particular job."

It is recommended that all of the provisions above quoted be included as <u>special conditions</u> in each contract. In the case of a contract exceeding \$250,000, the contractor is required to furnish evidence that his workforce in Kentucky is representative of the available work-force in the area from which he draws employees, or to supply an Affirmative Action plan which will achieve such representation during the life of the contract.

LFUCG Non-Appropriation Clause

Contractor acknowledges that the LFUCG is a governmental entity, and the contract validity is based upon the availability of public funding under the authority of its statutory mandate.

In the event that public funds are unavailable and not appropriated for the performance of the LFUCG's obligations under this contract, then this contract shall automatically expire without penalty to the LFUCG thirty (30) days after written notice to Contractor of the unavailability and non-appropriation of public funds. It is expressly agreed that the LFUCG shall not activate this non-appropriation provision for its convenience or to circumvent the requirements of this contract, but only as an emergency fiscal measure during a substantial fiscal crisis, which affects generally its governmental operations.

In the event of a change in the LFUCG's statutory authority, mandate and mandated functions, by state and federal legislative or regulatory action, which adversely affects the LFUCG's authority to continue its obligations under this contract, then this contract shall automatically terminate without penalty to the LFUCG upon written notice to Contractor of such limitation or change in the LFUCG's legal authority.

Contention Process

Vendors who respond to this invitation have the right to file a notice of contention associated with the RFP process or to file a notice of appeal of the recommendation made by the Director of Procurement resulting from this invitation.

Notice of contention with the RFP process must be filed within 3 business days of the bid/proposal opening by (1) sending a written notice, including sufficient documentation to support contention, to the Director of the Division of Procurement or (2) submitting a written request for a meeting with the Director of Procurement to explain his/her contention with the RFP process. After consulting with the Commissioner of Finance the Chief Administrative Officer and reviewing the documentation and/or hearing the vendor, the Director of Procurement shall promptly respond in writing findings as to the compliance with RFP processes. If, based on this review, a RFP process irregularity is deemed to have occurred the Director of Procurement will consult with the Commissioner of Finance, the Chief Administrative Officer and the Department of Law as to the appropriate remedy.

Notice of appeal of a RFP recommendation must be filed within 3 business days of the RFP recommendation by (1) sending a written notice, including sufficient documentation to support appeal, to the Director, Division of Procurement or (2) submitting a written request for a meeting with the Director of Procurement to explain his appeal. After reviewing the documentation and/or hearing the vendor and consulting with the Commissioner of Finance and the Chief Administrative Officer, the Director of Procurement shall in writing, affirm or withdraw the recommendation.

AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT

That Federal funding may include funds received by LFUCG under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. Expenditures using Federal funds require evidence of the contractor's compliance with Federal law. Therefore, by the signature below of an authorized company representative, you certify that the information below is understood, agreed, and correct. Any misrepresentations may result in the termination of the contract and/or prosecution under applicable Federal and State laws concerning false statements and false claims.

The bidder (hereafter "bidder," or "contractor") agrees and understands that in addition to all conditions stated within the attached bid documents, the following conditions will also apply to any Agreement entered between bidder and LFUCG, if LFUCG uses Federal funds, including but not limited to funding received by LFUCG under the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA"), toward payment of goods and/or services referenced in this bid. The bidder also agrees and understands that if there is a conflict between the terms included elsewhere in this Request for Proposal and the terms of this Amendment 1, then the terms of Amendment 1 shall control. The bidder further certifies that it can and will comply with these conditions, if this bid is accepted and an Agreement is executed:

- 1. Any Agreement executed as a result of acceptance of this bid may be governed in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200 and all other applicable Federal law and regulations and guidance issued by the U.S. Department of the Treasury.
- 2. Pursuant to 24 CFR § 85.43, any Agreement executed as a result of acceptance of this bid can be terminated if the contractor fails to comply with any term of the award. This Agreement may be terminated for convenience in accordance with 24 CFR § 85.44 upon written notice by LFUCG. Either party may terminate this Agreement with thirty (30) days written notice to the other party, in which case the Agreement shall terminate on the thirtieth day. In the event of termination, the contractor shall be entitled to that portion of total compensation due under this Agreement as the services rendered bears to the services required. However, if LFUCG suspects a breach of the terms of the Agreement and/or that the contractor is violating the terms of any applicable law governing the use of Federal funds, LFUCG may suspend the contractor's ability to receive payment by giving thirty (30) days' advance written notice. Further, either party may terminate this Agreement for cause shown with thirty (30) days written notice, which shall explain the party's cause for the termination. If the parties do not reach a settlement before the end of the 30 days, then the Agreement shall terminate on the thirtieth day. In the event of a breach, LFUCG reserves the right to pursue any and all applicable legal, equitable, and/or administrative remedies against the contractor.
- 3. The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. The contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following:
 - (1) Employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and

- applicants for employment, notices to be provided setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
- (2) The contractor will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin.
- (3) The contractor will not discharge or in any other manner discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because such employee or applicant has inquired about, discussed, or disclosed the compensation of the employee or applicant or another employee or applicant. This provision shall not apply to instances in which an employee who has access to the compensation information of other employees or applicants as a part of such employee's essential job functions discloses the compensation of such other employees or applicants to individuals who do not otherwise have access to such information, unless such disclosure is in response to a formal complaint or charge, in furtherance of an investigation, proceeding, hearing, or action, including an investigation conducted by the employer, or is consistent with the contractor's legal duty to furnish information.
- (4) The contractor will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided advising the said labor union or workers' representatives of the contractor's commitments under this section and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- (5) The contractor will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and of the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- (6) The contractor will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and by rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.
- (7) In the event of the contractor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination clauses of this contract or with any of the said rules, regulations, or orders, this contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part, and the contractor may be declared ineligible for further government contracts or federally assisted construction contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and such other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.
- (8) The contractor will include the portion of the sentence immediately preceding paragraph (1) and the provisions of paragraphs (1) through (8) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to section 204 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The contractor will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the administering agency may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance.

Provided, however, that in the event a contractor becomes involved in or is threatened with litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction by the administering agency, the contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

- 4. If fulfillment of the contract requires the contractor to employ mechanic's or laborers, the contractor further agrees that it can and will comply with the following:
 - (1) Overtime requirements: No contractor or subcontractor contracting for any part of the contract work which may require or involve the employment of laborers or mechanics shall require or permit any such laborer or mechanic in any workweek in which he or she is employed on such work to work in excess of forty hours in such a workweek unless such laborer or mechanic receives compensation at a rate not less than one and one-half times the basic rate of pay for all hours worked in excess of forty hours in such a workweek.

- (2) Violation: liability for unpaid wages; liquidated damages. In the event of any violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (1) of this section, the contractor and any subcontractor responsible therefor shall be liable for the unpaid wages. In addition, such contractor and subcontractor shall be liable to the United States (in the case of work done under contract for the District of Columbia or a territory, to such District or to such territory) for liquidated damages. Such liquidated damages shall be computed with respect to each individual laborer or mechanic, including watchmen and guards, employed in violation of the clause set forth in paragraph (1) of this section, in the sum of \$10 for each calendar day on which such individual was required or permitted to work in excess of the standard workweek of forty hours without payment of the overtime wages required by the clause set forth in paragraph (1) of this section.
- (3) Withholding for unpaid wages and liquidated damages. LFUCG shall upon its own action or upon written request of an authorized representative of the Department of Labor withhold or cause to be withheld, from any moneys payable on account of work performed by the contractor or subcontractor under any such contract or any other federal contract with the same prime contractor, or any other federally-assisted contract subject to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, which is held by the same prime contractor, such sums as may be determined to be necessary to satisfy any liabilities of such contractor or subcontractor for unpaid wages and liquidated damages as provided in the clause set forth in paragraph (2) of this section.
- (4) Subcontracts. The contractor or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clauses set forth in paragraph (1) through (4) of this section and also a clause requiring the subcontractors to include these clauses in any lower-tier subcontracts. The prime contractor shall be responsible for compliance by any subcontractor or lower-tier subcontractor with the clauses set forth in paragraphs (1) through (4) of this section.
- 5. The contractor shall comply with all applicable standards, orders, or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 7401 et seq.
- 6. The contractor shall report each violation to LFUCG and understands and agrees that LFUCG will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to the Treasury Department and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency Regional Office.
- 7. The contractor shall include these requirements in numerical paragraphs 5 and 6 in each subcontract exceeding \$100,000 financed in whole or in part with Federal funding.
- 8. The contractor shall comply with all applicable standards, orders, or regulations issued pursuant to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. § 1251 et seq.
- 9. The contractor shall report each violation to LFUCG and understands and agrees that LFUCG will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to the Treasury Department and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency Regional Office.
- 10. The contractor shall include these requirements in numerical paragraphs 8 and 9 in each subcontract exceeding \$100,000 financed in whole or in part with Federal funds.

1.2. AFFIRMATIVE ACTION PROGRAM

2. EEO Officer Responsibilities

- 2.1. Company's president is fully supportive of Company's EEO Policy and Affirmative Action Program and will ensure its implementation and compliance at all levels within the Company. Company's president will appoint an Equal Employment Opportunity Officer ("EEO Officer") who will have full authority to carry out this EEO Policy and Affirmative Action Program and who will have the following responsibilities:
 - a. Develop policy statements, personnel policies and procedures, internal and external communication procedures, necessary updates as to any changes in the law and shall monitor the effectiveness of these actions in fulfilling Company's EEO and affirmative action obligations.
 - **b.** Design, implement and monitor the collection of employment data and internal audit and reporting systems to measure program effectiveness and to determine where progress has been made and where further action may be needed.
 - c. Advise Company's President quarterly on the progress or problems the Company is experiencing in relation to its implementation of its EEO Policy and Affirmative Action Program.

- d. Serve as liaison between the Company and government regulatory agencies, and private organizations that promote equal employment opportunity and training for qualified individuals within the Protected Classes.

3. DISSEMINATION OF THE EEO POLICY

- 3.1. Company employees who are authorized to hire, supervise, promote or discharge employees or who recommend such action will be made fully cognizant of and will implement the Company's EEO Policy and Affirmative Action Program. To ensure compliance, the following actions will be taken as a minimum:
 - a. 4. RECRUITMENT

- **4.2.** The Company will conduct recruitment through public and private employee referral sources likely to yield qualified minority, female, disabled and certain covered veteran applicants including, but not limited to: local veterans' employment representative, Department of Veterans Affairs, Regional Office, veterans' counselors and coordinators on college campuses, service officers of national veterans' groups and local veterans' groups and veterans' service centers, state employment agencies, schools, colleges and public and private organizations that train and facilitate employment of these

individuals. To meet these requirements, the Company will, through the EEO Officer, identify sources of potential, qualified minority, female, disabled or certain covered veteran applicants and establish with such identified sources procedures whereby applicants may be referred to the Company for employment consideration.

4.3. 6. TRAINING AND PROMOTION

- **6.1.** The Company will assist in locating, qualifying and increasing the skills of Protected Class employees and applicants for employment.
- **6.2.** Consistent with Company's manpower requirements, and as permitted by federal and state regulations, the Company will make full use of training programs for the geographical area of contract performance.
- **6.3.** The Company will advise employees and applicants for employment of available training programs and entrance requirements for each to the extent that Company is aware of such training programs and entrance requirements.
- **6.4.** The Company will periodically review the training and promotion potential of Protected Class employees and will encourage eligible employees to apply for such training and promotion.

7. SUBCONTRACTING

7.1. With respect to direct federal construction contracts and federally assisted construction contracts, Company will incorporate into its subcontracts provisions requiring the subcontractor's compliance with the requirements of OFCCP's regulations, 41 CFR Part 60, which relate to equal employment opportunity and affirmative action. Further, Company will incorporate into its' subcontracts any other federal, state or local requirements related to equal employment opportunity and affirmative action.

8. RECORDS AND REPORTS

- **8.1.** The Company will keep such records as are necessary to determine compliance with its equal employment opportunity and affirmative action obligations. The records kept by the Company will be designed to indicate the following:
 - a. The number of Protected Class member employees in each work classification.

- **b.** The progress and efforts being made in cooperation with unions to increase Protected Class employment opportunities.

9. NON-SEGREGATED FACILITIES

9.1. All employee facilities provided by the Company shall be non-segregated. Toilets and necessary changing facilities will be such that privacy is offered to both males and females.

10. POST-AWARD COMPLIANCE

Retaliation for use of the complaint procedure will not be tolerated and any retaliation should be reported.
- **12.2.** This complaint process does not preclude the employee from contacting any local, state or federal civil rights agencies. The Company will not retaliate against an employee or applicant for filing a complaint with the appropriate governmental office.

By acceptance of a Contract under this RFP, proposer states that it understands the meaning, intent and requirements of the RFP and agrees to the same. The successful Respondent shall warrant that it is familiar with and understands all provisions herein and shall warrant that it can comply with them. No additional compensation to Respondent shall be authorized for services or expenses reasonably covered under these provisions that the proposer omits from its Proposal.
- 12. Cancellation: If the services to be performed hereunder by the Respondent are not performed in an acceptable manner to the LFUCG, the LFUCG may cancel this contract for cause by providing written notice to the proposer, giving at least thirty (30) days notice of the proposed cancellation and the reasons for same. During that time period, the proposer may seek to bring the performance of services hereunder to a level that is acceptable to the LFUCG, and the LFUCG may rescind the cancellation if such action is in its best interest.

A. Termination for Cause

- (1) LFUCG may terminate a contract because of the contractor's failure to perform its contractual duties
- (2) If a contractor is determined to be in default, LFUCG shall notify the contractor of the determination in writing, and may include a specified date by which the contractor shall cure the identified deficiencies. LFUCG may proceed with termination if the contractor fails to cure the deficiencies within the specified time.
- (3) A default in performance by a contractor for which a contract may be terminated shall include, but shall not necessarily be limited to:
 - (a) Failure to perform the contract according to its terms, conditions and specifications;
 - (b) Failure to make delivery within the time specified or according

- to a delivery schedule fixed by the contract;
- (c) Late payment or nonpayment of bills for labor, materials, supplies, or equipment furnished in connection with a contract for construction services as evidenced by mechanics' liens filed pursuant to the provisions of KRS Chapter 376, or letters of indebtedness received from creditors by the purchasing agency;
- (d) Failure to diligently advance the work under a contract for construction services:
- (e) The filing of a bankruptcy petition by or against the contractor; or
- (f) Actions that endanger the health, safely or welfare of the LFUCG or its citizens.

B. At Will Termination

Notwithstanding the above provisions, the LFUCG may terminate this contract at will in accordance with the law upon providing thirty (30) days written notice of that intent, Payment for services or goods received prior to termination shall be made by the LFUCG provided these goods or services were provided in a manner acceptable to the LFUCG. Payment for those goods and services shall not be unreasonably withheld.

- 13. Assignment of Contract: The contractor shall not assign or subcontract any portion of the Contract without the express written consent of LFUCG. Any purported assignment or subcontract in violation hereof shall be void. It is expressly acknowledged that LFUCG shall never be required or obligated to consent to any request for assignment or subcontract; and further that such refusal to consent can be for any or no reason, fully within the sole discretion of LFUCG.
- 14. No Waiver: No failure or delay by LFUCG in exercising any right, remedy, power or privilege hereunder, nor any single or partial exercise thereof, nor the exercise of any other right, remedy, power or privilege shall operate as a waiver hereof or thereof. No failure or delay by LFUCG in exercising any right, remedy, power or privilege under or in respect of this Contract shall affect the rights, remedies, powers or privileges of LFUCG hereunder or shall operate as a waiver thereof.
- 15. Authority to do Business: The Respondent must be a duly organized and authorized to do business under the laws of Kentucky. Respondent must be in good standing and have full legal capacity to provide the services specified under this Contract. The Respondent must have all necessary right and lawful authority to enter into this Contract for the full term hereof and that proper corporate or other action has been duly taken authorizing the Respondent to enter into this Contract. The Respondent will provide LFUCG with a copy of a corporate resolution authorizing this action and a letter from an attorney confirming that the proposer is authorized to do business in the State of Kentucky if requested. All proposals must

be signed by a duly authorized officer, agent or employee of the Respondent.

- 16. Governing Law: This Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. In the event of any proceedings regarding this Contract, the Parties agree that the venue shall be the Fayette County Circuit Court or the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky, Lexington Division. All parties expressly consent to personal jurisdiction and venue in such Court for the limited and sole purpose of proceedings relating to this Contract or any rights or obligations arising thereunder. Service of process may be accomplished by following the procedures prescribed by law.
- 17. Ability to Meet Obligations: Respondent affirmatively states that there are no actions, suits or proceedings of any kind pending against Respondent or, to the knowledge of the Respondent, threatened against the Respondent before or by any court, governmental body or agency or other tribunal or authority which would, if adversely determined, have a materially adverse effect on the authority or ability of Respondent to perform its obligations under this Contract, or which question the legality, validity or enforceability hereof or thereof.
- 18. Contractor understands and agrees that its employees, agents, or subcontractors are not employees of LFUCG for any purpose whatsoever. Contractor is an independent contractor at all times during the performance of the services specified.
- 19. If any term or provision of this Contract shall be found to be illegal or unenforceable, the remainder of the contract shall remain in full force and such term or provision shall be deemed stricken.
- 20. Contractor [or Vendor or Vendor's Employees] will not appropriate or make use of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government (LFUCG) name or any of its trade or service marks or property (including but not limited to any logo or seal), in any promotion, endorsement, advertisement, testimonial or similar use without the prior written consent of the government. If such consent is granted LFUCG reserves the unilateral right, in its sole discretion, to immediately terminate and revoke such use for any reason whatsoever. Contractor agrees that it shall cease and desist from any unauthorized use immediately upon being notified by LFUCG.

RISK MANAGEMENT PROVISIONS INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION

INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS PROVISION

- (1) It is understood and agreed by the parties that Contractor hereby assumes the entire responsibility and liability for any and all damages to persons or property caused by or resulting from or arising out of any act or omission on the part of Contractor or its employees, agents, servants, owners, principals, licensees, assigns or subcontractors of any tier (hereinafter "CONTRACTOR") under or in connection with this agreement and/or the provision of goods or services and the performance or failure to perform any work required thereby.
- CONTRACTOR shall indemnify, save, hold harmless and defend the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government and its elected and appointed officials, employees, agents, volunteers, and successors in interest (hereinafter "LFUCG") from and against all liability, damages, and losses, including but not limited to, demands, claims, obligations, causes of action, judgments, penalties, fines, liens, costs, expenses, interest, defense costs and reasonable attorney's fees that are in any way incidental to or connected with, or that arise or are alleged to have arisen, directly or indirectly, from or by CONTRACTOR's performance or breach of the agreement and/or the provision of goods or services provided that: (a) it is attributable to personal injury, bodily injury, sickness, or death, or to injury to or destruction of property (including the loss of use resulting therefrom), or to or from the negligent acts, errors or omissions or willful misconduct of the CONTRACTOR; and (b) not caused solely by the active negligence or willful misconduct of LFUCG.
- (3) In the event LFUCG is alleged to be liable based upon the above, CONTRACTOR shall defend such allegations and shall bear all costs, fees and expenses of such defense, including but not limited to, all reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses, court costs, and expert witness fees and expenses, using attorneys approved in writing by LFUCG, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- (4) These provisions shall in no way be limited by any financial responsibility or insurance requirements, and shall survive the termination of this agreement.
- (5) LFUCG is a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. CONTRACTOR acknowledges and agrees that LFUCG is unable to provide indemnity or otherwise save, hold harmless, or defend the CONTRACTOR in any manner.

FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY

BIDDER/CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that it shall demonstrate the ability to assure compliance with the above Indemnity provisions and these other risk management provisions prior to final acceptance of its bid and the commencement of any work or provision of goods.

INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Insurance placed with insurers with a rating classification of no less than Excellent (A or A-) and a financial size category of no less than VIII, as defined by the most current Best's Key Rating Guide shall be deemed automatically acceptable.

Renewals

BIDDER/CONTRACTOR agrees to furnish LFUCG with all applicable Certificates of Insurance signed by a person authorized by the insurer to bind coverage on its behalf prior to final award, and if requested, shall provide LFUCG copies of all insurance policies, including all endorsements.

Right to Review, Audit and Inspect

CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that LFUCG may review, audit and inspect any and all of its records and operations to insure compliance with these Insurance Requirements.

DEFAULT

BIDDER/CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that the failure to comply with any of these insurance, safety, or loss control provisions shall constitute default and that LFUCG may elect at its option any single remedy or penalty or any combination of remedies and penalties, as available, including but not limited to purchasing insurance and charging BIDDER/CONTRACTOR for any such insurance premiums purchased, or suspending or terminating the work.

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SCOPE OF WORK

Location

4393 Clearwater Way, Fire Station #22

Introduction

LFUCG is soliciting proposals from qualified solar PV providers to design and install a roof-mounted solar photovoltaic system at Fire Station #22. Respondents shall have demonstrated experience designing, planning, permitting and constructing complete solar electric systems in the jurisdiction of the local utility provider.

An award under this RFP will be made to the respondent with the overall best value proposal, not necessarily the lowest price. Proposals will be evaluated and scored based on the evaluation criteria defined herein.

System Requirements

Photovoltaic panels shall be roof mounted on the south and east facing surfaces. Total capacity of the system shall be no less than 20 kW-dc and not exceed 23 kW-dc. Reference **Figure 01** – **Basis of Design**.

The inverter(s), disconnect and combiner panel (if applicable) shall be installed on the east wall. Reference **Figure 01**.

All power generation and transmission equipment shall be UL listed for its designed use. Construction must comply with current adopted building codes, which includes: International Building Code, National Electric Code, and National Fire Code.

The system, including its interconnection point, shall not impact operation of the emergency generator.

Modules shall be UL1703 or UL61730 listed with a product warranty of at least 12 years and a performance warranty of no less than 82% after 25 years.

Inverters shall be UL1741 listed with a product warranty of at least 10 years and a weighted efficiency of 96% or higher.

The proposed model numbers for modules and inverters shall be listed by the California Energy Commission (CEC). List are available at the CEC website:

The system shall include a Web-based monitoring interface to display solar performance information. At a minimum, performance data of each module string shall be available for download in increments no greater than one hour.

Exterior conduit shall be liquid tight. Flexible conduit lengths shall not exceed 24 inches,

Contractor Requirements

The contractor is responsible for the assessment of the building's structural integrity, roof condition and shading limitations. Prior to installation, the contractor shall provide a letter from a structural engineer with Kentucky Professional Engineer stamp, verifying the integrity of the existing facility to handle the additional loads of proposed PV system.

Prior to installation, the Contractor shall provide dimensioned drawings and technical specifications of the proposed system to establish the physical layout, distributed load on roof, electrical wire and panel capacity, and the inverter and disconnect locations.

The Contractor is responsible for verifying any information obtained from Owner's construction drawings.

The Contractor is responsible for all permitting related to the design and installation of the system.

The Contractor is responsible for establishing communication between the inverter(s) and the internet via a cellular service agreement for a minimum of three (3) years.

Under no circumstances shall the Contractor disable electrical service to the building or secondary circuits within the building without authorization from LFUCG.

Under no circumstances shall the Contractor obstruct access to the facility or driveways.

The Contractor is responsible for documenting the condition of the roof and, specifically, any damages that exist prior to construction.

The Contractor is responsible for the construction safety plan to include, at a minimum, all applicable OSHA workplace safety and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) requirements.

Performance Verification: The Contractor shall review generation data and provide a report to LFUCG to demonstrate that system output is meeting expectations. Two reports are required: (1) after 30 days and (2) prior to the expiration of workmanship warranty.

Workmanship warranty: the Contractor shall perform an on-site inspection prior to the expiration of workmanship warranty, if requested by the Owner.

The Contractor shall achieve substantial completion within 75 calendar days of Notice to Proceed. Substantial Completion is defined as LFUCG having beneficial use of the photovoltaic system.

Owner Guidance

For system sizing, the desired number of modules for each roof are shown in **Figure 01**, based on a nominal output of either 410 watts or 540 watts.

Modules should lay in a plane parallel to the roof. A rectangular arrangement is preferred.

Conduit runs should be straight with minimal couplings. Runs around an object like a gutter are not acceptable.

Electrical service is provided by Kentucky Utilities under the Three-Phase General Service Rate (RC113). 15-minute interval data is available in a *.csv file.

- (i) "Q CELLS Modules" are defined in this Limited Warranty as Q CELLS branded photovoltaic modules manufactured by HQC or its authorized manufacturers (hereinafter "Q CELLS module") that are sold and installed within the United States and Canada and are of the following product type:
- Q.PEAK DUO BLK-G10+/AC
- (ii) "Microinverters" are defined in this Limited Warranty as the microinverters assembled with the Q CELLS Modules and are of the following product type:
- IQ™7+-series microinverters

FOR THE AVOIDANCE OF DOUBT, THIS LIMITED WARRANTY SUPERSEDES AND REPLACES ANY MANUFACTURER WARRANTY FOR THE MICROINVERTERS WITH RESPECT TO THE CUSTOMER.

b. Beneficiary

The sole and exclusive beneficiary of this Limited Warranty is (i) an end customer who (A) purchases Products from HQC or from any one of its authorized distributors or installers ("Distributor") and (B) is the initial installer of such Products into a specific photovoltaic (PV) solar energy project ("Project"), and (ii) any of the end customer's successors or assigns (each, a "Transferee"), as long as (A) the Product remains at the Original Location (as defined below), (B) the Transferee submits to HQC's designee a "Change of Ownership Form", (C) the Transferee pays the applicable transfer fee ("Transfer Fee) to HQC's designee as set forth in the Change of Ownership Form within 30 days from the date of transfer to the Transferee and (D) if applicable, the Transferee complies with the Registration requirements in Section 2.c. 2. WARRANTY

Subject to the terms and conditions of this Limited Warranty, HQC warrants to the Customer that the Q CELLS Modules are manufactured to (i) produce a power output of at least ninety-eight percent (98%) of the minimum power output specified in the applicable module data sheet during the first twelve (12) months following the Warranty Start Date, and (ii) have a yearly maximum decrease (or degradation) of power of not more than fifty-four hundredths of one percent (0.54%) from start of the second (2nd) twelve (12)-month period following the Warranty Start Date until the end of such twelve (12)-month period, and repeated for each successive twelve (12)-month period until the twenty-fifth (25th) anniversary of the Warranty Start Date, (collectively, "Performance Warranty"). As an example, the Q CELLS Module will be manufactured to have a minimum power output of eighty-five percent (85%) of the minimum power output specified in the applicable module data sheet at the end of the term of this Limited Warranty. If the Warranty Claim is based on glass breakage, then the Customer shall conduct a static load calculation on the substructure.

d. Warranty Claim Compliance

The Customer must comply with the HQC's designee's then-current Return Merchandise Authorization ("RMA") process, set forth at https://enphase.com/en-us/support/return-merchandise-authorization-procedure, to make a Warranty Claim. For the avoidance of doubt, Enphase Energy, Inc. will provide customer service for RMAs on behalf of HQC. If a Customer returns a Product without complying with the RMA process or without all parts included in the original package, HQC (i) will not accept any Warranty Claims not in compliance with the RMA or delivery of any unauthorized return shipments of Products and (ii) shall be entitled to charge a restocking fee equal to the higher of fifteen percent (15%) of the original Customer's purchase price of the Product (as reasonably apportioned to the applicable Product by HQC, if necessary) or the retail value of the missing parts.

e. Warranty Claim Procedure

The Customer is responsible for shipping, at its expense, the Product to HQC or its designee for evaluation. HQC or its designee shall pay the costs of a technical inspection and, in the event that the Warranty Claim is confirmed by such inspection, transportation of any repaired or replacement Product to Customer at the original location of the Project. Any Product that HQC or its designee determines is not defective or that is returned without a valid RMA may be rejected and returned at Customer's expense (subject to prepayment), or kept for thirty (30) days for pick-up by Customer and then disposed of at HQC's sole discretion without further liability on the part of HQC or obligation to Customer. To make a Warranty Claim, the Customer must submit the original receipt or invoice, which bears the date of the purchase and of the delivery, the serial numbers of the relevant Products and the name of the authorized distributor or seller.

f. Ownership Interest

The Products sent to HQC, or its designee, in the course of the RMA process shall remain the property of the Customer until any inspection has been completed and HQC provides a replacement or refund. At the time any refund or delivery of a replacement Product to the Customer takes place under this Limited Warranty, the ownership interest of the returned Product passes to HQC or its designee. Any repaired, replaced or additionally supplied Products will be warranted only for the remainder of the original warranty period applicable to the original Product.



5. REMEDIES

a. Product Defect Remedy

If HQC determines following a Warranty Claim that a Product Defect exists, then HQC or its designee shall, at its discretion, within a reasonable time provide: (i) a remedy or repair for the Product Defect using new and/or reconditioned parts or Products of original or improved design; (ii) provide a replacement Product in place of the Product with the Product Defect; or (iii) provide the Customer monetary compensation equal to the market value of the Q CELLS Module or Microinverter, as applicable, as of the time Customer notifies HQC's designee of the applicable Warranty Claim in accordance with Section 4.a. above, as reasonably determined by HQC.

b. Performance Warranty Remedy

If HQC determines following a Warranty Claim that a Q CELLS Module has a Performance Defect, then HQC shall, at its discretion, within a reasonable time: (i) remedy or repair the Performance Defect; (ii) provide a replacement module in place of the Q CELLS Module that has the Performance Defect; (iii) make up the difference to the guaranteed power output by providing additional modules; or (iv) provide to the Customer monetary compensation equal to the portion of the market value of the Q CELLS Module as of the time Customer notifies Enphase of the applicable Warranty Claim in accordance with Section 4.a. above, as reasonably determined by HQC (the "Module Value"), that is in the same proportion to the Module Value as the actual measured power is to the guaranteed power.

c. Sole and Exclusive Remedy and Obligation

THE REMEDIES SET FORTH IN THIS SECTION 5. ARE HQC'S SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE LIABILITY AND OBLIGATION, AND THE CUSTOMER'S SOLE AND EXCLUSIVE REMEDIES, FOR ANY PRODUCT DEFECT OR PERFORMANCE DEFECT IN ANY PRODUCT. THE REMEDY EXTENDED TO THE CUSTOMER SPECIFICALLY EXCLUDES ANY REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE COSTS OR EXPENSES INCURRED FOR (I) UNINSTALLING OR DISMANTLING ANY DEFECTIVE PRODUCT OR PARTS, (II) REINSTALLING ANY REPAIRED OR REPLACED PRODUCTS OR PARTS, (III) REMOVING, INSTALLING OR TROUBLESHOOTING CUSTOMER'S ELECTRICAL SYSTEMS OR (IV) LOSS OF POWER.

6. WARRANTY LIMITATIONS

THE GRANT OF THIS LIMITED WARRANTY BY HQC IS CONDITIONED UPON AGREEMENT BY CUSTOMER TO THE TERMS, CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS HEREIN.

THE LIMITED WARRANTY DOES NOT COVER (I) TECHNICAL OR DESIGN DEFECTS OR SHORTCOMINGS, OR COSMETIC DEFECTS, SHORTCOMINGS OR CHANGES, INCLUDING ANY COLOR CHANGES, (II) COSTS RELATED TO THE REMOVAL, INSTALLATION OR TROUBLESHOOTING OF CUSTOMER'S ELECTRICAL SYSTEMS OR (II) SOFTWARE PROGRAMS INSTALLED IN A PRODUCT AND THE RECOVERY AND REINSTALLATION OF SUCH SOFTWARE PROGRAMS AND DATA. HQC DOES NOT WARRANT THAT THE OPERATION OF ANY PRODUCT WILL BE UNINTERRUPTED OR ERROR FREE. NO HQC OR ENPHASE EMPLOYEE OR ANY DISTRIBUTOR OR OTHER AUTHORIZED RESELLER IS AUTHORIZED TO MAKE ANY MODIFICATION, EXTENSION OR ADDITION TO THIS LIMITED WARRANTY.

ANY IMPLIED WARRANTIES OF MERCHANTABILITY, FITNESS FOR A PARTICULAR PURPOSE OR NON-INFRINGEMENT TO THE EXTENT REQUIRED BY APPLICABLE LAW ARE LIMITED TO THE PERIODS OF THE LIMITED PRODUCT AND LIMITED PERFORMANCE WARRANTIES SET FORTH ABOVE, OR SUCH SHORTER PERIOD AS PERMITTED BY APPLICABLE LAW. 7. ASSIGNMENT

Assignment

Except to the extent expressly permitted herein, this Limited Warranty may not be assigned or transferred by Customer, and any attempt to assign or transfer in violation of this paragraph shall be null and void. HQC expressly reserves the right to novate or assign its rights and obligations under this Limited Warranty to a third party with the demonstrated expertise and requisite resources needed to effectively discharge the obligations hereunder.

8. MISCELLANEOUS

a. Severability

If any provision of this Limited Warranty terms and conditions is held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such provision will be changed and interpreted to accomplish the objectives of such provision to the greatest extent possible under applicable law and the remaining provisions will continue in full force and effect.

b. Governing Law

All matters arising from or relating to this Limited Warranty shall be governed by the laws of the State of California, without regard to its choice of law rules. The UN Convention on the International Sale of Goods shall not apply.

9. ARBITRATION

a. Please read the following arbitration agreement in this Section ("Arbitration Agreement") carefully. It requires Customer ("you") to arbitrate disputes with HQC ("us") and limits the manner in which you can seek relief from us. THE LAWS OF CERTAIN JURISDICTIONS DO NOT PERMIT THE USE OF MANDATORY ARBITRATION CLAUSES. WHERE SUCH LAWS APPLY TO CUSTOMER, THIS ARBITRATION CLAUSE MAY NOT APPLY.

b. Applicability of Arbitration Agreement

You agree that any dispute or claim relating in any way to your access or use of any Product, or to any aspect of your relationship with us, will be resolved by binding arbitration rather than in court, except that (i) you may assert claims in small claims court if your claims qualify; and (ii) you or we may seek equitable relief in court for infringement or other misuse of intellectual property rights (such as trademarks, trade dress, domain names, trade secrets, copyrights, and patents).

c. Arbitration Rules and Forum

For any dispute in connection with this Limited Warranty, you agree to first contact us at the email address identified below and attempt to resolve the dispute with us informally. If the dispute has not been resolved after 60 days, both parties agree to resolve such dispute through binding arbitration under the Optional Expedited Arbitration Procedures then in effect for the Judicial Arbitration and Mediation Services ("JAMS"). JAMS may be contacted at www.jamsadr.com. The existence, content and result of the arbitration shall be held in confidence by all participants. The arbitration will be conducted by a single arbitrator selected by agreement of the parties or, failing such agreement, appointed in accordance with the JAMS rules. The arbitration shall be conducted in English and in Santa Clara County, California. If JAMS is not available to arbitrate, the parties will select an alternative arbitral forum. If the arbitrator finds that you cannot afford to pay JAMS's filing, administrative, hearing and/ or other fees and cannot obtain a waiver from JAMS, we will pay such fees for you. In addition, we will reimburse all such JAMS's filing, administrative, hearing and/or other fees for claims totaling less than \$10,000 unless the arbitrator determines the claims are frivolous. Any judgment on the award rendered by the arbitrator



may be entered in any court of competent jurisdiction. The arbitrator shall have exclusive authority to (i) determine the scope and enforceability of this Arbitration Agreement, and (ii) resolve any dispute related to the interpretation, applicability, enforceability or formation of this Arbitration Agreement including, but not limited to any claim that all or any part of this Arbitration Agreement is void or voidable. The arbitrator will decide the rights and liabilities, if any, of the parties. The arbitration proceeding will not be consolidated with any other matters or joined with any other cases or parties. The arbitrator shall have the authority to grant motions dispositive of all or part of any claim. The arbitrator shall have the authority to award monetary damages and to grant any non-monetary remedy or relief available to an individual under applicable law, the arbitral forum's rules, and this Limited Warranty. The arbitrator shall issue a written award and statement of decision describing the essential findings and conclusions on which the award is based, including the calculation of any damages awarded. The arbitrator has the same authority to award relief on an individual basis that a judge in a court of law would have. The award of the arbitrator is final and binding upon the parties.

d. Waiver of Jury Trial

YOU AND WE HEREBY WAIVE ANY CONSTITUTIONAL AND STATUTORY RIGHTS TO SUE IN COURT AND HAVE A TRIAL IN FRONT OF A JUDGE OR A JURY. You and we are instead electing that all claims and disputes shall be resolved by arbitration under this Arbitration Agreement. An arbitrator can award on an individual basis the same damages and relief as a court and must follow this Arbitration Agreement as a court would. However, there is no judge or jury in arbitration, and court review of an arbitration award is subject to very limited review.

e. Waiver of Class or Other Non-Individualized Relief

ALL CLAIMS AND DISPUTES WITHIN THE SCOPE OF THIS ARBITRATION AGREEMENT MUST BE ARBITRATED ON AN INDIVIDUAL BASIS AND NOT ON A CLASS OR COLLECTIVE BASIS, ONLY INDIVIDUAL RELIEF IS AVAILABLE, AND CLAIMS OF MORE THAN ONE CUSTOMER CANNOT BE ARBITRATED OR CONSOLIDATED WITH THOSE OF ANY OTHER CUSTOMER. If a decision is issued stating that applicable law precludes enforcement of any of this subsection's limitations as to a given claim for relief, then such claim shall be severed from the arbitration and brought into the State or Federal Courts located in San Francisco, California. All other claims shall be arbitrated.

f. 30-Day Right to Opt Out

You have the right to opt out of the provisions of this Arbitration Agreement by sending written notice of your decision to opt out to Hanwha Q CELLS America Inc., 400 Spectrum Center Drive,

Suite 1400, Attention: Legal Department, within 30 days after first becoming subject to this Arbitration Agreement. You may also opt-out of the provisions of this Arbitration Agreement by sending written notice of your decision to the following email address: HQCA-Legal@us.q-cells.com. Your notice must include your name and address, and an unequivocal statement that you want to opt out of this Arbitration Agreement. If you opt out of this Arbitration Agreement, all other parts of this Limited Warranty will continue to apply to you. Opting out of this Arbitration Agreement has no effect on any other arbitration agreements that you may currently have, or may enter into in the future, with us.

g. Severability

Except as provided above, if any part or parts of this Arbitration Agreement are found under the law to be invalid or unenforceable, then such specific part or parts shall be of no force and effect and shall be severed and the remainder of the Arbitration Agreement shall continue in full force and effect.

h. Survival of Agreement

This Arbitration Agreement will survive the termination of your relationship with us.

LIMITED PRODUCT WARRANTY

This SolarEdge Technologies Ltd. limited warranty (the "Limited Warranty") covers defects in workmanship and materials of the below-listed products ("Products") for the applicable warranty period set out below ("Warranty Period"). See Products Covered and Warranty Period.

The Limited Warranty only applies to the buyer who purchased the Products from an authorized seller of SolarEdge for use within the continent where SolarEdge originally sold the Products and in accordance with their intended purpose. The Limited Warranty may be transferred from the buyer to any assignee and will remain in effect for the time period remaining under the foregoing warranties, provided that the Products are not moved outside their original country of installation. Also, any reinstallation must follow the installation procedures and guidelines accompanying the Products (collectively the "Documentation").

Warranty Activation

If the buyer discovers any defect in workmanship and materials within the applicable Warranty Period and wants to activate the Limited Warranty, then the buyer must promptly after such discovery report the defect to SolarEdge by sending an email to support@solaredge.com. The email must include this information: (i) a short description of the defect, (ii) the Product's serial number, and (iii) a scanned copy of the purchase receipt or warranty certificate of the applicable Product. Note that the Product's serial number must be legible and properly attached to the Product in order to be eligible for coverage.

After receiving notification from the buyer, SolarEdge will determine whether or not the reported defect is eligible for coverage under the Limited Warranty. If SolarEdge determines that the reported defect is not eligible for coverage under the Limited Warranty, SolarEdge will notify the buyer accordingly and will explain the reason why such coverage is not available. See <u>Warranty Exclusions</u>.

If SolarEdge determines that the reported defect is eligible for coverage under the Limited Warranty, SolarEdge will notify the buyer accordingly, and SolarEdge may, at its sole discretion, take any of the following actions:

- Repair the Product at SolarEdge's facilities or on-site.; or
- Issue a credit note for the defective Product in an amount up to its actual value at the time the buyer notifies SolarEdge of the defect, as determined by SolarEdge, for use toward the purchase of a new Product; or
- Provide the buyer with replacement units for the Product. When replacement Products are sent,
 SolarEdge generally sends them within 48 hours. SolarEdge may use new, used or refurbished parts that
 are at least functionally equivalent to the original part when making warranty repairs. The repaired
 Product or replacement parts or Product, as applicable, will continue to be covered under the Limited
 Warranty for the remainder of the then-current Warranty Period for the Product.

In any of the above, SolarEdge will determine if the Product should be returned to SolarEdge and, if SolarEdge so determines, the Return Merchandise Authorization ("RMA") Procedure will be invoked. When the RMA Procedure is invoked by SolarEdge, SolarEdge will instruct the buyer how to package and ship the Product or part(s) to the designated location. SolarEdge will bear the cost of such shipment, upon receipt of the Product or part(s), SolarEdge will, at its expense and sole discretion, either repair or replace the Product or part(s)

SolarEdge will deliver the repaired or replaced Product or part(s) to the buyer at the buyer's designated location in countries where SolarEdge has an office and/or there is a significant PV market. For the specific



list of countries to which such service is provided, see http://www.solaredge.com/articles/shipping cost coverage warranty.

SolarEdge will bear the cost of such shipment, including shipping and customs (where applicable), and the buyer will bear any applicable value added tax. SolarEdge may elect to ship replacement Product(s) and/or part(s) prior to receipt of the Product and/or part(s) to be returned to SolarEdge as per the above.

All costs, including, without limitation, labor, travel, and boarding costs of SolarEdge service personnel or others that are incurred for labor relating to repairs, uninstalling, and reinstalling of Products on-site, as well as costs related to the buyer's employees and contractors repair or replacement activities, are not covered by the Limited Warranty and, unless otherwise agreed in writing in advance by SolarEdge, will be borne by the buyer.

Warranty Exclusions

The Limited Warranty does not apply to components that are separate from the Products, ancillary equipment, and consumables, such as, for example, cables, cable holders, fuses, wires, and connectors, whether supplied by SolarEdge or others. Some components may carry their own manufacturer warranty. See the product datasheet for more details.

This Limited Warranty will not apply if (a) the buyer is in default under the General Terms and Conditions of sale or any other Agreement governing the purchase of the Product, or (b) the Product or any part thereof is:

Such actions are final and do not grant any further rights, in particular with respect to any claims for compensation.

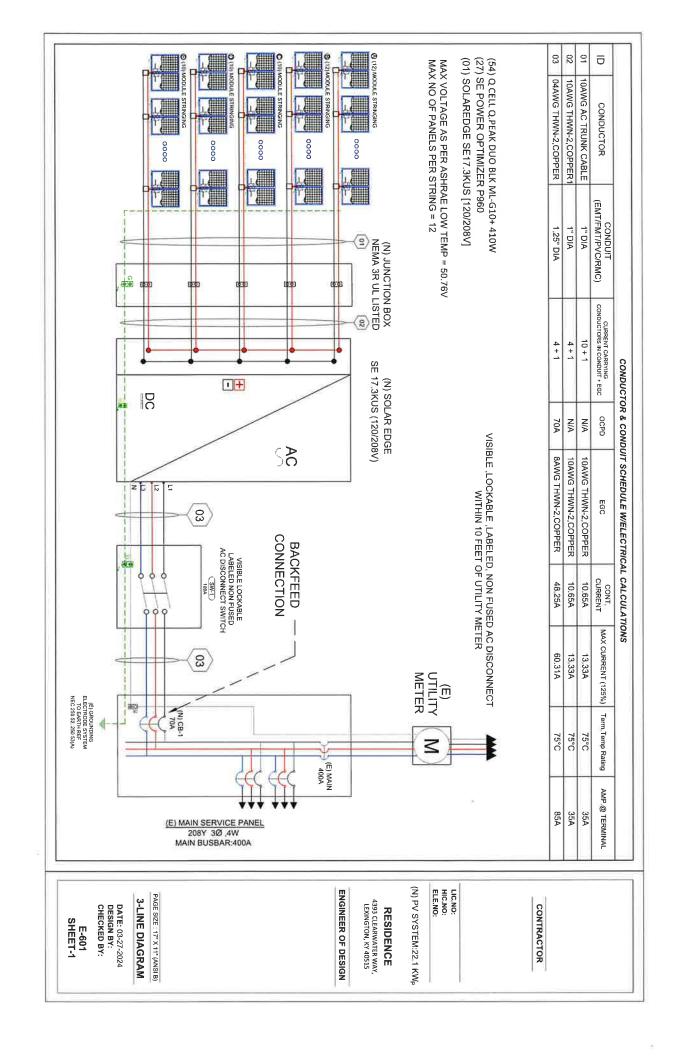

LINE DIAGRAM / DESIGN TABLE



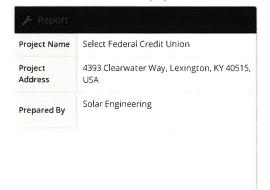

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS IS AN AGREEMENT made as of April 8th, 2024 between the LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT (**OWNER**) and CALHOUN CONSTRUCTION SERVICES, INC. (**PROFESSIONAL**). **OWNER** intends to proceed with a roof-mounted solar photovoltaic systems in Lexington, Kentucky as described in the attached Request for Proposal document. The services are to include design and installation of solar photovoltaic systems for the city as described in the **OWNER**'s Request for Proposal No. 17-2024. The services are hereinafter referred to as the Project.

OWNER and **PROFESSIONAL** in consideration of their mutual covenants herein agree in respect of the performance of design and installation services by **PROFESSIONAL** and the payment for those services by **OWNER** as set forth below.

PROFESSIONAL was selected by **OWNER** based upon its response to the Request for Proposal No. 17-2024.

PROFESSIONAL shall provide design and installation of solar photovoltaic systems for **OWNER** in all phases of the Project to which this Agreement applies, serve as **OWNER'S** representative for the Project as set forth below and shall give professional consultation and advice to **OWNER** during the performance of services hereunder.

SECTION 1 - BASIC SERVICES OF PROFESSIONAL

PROFESSIONAL shall perform all services as hereinafter stated which include customary planning and analysis incidental thereto.

The following documents are incorporated by reference herein as if fully stated and are attached hereto as exhibits:

RFP No. 17-2024 (Exhibit "A") **PROFESSIONAL'S** proposal notarized 4/2/2024 (Exhibit "B"), 133 pages

To the extent there is conflict among their provisions, the provisions of this Agreement shall take precedence, followed by the provisions of Request for Proposal No. 17-2024 (Exhibit "A"), followed by the provisions of Exhibit "B".

In addition to the services provided in Exhibits "A" and "B", the following services shall also be included:

1. **PROFESSIONAL** shall provide detailed drawings to document the electrical interconnection for review by **OWNER** prior to commencement of installation. At a minimum, drawings are to include AC/DC disconnect locations, panel breaker connection points, over current protection devices, and backfeed capacity calculations; and

After written authorization to proceed with the Project, **PROFESSIONAL** shall:

- 1. Notify the **OWNER** in writing of its authorized representative who shall act as Project Manager and liaison representative between the **PROFESSIONAL** and the **OWNER**.
- 2. Design and install a roof-mounted solar photovoltaic system as proposed in Exhibit "B" and subject to the "System Requirements" and "Contractor Requirements" as defined in Exhibit "A", "Scope of Work".

This Agreement, together with the Exhibits and schedules identified above constitutes the entire Agreement between **OWNER** and **PROFESSIONAL** and supersedes all prior written or oral understandings. This Agreement and said Exhibits and schedules may only be amended, supplemented, modified, or canceled by a duly executed written instrument.

The General Provisions of RFP No. 17-2024 are incorporated herein by reference as if fully stated.

SECTION 2 - ADDITIONAL SERVICES BY PROFESSIONAL

- 2.1. The **OWNER** may desire to have the **PROFESSIONAL** perform work or render services in connection with this Project other than those services provided herein. Such work shall be considered as "Additional Services", subject to a change order, supplemental to this Agreement, setting forth the character and scope thereof and the compensation therefore. Work under such change order shall not proceed until the **OWNER** gives written authorization. Should the **OWNER** find it desirable to have previously satisfactorily completed and accepted plans or parts thereof revised, the **PROFESSIONAL** shall make such revisions as directed, in writing, by the **OWNER**. This work shall be considered as "Additional Services" and shall be paid as such.
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SECTION 3 - OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

OWNER shall:

- **3.1.** Provide criteria and information as to **OWNER'S** requirements for the Project, including design objectives and constraints, space, capacity and performance requirements, flexibility and expandability, and any budgetary limitations.
- **3.2.** Assist **PROFESSIONAL** by placing at its disposal available information pertinent to the Project.
- **3.3.** Examine all studies, reports, sketches, drawings, specifications, proposals and other documents presented by **PROFESSIONAL**, and render in writing decisions

- pertaining thereto within a reasonable time so as not to delay the services of **PROFESSIONAL**.
- 3.4. Designate in writing a person to act as **OWNER'S** representative with respect to the services to be rendered under this Agreement. Such person shall have complete authority to transmit instructions, receive information, interpret and define **OWNER'S** policies and decisions with respect to materials, equipment, elements and systems pertinent to **PROFESSIONAL'S** services.
- **3.5.** Give written notice to **PROFESSIONAL** whenever **OWNER** observes or otherwise becomes aware of any development that affects the scope or timing of **PROFESSIONAL'S** services, or any defect in the work of Contractor(s).
- **3.6.** Furnish or direct **PROFESSIONAL** to provide, necessary Additional Services as stipulated in Section Two (2) of this Agreement or other services as required.

SECTION 4 - PERIOD OF SERVICES

- **4.1.** Time is of the essence. See Exhibit "A" (attached) pertaining to substantial completion of services.
- **4.2.** The provisions of this Section Four (4) and the various rates of compensation for **PROFESSIONAL'S** services provided for elsewhere in this Agreement have been agreed to in anticipation of the orderly and continuous progress of the Project through completion.
- 4.3 If delays result by reason of acts of the **OWNER** or approving agencies or other causes, which are beyond the control of the **PROFESSIONAL**, an extension of time for such delay will be considered. If delays occur, the **PROFESSIONAL** shall within 30 days from the date of the delay apply in writing to the **OWNER** for an extension of time for such reasonable period as may be mutually agreed upon between the parties, and if approved, the Project schedule shall be revised to reflect the extension. Such extension of time to the completion date shall in no way be construed to operate as a waiver on the part of the **OWNER** of any of its rights in the Agreement. Section 6.5, under DISPUTES, of this Agreement, shall apply in the event the parties cannot mutually agree upon an extension of time.

In the event that the overall delay resulting from the above described causes is sufficient to prevent complete performance of the Agreement within six (6) months of the time specified therein, the Agreement fee or fees shall be subject to reconsideration and possible adjustment. Section 6.5 of this Agreement shall apply in the event the parties cannot mutually agree upon an adjustment of fee.

4.4. If delays result solely by reason of act of the **PROFESSIONAL**, the **PROFESSIONAL** must immediately notify the **OWNER** in the event of such delay, and provide the **OWNER** a written action plan within five (5) business days on how

it will reasonably attempt to resolve the delay. If the parties cannot mutually agree to an extension of time or an adjustment, Section 6.5 of this Agreement shall apply. If the delay would prevent complete performance of the project within six (6) months of the time specified herein, **OWNER** shall have the option of canceling the project or otherwise adjusting the scope of service or work and any related fees.

SECTION 5 - PAYMENTS TO PROFESSIONAL

5.1 Methods of Payment for Services of PROFESSIONAL

5.1.1 For Basic Services.

All Lump Sum Pricing shall include all direct labor and supervision necessary to complete the item in a manner that meets or exceeds the **OWNER'S** satisfaction. It shall also include the labor payroll costs, overhead (such as unemployment taxes, general liability insurance, rent, utilities, phones, supplies, administrative salaries, F.I.C.A. sick and vacations, etc. disposal fees tool allowance, equipment, materials, profit and all other costs used on the job). The negotiated cost of services is established in Exhibit "B" per "Price Proposal Form", page 55 of 133.

5.2. Times of Payment.

5.2.1. PROFESSIONAL shall submit a schedule of values subject to approval by the **OWNER** prior to starting work. The approved schedule of values will be the basis for monthly statements for Basic Services and Additional Services rendered. The Statements will be based upon **PROFESSIONAL'S** estimate of the proportion of the total services actually completed at the time of billing and are subject to approval by the **OWNER**. **OWNER** shall pay **PROFESSIONAL'S** monthly statements within thirty (30) days of receipt.

5.3. Other Provisions Concerning Payments.

- **5.3.1.** In the event the Agreement is terminated by the **OWNER** without fault on the part of the **PROFESSIONAL**, the **PROFESSIONAL** shall be paid for the work performed or services rendered in an amount bearing the same ratio to the total Agreement fee as the amount of work completed or partially completed and delivered to the **OWNER** is to the total amount of work provided for herein, as determined by mutual agreement between the **OWNER** and the **PROFESSIONAL**.
- **5.3.2.** In the event the services of the **PROFESSIONAL** are terminated by the **OWNER** for fault on the part of the **PROFESSIONAL**, the **PROFESSIONAL** shall be paid reasonable value of the work performed or services rendered and delivered, and the amount to be paid shall be determined by the **OWNER**.
- **5.3.3.** In the event the **PROFESSIONAL** shall terminate the Agreement because of gross delays caused by the **OWNER**, the **PROFESSIONAL** shall be paid as set forth in Section 5.3.1. above.

SECTION 6 – ADDITIONAL GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS

6.1. Termination

- **6.1.1. PROFESSIONAL** may only terminate this Agreement due to **OWNER'S** material breach of the terms hereof which breach causes **PROFESSIONAL** to be unable to perform its duties and responsibilities under this Agreement, and only upon ten (10) days written notice to **OWNER**, and provided **OWNER** fails to cure such default within the ten (10) day period.
- **6.1.2.** The **OWNER** reserves the right to terminate the Agreement for any reason at any time upon seven (7) days written notice to the **PROFESSIONAL**.

Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, the **PROFESSIONAL** shall be acting as an independent contractor. The **PROFESSIONAL** shall not hold itself out as, nor claim to be, an officer or employee of **OWNER** by reason hereof and shall not make any claim, demand or application to or for any right or privilege applicable to an officer or employee of **OWNER**. The **PROFESSIONAL** shall be solely responsible for any claims for wages or compensation by **PROFESSIONAL'S** employees, agents and representatives, including **PROFESSIONALS**, and shall save and hold **OWNER** harmless therefrom.
- **6.3.3.** The parties hereto agree that causes of actions between the parties shall be governed by applicable provisions of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, that venue of any legal action shall be a court of appropriate jurisdiction in Fayette County, Kentucky, and that Kentucky law shall apply with respect to the interpretation of any provision of this Agreement.

6.4. Successors and Assigns.

6.4.1. PROFESSIONAL binds itself and its partners, successors, executors, administrators, assigns and legal representatives to this Agreement in respect to all covenants, agreements and obligations of this Agreement. **PROFESSIONAL** shall not assign any interest, obligation or benefit in this Agreement. **PROFESSIONAL**

shall not assign any interest, obligation or benefit in this Agreement or transfer any interest in the same, whether by assignment or novation, without prior written consent of **OWNER**.

6.4.2. The **PROFESSIONAL** shall not subcontract more than fifty percent (50%) of the work, based upon dollar value, to be provided under this Agreement. The **PROFESSIONAL** shall obtain written approval prior to subletting or assigning any services contained in this Agreement, and consent to sublet or assign any part of this Agreement shall not be construed to relieve the **PROFESSIONAL** of any responsibility for compliance with the provisions of this Agreement.

6.4.3. Nothing herein shall be construed to give any rights or benefits hereunder to anyone other than **OWNER** and **PROFESSIONAL**.

6.5. Disputes.

Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, any dispute concerning the amount of payment due the **PROFESSIONAL** or any dispute concerning any question of fact of any act to be performed under this Agreement, which is not disposed of by agreement between the Urban County Division of Central Purchasing and the **PROFESSIONAL**, shall be submitted to the Commissioner, Department of General Services, Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government for review. Minor exceptions may not eliminate the proposal. Any exceptions to the specifications established herein shall be listed in detail on a separate sheet and attached hereto. The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government shall determine whether any exception is minor.

The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government encourages the participation of minority- and women-owned businesses in Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government contracts. This proposal is subject to Affirmative Action requirements attached hereto.

Please do not contact any LFUCG staff member or any other person involved in the selection process other than the designated contact person(s) regarding the project contemplated under this RFP while this RFP is open and a selection has not been finalized. Any attempt to do so may result in disqualification of the firm's submittal for consideration.

Laws and Regulations

All applicable state laws, municipal ordinances and regulations of all authorities having jurisdiction over the project shall apply to the contract, and shall be deemed to be incorporated herein by reference.

Equal Employment Opportunity

The Entity (regardless of whether construction contractor, non-construction contractor or supplier) agrees to provide equal opportunity in employment for all qualified persons, to prohibit discrimination in employment because of race, color, religion, sex (including pregnancy, sexual orientation or gender identity), national origin, disability, age, genetic information, political affiliation, or veteran status, and to promote equal employment through a positive, continuing program from itself and each of its sub-contracting agents. This program of equal employment opportunity shall apply to every aspect of its employment policies and practices.

Kentucky Equal Employment Opportunity Act

The Kentucky Equal Employment Opportunity Act of 1978 (KRS 45.560-45.640) requires that any "county, city, town, school district, water district, hospital district, or other political subdivision of the state shall include in directly or indirectly publicly funded contracts for supplies, materials, services, or equipment hereinafter entered into the following provisions:

"During the performance of this contract, the contractor agrees as follows:

- (1) The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, age, or national origin;
- (2) The contractor will state in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractors that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, age, or national origin;
- (3) The contractor will post notices in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, setting forth the provision of the nondiscrimination clauses required by this section; and
- (4) The contractor will send a notice to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding advising the labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under the nondiscrimination clauses."

The Act further provides:

"KRS 45.610. Hiring minorities -- Information required

- (1) For the length of the contract, each contractor shall hire minorities from other sources within the drawing area, should the union with which he has collective bargaining agreements be unwilling to supply sufficient minorities to satisfy the agreed upon goals and timetables.
- (2) Each contractor shall, for the length of the contract, furnish such information as required by KRS 45.560 to KRS 45.640 and by such rules, regulations and orders issued pursuant thereto and will permit access to all books and records pertaining to

his employment practices and work sites by the contracting agency and the department for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with KRS 45.560 to 45.640 and such rules, regulations and orders issued pursuant thereto.

KRS 45.620. Action against contractor -- Hiring of minority contractor or subcontractor

- (1) If any contractor is found by the department to have engaged in an unlawful practice under this chapter during the course of performing under a contract or subcontract covered under KRS 45.560 to 45.640, the department shall so certify to the contracting agency and such certification shall be binding upon the contracting agency unless it is reversed in the course of judicial review.
- (2) If the contractor is found to have committed an unlawful practice under KRS 45.560 to 45.640, the contracting agency may cancel or terminate the contract, conditioned upon a program for future compliance approved by the contracting agency and the department. The contracting agency may declare such a contractor ineligible to bid on further contracts with that agency until such time as the contractor complies in full with the requirements of KRS 45.560 to 45.640.
- (3) The equal employment provisions of KRS 45.560 to 45.640 may be met in part by a contractor by subcontracting to a minority contractor or subcontractor. For the provisions of KRS 45.560 to 45.640, a minority contractor or subcontractor shall mean a business that is owned and controlled by one or more persons disadvantaged by racial or ethnic circumstances.

KRS 45.630 Termination of existing employee not required, when

Any provision of KRS 45.560 to 45.640 notwithstanding, no contractor shall be required to terminate an existing employee upon proof that employee was employed prior to the date of the contract.

KRS 45.640 Minimum skills

Nothing in KRS 45.560 to 45.640 shall require a contractor to hire anyone who fails to demonstrate the minimum skills required to perform a particular job."

It is recommended that all of the provisions above quoted be included as <u>special conditions</u> in each contract. In the case of a contract exceeding \$250,000, the contractor is required to furnish evidence that his workforce in Kentucky is representative of the available work-force in the area from which he draws employees, or to supply an Affirmative Action plan which will achieve such representation during the life of the contract.

LFUCG Non-Appropriation Clause

Contractor acknowledges that the LFUCG is a governmental entity, and the contract validity is based upon the availability of public funding under the authority of its statutory mandate.

In the event that public funds are unavailable and not appropriated for the performance of the LFUCG's obligations under this contract, then this contract shall automatically expire without penalty to the LFUCG thirty (30) days after written notice to Contractor of the unavailability and non-appropriation of public funds. It is expressly agreed that the LFUCG shall not activate this non-appropriation provision for its convenience or to circumvent the requirements of this contract, but only as an emergency fiscal measure during a substantial fiscal crisis, which affects generally its governmental operations.

In the event of a change in the LFUCG's statutory authority, mandate and mandated functions, by state and federal legislative or regulatory action, which adversely affects the LFUCG's authority to continue its obligations under this contract, then this contract shall automatically terminate without penalty to the LFUCG upon written notice to Contractor of such limitation or change in the LFUCG's legal authority.

Contention Process

Vendors who respond to this invitation have the right to file a notice of contention associated with the RFP process or to file a notice of appeal of the recommendation made by the Director of Procurement resulting from this invitation.

Notice of contention with the RFP process must be filed within 3 business days of the bid/proposal opening by (1) sending a written notice, including sufficient documentation to support contention, to the Director of the Division of Procurement or (2) submitting a written request for a meeting with the Director of Procurement to explain his/her contention with the RFP process. After consulting with the Commissioner of Finance the Chief Administrative Officer and reviewing the documentation and/or hearing the vendor, the Director of Procurement shall promptly respond in writing findings as to the compliance with RFP processes. If, based on this review, a RFP process irregularity is deemed to have occurred the Director of Procurement will consult with the Commissioner of Finance, the Chief Administrative Officer and the Department of Law as to the appropriate remedy.

Notice of appeal of a RFP recommendation must be filed within 3 business days of the RFP recommendation by (1) sending a written notice, including sufficient documentation to support appeal, to the Director, Division of Procurement or (2) submitting a written request for a meeting with the Director of Procurement to explain his appeal. After reviewing the documentation and/or hearing the vendor and consulting with the Commissioner of Finance and the Chief Administrative Officer, the Director of Procurement shall in writing, affirm or withdraw the recommendation.

AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT

AMENDMENT 1 — CERTIFICATION OF COMPLIANCE FOR EXPENDITURES USING FEDERAL FUNDS, INCLUDING THE AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT

The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government ("LFUCG") <u>may</u> use Federal funding to pay for the goods and/or services that are the subject matter of this bid. That Federal funding may include funds received by LFUCG under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. Expenditures using Federal funds require evidence of the contractor's compliance with Federal law. Therefore, by the signature below of an authorized company representative, you certify that the information below is understood, agreed, and correct. Any misrepresentations may result in the termination of the contract and/or prosecution under applicable Federal and State laws concerning false statements and false claims.

The bidder (hereafter "bidder," or "contractor") agrees and understands that in addition to all conditions stated within the attached bid documents, the following conditions will also apply to any Agreement entered between bidder and LFUCG, if LFUCG uses Federal funds, including but not limited to funding received by LFUCG under the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA"), toward payment of goods and/or services referenced in this bid. The bidder also agrees and understands that if there is a conflict between the terms included elsewhere in this Request for Proposal and the terms of this Amendment 1, then the terms of Amendment 1 shall control. The bidder further certifies that it can and will comply with these conditions, if this bid is accepted and an Agreement is executed:

- 1. Any Agreement executed as a result of acceptance of this bid may be governed in accordance with 2 CFR Part 200 and all other applicable Federal law and regulations and guidance issued by the U.S. Department of the Treasury.
- 2. Pursuant to 24 CFR § 85.43, any Agreement executed as a result of acceptance of this bid can be terminated if the contractor fails to comply with any term of the award. This Agreement may be terminated for convenience in accordance with 24 CFR § 85.44 upon written notice by LFUCG. Either party may terminate this Agreement with thirty (30) days written notice to the other party, in which case the Agreement shall terminate on the thirtieth day. In the event of termination, the contractor shall be entitled to that portion of total compensation due under this Agreement as the services rendered bears to the services required. However, if LFUCG suspects a breach of the terms of the Agreement and/or that the contractor is violating the terms of any applicable law governing the use of Federal funds, LFUCG may suspend the contractor's ability to receive payment by giving thirty (30) days' advance written notice. Further, either party may terminate this Agreement for cause shown with thirty (30) days written notice, which shall explain the party's cause for the termination. If the parties do not reach a settlement before the end of the 30 days, then the Agreement shall terminate on the thirtieth day. In the event of a breach, LFUCG reserves the right to pursue any and all applicable legal, equitable, and/or administrative remedies against the contractor.
- 3. The contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. The contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following:
 - (1) Employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and

- applicants for employment, notices to be provided setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
- (2) The contractor will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin.
- (3) The contractor will not discharge or in any other manner discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because such employee or applicant has inquired about, discussed, or disclosed the compensation of the employee or applicant or another employee or applicant. This provision shall not apply to instances in which an employee who has access to the compensation information of other employees or applicants as a part of such employee's essential job functions discloses the compensation of such other employees or applicants to individuals who do not otherwise have access to such information, unless such disclosure is in response to a formal complaint or charge, in furtherance of an investigation, proceeding, hearing, or action, including an investigation conducted by the employer, or is consistent with the contractor's legal duty to furnish information.
- (4) The contractor will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding a notice to be provided advising the said labor union or workers' representatives of the contractor's commitments under this section and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- (5) The contractor will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and of the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- (6) The contractor will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and by rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.
- (7) In the event of the contractor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination clauses of this contract or with any of the said rules, regulations, or orders, this contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part, and the contractor may be declared ineligible for further government contracts or federally assisted construction contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and such other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.
- (8) The contractor will include the portion of the sentence immediately preceding paragraph (1) and the provisions of paragraphs (1) through (8) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to section 204 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The contractor will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the administering agency may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance.

Provided, however, that in the event a contractor becomes involved in or is threatened with litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction by the administering agency, the contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

- 4. If fulfillment of the contract requires the contractor to employ mechanic's or laborers, the contractor further agrees that it can and will comply with the following:

- (3) Withholding for unpaid wages and liquidated damages. LFUCG shall upon its own action or upon written request of an authorized representative of the Department of Labor withhold or cause to be withheld, from any moneys payable on account of work performed by the contractor or subcontractor under any such contract or any other federal contract with the same prime contractor, or any other federally-assisted contract subject to the Contract Work Hours and Safety Standards Act, which is held by the same prime contractor, such sums as may be determined to be necessary to satisfy any liabilities of such contractor or subcontractor for unpaid wages and liquidated damages as provided in the clause set forth in paragraph (2) of this section.
- (4) Subcontracts. The contractor or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clauses set forth in paragraph (1) through (4) of this section and also a clause requiring the subcontractors to include these clauses in any lower-tier subcontracts. The prime contractor shall be responsible for compliance by any subcontractor or lower-tier subcontractor with the clauses set forth in paragraphs (1) through (4) of this section.
- 5. The contractor shall comply with all applicable standards, orders, or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 7401 et seq.
- 6. The contractor shall report each violation to LFUCG and understands and agrees that LFUCG will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to the Treasury Department and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency Regional Office.
- 7. The contractor shall include these requirements in numerical paragraphs 5 and 6 in each subcontract exceeding \$100,000 financed in whole or in part with Federal funding.
- 8. The contractor shall comply with all applicable standards, orders, or regulations issued pursuant to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. § 1251 et seq.
- 9. The contractor shall report each violation to LFUCG and understands and agrees that LFUCG will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to the Treasury Department and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency Regional Office.
- 10. The contractor shall include these requirements in numerical paragraphs 8 and 9 in each subcontract exceeding \$100,000 financed in whole or in part with Federal funds.
- 11. The contractor shall comply with all applicable standards, orders, or regulations issued pursuant to the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. § 1251 et seq.
- 12. The contractor shall report each violation to LFUCG and understands and agrees that LFUCG will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to the Treasury Department and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency regional office.
- 13. The contractor shall include these requirements in numerical paragraphs 11 and 12 in each subcontract exceeding \$100,000 financed in whole or in part with American Rescue Plan Act funds.

- 14. The contractor shall include this language in any subcontract it executes to fulfill the terms of this bid: "the sub-grantee, contractor, subcontractor, successor, transferee, and assignee shall comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, which prohibits recipients of federal financial assistance from excluding from a program or activity, denying benefits of, or otherwise discriminating against a person on the basis of race, color, or national origin (42 U.S.C. § 2000d et seq.), as implemented by the Department of the Treasury's Title VI regulations, 31 CFR Part 22, which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this contract (or agreement). - 15. Each tier certifies to the tier above that it will not and has not used federal appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a member of Congress in connection with obtaining any federal contract, grant, or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. § 1352. Each tier shall also disclose any lobbying with non-federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any federal award. Such disclosures are forwarded from tier to tier, up to the recipient. The required certification is included here:
 - a. The undersigned certifies, to the best of his or her knowledge and belief, that:
 - (1) No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the undersigned, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of an agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.
 - (2) If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement, the undersigned shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.
 - (3) The undersigned shall require that the language of this certification be included in the award documents for all subawards at all tiers (including subcontracts, subgrants, and contracts under grants, loans, and cooperative agreements) and that all subrecipients shall certify and disclose accordingly.
 - b. This certification is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was made or entered into. The Law

- Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (amended 1972) states that it is unlawful for an employer to discriminate in employment because of race, color, religion, sex, age (40-70 years) or national origin.
- Executive Order No. 11246 on Nondiscrimination under Federal contract prohibits employment discrimination by contractor and sub-contractor doing business with the Federal Government or recipients of Federal funds. This order was later amended by Executive Order No. 11375 to prohibit discrimination on the basis of sex.
- Section 503 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 states:

The Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of physical or mental handicap.

- Section 2012 of the Vietnam Era Veterans Readjustment Act of 1973 requires Affirmative Action on behalf of disabled veterans and veterans of the Vietnam Era by contractors having Federal contracts.
- Section 206(A) of Executive Order 12086, Consolidation of Contract Compliance Functions for Equal Employment Opportunity, states:

The Secretary of Labor may investigate the employment practices of any Government contractor or sub-contractor to determine whether or not the contractual provisions specified in Section 202 of this order have been violated.

The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government practices Equal Opportunity in recruiting, hiring and promoting. It is the Government's intent to affirmatively provide employment opportunities for those individuals who have previously not been allowed to enter into the mainstream of society. Because of its importance to the local Government, this policy carries the full endorsement of the Mayor, Commissioners, Directors and all supervisory personnel. In following this commitment to Equal Employment Opportunity and because the Government is the benefactor of the Federal funds, it is both against the Urban County Government policy and illegal for the Government to let contracts to companies which knowingly or unknowingly practice discrimination in their employment practices. A. GENERAL

- 1) The LFUCG request all potential contractors to make a concerted effort to include Minority-Owned (MBE), Woman-Owned (WBE), Disadvantaged (DBE) Business Enterprises and Veteran-Owned Small Businesses (VOSB) as subcontractors or suppliers in their bids.

- 2) Replacement of a Minority-Owned, Woman-Owned or Veteran-Owned subcontractor or supplier listed in the original submittal must be requested in writing and must be accompanied by documentation of Good Faith Efforts to replace the subcontractor / supplier with another MWDBE Firm; this is subject to approval by the LFUCG. (See LFUCG MWDBE Substitution Form)

- 4) The LFUCG will make every effort to notify interested MWDBE and Veteran-Owned subcontractors and suppliers of each Bid Package, including information on the scope of work, the pre-bid meeting time and location, the bid date, and all other pertinent information regarding the project.

C. DEFINITIONS

- 1) A Minority-Owned Business Enterprise (MBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by persons of African American, Hispanic, Asian, Pacific Islander, American Indian or Alaskan Native Heritage.
- 2) A Woman-Owned Business Enterprise (WBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by one or more women.

- 3) A Disadvantaged Business (DBE) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by a person(s) that are economically and socially disadvantaged.
- 4) A Veteran-Owned Small Business (VOSB) is defined as a business which is certified as being at least 51% owned, managed and controlled by a veteran and/or a service disabled veteran.
- 5) Good Faith Efforts are efforts that, given all relevant circumstances, a bidder or proposer actively and aggressively seeking to meet the goals, can reasonably be expected to make. In evaluating good faith efforts made toward achieving the goals, whether the bidder or proposer has performed the efforts outlined in the Obligations of Bidder for Good Faith Efforts outlined in this document will be considered, along with any other relevant factors.

D. OBLIGATION OF BIDDER FOR GOOD FAITH EFFORTS

- 1) The bidder shall make a Good Faith Effort to achieve the Participation Goal for MWDBE and Veteran-Owned subcontractors/suppliers. - g. Contacted organizations that work with MWDBE companies for assistance in finding certified MWBDE firms and Veteran-Owned businesses to work on this project. Those contacted and their responses should be a part of the bidder's good faith efforts documentation.
- d. Sent written notices, by certified mail, email or facsimile, to qualified, certified MWDBEs and/or Veteran-Owned businesses soliciting their participation in the contract not less than seven (7) days prior to the deadline for submission of bids to allow them to participate effectively.
- e. Followed up initial solicitations by contacting MWDBEs and Veteran-Owned Businesses to determine their level of interest.
- j. Provided the interested MWBDE firm and/or Veteran-Owned business with adequate and timely information about the plans, specifications, and requirements of the contract.
- k. Selected portions of the work to be performed by MWDBE firms and/or Veteran-Owned businesses in order to increase the likelihood of meeting the contract goals. This includes, where appropriate, breaking out contract work items into economically feasible units to facilitate MWDBE and Veteran participation, even when the prime contractor may otherwise perform these work items with its own workforce
- l. Negotiated in good faith with interested MWDBE firms and Veteran-Owned businesses not rejecting them as unqualified without sound reasons based on a thorough investigation of their capabilities. - n. Bidder has to submit sound reasons why the quotations were considered unacceptable. GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. Each Respondent shall comply with all Federal, State & Local regulations concerning this type of service or good.

The Respondent agrees to comply with all statutes, rules, and regulations governing safe and healthful working conditions, including the Occupational Health and Safety Act of 1970, 29 U.S.C. 650 et. seq., as amended, and KRS Chapter 338. The Respondent also agrees to notify the LFUCG in writing immediately upon detection of any unsafe and/or unhealthful working conditions at the job site. The Respondent agrees to indemnify, defend and hold the LFUCG harmless from all penalties, fines or other expenses arising out of the alleged violation of said laws.

- 2. Failure to submit ALL forms and information required in this RFP may be grounds for disqualification.
- 3. Addenda: All addenda and IonWave Q&A, if any, shall be considered in making the proposal, and such addenda shall be made a part of this RFP. Before submitting a proposal, it is incumbent upon each proposer to be informed as to whether any addenda have been issued, and the failure to cover in the bid any such addenda may result in disqualification of that proposal.
- 4. Proposal Reservations: LFUCG reserves the right to reject any or all proposals, to award in whole or part, and to waive minor immaterial defects in proposals. LFUCG may consider any alternative proposal that meets its basic needs.

- 7. Clarification of Submittal: LFUCG reserves the right to obtain clarification of any point in a bid or to obtain additional information from a Respondent.
- 8. Bribery Clause: By his/her signature on the bid, Respondent certifies that no employee of his/hers, any affiliate or Subcontractor, has bribed or attempted to bribe an officer or employee of the LFUCG.

- 9. Additional Information: While not necessary, the Respondent may include any product brochures, software documentation, sample reports, or other documentation that may assist LFUCG in better understanding and evaluating the Respondent's response. Additional documentation shall not serve as a substitute for other documentation which is required by this RFP to be submitted with the proposal,
- 10. Ambiguity, Conflict or other Errors in RFP: If a Respondent discovers any ambiguity, conflict, discrepancy, omission or other error in the RFP, it shall immediately notify LFUCG of such error in writing and request modification or clarification of the document if allowable by the LFUCG.
- 11. Agreement to Bid Terms: In submitting this proposal, the Respondent agrees that it has carefully examined the specifications and all provisions relating to the work to be done attached hereto and made part of this proposal. By acceptance of a Contract under this RFP, proposer states that it understands the meaning, intent and requirements of the RFP and agrees to the same. The successful Respondent shall warrant that it is familiar with and understands all provisions herein and shall warrant that it can comply with them. No additional compensation to Respondent shall be authorized for services or expenses reasonably covered under these provisions that the proposer omits from its Proposal.
- 12. Cancellation: If the services to be performed hereunder by the Respondent are not performed in an acceptable manner to the LFUCG, the LFUCG may cancel this contract for cause by providing written notice to the proposer, giving at least thirty (30) days notice of the proposed cancellation and the reasons for same. During that time period, the proposer may seek to bring the performance of services hereunder to a level that is acceptable to the LFUCG, and the LFUCG may rescind the cancellation if such action is in its best interest.

A. Termination for Cause

- 15. Authority to do Business: The Respondent must be a duly organized and authorized to do business under the laws of Kentucky. Respondent must be in good standing and have full legal capacity to provide the services specified under this Contract. The Respondent must have all necessary right and lawful authority to enter into this Contract for the full term hereof and that proper corporate or other action has been duly taken authorizing the Respondent to enter into this Contract. The Respondent will provide LFUCG with a copy of a corporate resolution authorizing this action and a letter from an attorney confirming that the proposer is authorized to do business in the State of Kentucky if requested. All proposals must

be signed by a duly authorized officer, agent or employee of the Respondent.

- 16. Governing Law: This Contract shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky. In the event of any proceedings regarding this Contract, the Parties agree that the venue shall be the Fayette County Circuit Court or the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky, Lexington Division. All parties expressly consent to personal jurisdiction and venue in such Court for the limited and sole purpose of proceedings relating to this Contract or any rights or obligations arising thereunder. Service of process may be accomplished by following the procedures prescribed by law.
- 17. Ability to Meet Obligations: Respondent affirmatively states that there are no actions, suits or proceedings of any kind pending against Respondent or, to the knowledge of the Respondent, threatened against the Respondent before or by any court, governmental body or agency or other tribunal or authority which would, if adversely determined, have a materially adverse effect on the authority or ability of Respondent to perform its obligations under this Contract, or which question the legality, validity or enforceability hereof or thereof.
- 18. Contractor understands and agrees that its employees, agents, or subcontractors are not employees of LFUCG for any purpose whatsoever. Contractor is an independent contractor at all times during the performance of the services specified.
- 19. If any term or provision of this Contract shall be found to be illegal or unenforceable, the remainder of the contract shall remain in full force and such term or provision shall be deemed stricken.
- 20. Contractor [or Vendor or Vendor's Employees] will not appropriate or make use of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government (LFUCG) name or any of its trade or service marks or property (including but not limited to any logo or seal), in any promotion, endorsement, advertisement, testimonial or similar use without the prior written consent of the government. If such consent is granted LFUCG reserves the unilateral right, in its sole discretion, to immediately terminate and revoke such use for any reason whatsoever. Contractor agrees that it shall cease and desist from any unauthorized use immediately upon being notified by LFUCG.

RISK MANAGEMENT PROVISIONS INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION

INDEMNIFICATION AND HOLD HARMLESS PROVISION

- (1) It is understood and agreed by the parties that Contractor hereby assumes the entire responsibility and liability for any and all damages to persons or property caused by or resulting from or arising out of any act or omission on the part of Contractor or its employees, agents, servants, owners, principals, licensees, assigns or subcontractors of any tier (hereinafter "CONTRACTOR") under or in connection with this agreement and/or the provision of goods or services and the performance or failure to perform any work required thereby.

SCOPE OF WORK

Location

4393 Clearwater Way, Fire Station #22

Introduction

LFUCG is soliciting proposals from qualified solar PV providers to design and install a roof-mounted solar photovoltaic system at Fire Station #22. Respondents shall have demonstrated experience designing, planning, permitting and constructing complete solar electric systems in the jurisdiction of the local utility provider.

An award under this RFP will be made to the respondent with the overall best value proposal, not necessarily the lowest price. Proposals will be evaluated and scored based on the evaluation criteria defined herein.

System Requirements

Photovoltaic panels shall be roof mounted on the south and east facing surfaces. Total capacity of the system shall be no less than 20 kW-dc and not exceed 23 kW-dc. Reference **Figure 01** – **Basis of Design**.

The inverter(s), disconnect and combiner panel (if applicable) shall be installed on the east wall. Reference **Figure 01**.

All power generation and transmission equipment shall be UL listed for its designed use. Construction must comply with current adopted building codes, which includes: International Building Code, National Electric Code, and National Fire Code.

The system, including its interconnection point, shall not impact operation of the emergency generator.

Modules shall be UL1703 or UL61730 listed with a product warranty of at least 12 years and a performance warranty of no less than 82% after 25 years.

Inverters shall be UL1741 listed with a product warranty of at least 10 years and a weighted efficiency of 96% or higher.

The proposed model numbers for modules and inverters shall be listed by the California Energy Commission (CEC). List are available at the CEC website: https://www.energy.ca.gov/programs-and-topics/programs/solar-equipment-lists

The system shall include a Web-based monitoring interface to display solar performance information. At a minimum, performance data of each module string shall be available for download in increments no greater than one hour.

Exterior conduit shall be liquid tight. Flexible conduit lengths shall not exceed 24 inches.

Contractor Requirements

The contractor is responsible for the assessment of the building's structural integrity, roof condition and shading limitations. Prior to installation, the contractor shall provide a letter from a structural engineer with Kentucky Professional Engineer stamp, verifying the integrity of the existing facility to handle the additional loads of proposed PV system.

Prior to installation, the Contractor shall provide dimensioned drawings and technical specifications of the proposed system to establish the physical layout, distributed load on roof, electrical wire and panel capacity, and the inverter and disconnect locations.

The Contractor is responsible for verifying any information obtained from Owner's construction drawings.

The Contractor is responsible for all permitting related to the design and installation of the system.

The Contractor is responsible for establishing communication between the inverter(s) and the internet via a cellular service agreement for a minimum of three (3) years.

Under no circumstances shall the Contractor disable electrical service to the building or secondary circuits within the building without authorization from LFUCG.

Under no circumstances shall the Contractor obstruct access to the facility or driveways.

The Contractor is responsible for documenting the condition of the roof and, specifically, any damages that exist prior to construction.

The Contractor is responsible for the construction safety plan to include, at a minimum, all applicable OSHA workplace safety and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) requirements.

Performance Verification: The Contractor shall review generation data and provide a report to LFUCG to demonstrate that system output is meeting expectations. Two reports are required: (1) after 30 days and (2) prior to the expiration of workmanship warranty.

Workmanship warranty: the Contractor shall perform an on-site inspection prior to the expiration of workmanship warranty, if requested by the Owner.

The Contractor shall achieve substantial completion within 75 calendar days of Notice to Proceed. Substantial Completion is defined as LFUCG having beneficial use of the photovoltaic system.

Owner Guidance

For system sizing, the desired number of modules for each roof are shown in **Figure 01**, based on a nominal output of either 410 watts or 540 watts.

Modules should lay in a plane parallel to the roof. A rectangular arrangement is preferred.

Conduit runs should be straight with minimal couplings. Runs around an object like a gutter are not acceptable.

Electrical service is provided by Kentucky Utilities under the Three-Phase General Service Rate (RC113). 15-minute interval data is available in a *.csv file.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

THIS IS AN AGREEMENT made as of April 8th, 2024 between the LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT (OWNER) and CALHOUN CONSTRUCTION SERVICES, INC. (PROFESSIONAL). OWNER intends to proceed with a roof-mounted solar photovoltaic systems in Lexington, Kentucky as described in the attached Request for Proposal document. The services are to include design and installation of solar photovoltaic systems for the city as described in the OWNER's Request for Proposal No. 17-2024. The services are hereinafter referred to as the Project.

OWNER and **PROFESSIONAL** in consideration of their mutual covenants herein agree in respect of the performance of design and installation services by **PROFESSIONAL** and the payment for those services by **OWNER** as set forth below.

PROFESSIONAL was selected by **OWNER** based upon its response to the Request for Proposal No. 17-2024.

PROFESSIONAL shall provide design and installation of solar photovoltaic systems for **OWNER** in all phases of the Project to which this Agreement applies, serve as **OWNER'S** representative for the Project as set forth below and shall give professional consultation and advice to **OWNER** during the performance of services hereunder.

SECTION 1 - BASIC SERVICES OF PROFESSIONAL

PROFESSIONAL shall perform all services as hereinafter stated which include customary planning and analysis incidental thereto.

The following documents are incorporated by reference herein as if fully stated and are attached hereto as exhibits:

RFP No. 17-2024 (Exhibit "A") **PROFESSIONAL'S** proposal notarized 4/2/2024 (Exhibit "B"), 133 pages

To the extent there is conflict among their provisions, the provisions of this Agreement shall take precedence, followed by the provisions of Request for Proposal No. 17-2024 (Exhibit "A"), followed by the provisions of Exhibit "B".

In addition to the services provided in Exhibits "A" and "B", the following services shall also be included:

1. PROFESSIONAL shall provide detailed drawings to document the electrical interconnection for review by OWNER prior to commencement of installation. At a minimum, drawings are to include AC/DC disconnect locations, panel breaker connection points, over current protection devices, and backfeed capacity calculations; and

After written authorization to proceed with the Project, PROFESSIONAL shall:

- 1. Notify the **OWNER** in writing of its authorized representative who shall act as Project Manager and liaison representative between the **PROFESSIONAL** and the **OWNER**.
- 2. Design and install a roof-mounted solar photovoltaic system as proposed in Exhibit "B" and subject to the "System Requirements" and "Contractor Requirements" as defined in Exhibit "A", "Scope of Work".

This Agreement, together with the Exhibits and schedules identified above constitutes the entire Agreement between **OWNER** and **PROFESSIONAL** and supersedes all prior written or oral understandings. This Agreement and said Exhibits and schedules may only be amended, supplemented, modified, or canceled by a duly executed written instrument.

The General Provisions of RFP No. 17-2024 are incorporated herein by reference as if fully stated.

SECTION 2 - ADDITIONAL SERVICES BY PROFESSIONAL

- 2.1. The OWNER may desire to have the PROFESSIONAL perform work or render services in connection with this Project other than those services provided herein. Such work shall be considered as "Additional Services", subject to a change order, supplemental to this Agreement, setting forth the character and scope thereof and the compensation therefore. Work under such change order shall not proceed until the OWNER gives written authorization. Should the OWNER find it desirable to have previously satisfactorily completed and accepted plans or parts thereof revised, the PROFESSIONAL shall make such revisions as directed, in writing, by the OWNER. This work shall be considered as "Additional Services" and shall be paid as such.
- **2.2.** All "Additional Services" is subject to prior written authorization of **OWNER** and necessary appropriations made by the Urban County Council.

SECTION 3 - OWNER'S RESPONSIBILITIES

OWNER shall:

- **3.1.** Provide criteria and information as to **OWNER'S** requirements for the Project, including design objectives and constraints, space, capacity and performance requirements, flexibility and expandability, and any budgetary limitations.
- **3.2.** Assist **PROFESSIONAL** by placing at its disposal available information pertinent to the Project.
- 3.3. Examine all studies, reports, sketches, drawings, specifications, proposals and other documents presented by **PROFESSIONAL**, and render in writing decisions

- pertaining thereto within a reasonable time so as not to delay the services of **PROFESSIONAL**.
- 3.4. Designate in writing a person to act as **OWNER'S** representative with respect to the services to be rendered under this Agreement. Such person shall have complete authority to transmit instructions, receive information, interpret and define **OWNER'S** policies and decisions with respect to materials, equipment, elements and systems pertinent to **PROFESSIONAL'S** services.
- 3.5. Give written notice to **PROFESSIONAL** whenever **OWNER** observes or otherwise becomes aware of any development that affects the scope or timing of **PROFESSIONAL'S** services, or any defect in the work of Contractor(s).
- **3.6.** Furnish or direct **PROFESSIONAL** to provide, necessary Additional Services as stipulated in Section Two (2) of this Agreement or other services as required.

SECTION 4 - PERIOD OF SERVICES

- **4.1.** Time is of the essence. See Exhibit "A" (attached) pertaining to substantial completion of services.
- 4.2. The provisions of this Section Four (4) and the various rates of compensation for **PROFESSIONAL'S** services provided for elsewhere in this Agreement have been agreed to in anticipation of the orderly and continuous progress of the Project through completion.
- 4.3 If delays result by reason of acts of the **OWNER** or approving agencies or other causes, which are beyond the control of the **PROFESSIONAL**, an extension of time for such delay will be considered. If delays occur, the **PROFESSIONAL** shall within 30 days from the date of the delay apply in writing to the **OWNER** for an extension of time for such reasonable period as may be mutually agreed upon between the parties, and if approved, the Project schedule shall be revised to reflect the extension. Such extension of time to the completion date shall in no way be construed to operate as a waiver on the part of the **OWNER** of any of its rights in the Agreement. Section 6.5, under DISPUTES, of this Agreement, shall apply in the event the parties cannot mutually agree upon an extension of time.

In the event that the overall delay resulting from the above described causes is sufficient to prevent complete performance of the Agreement within six (6) months of the time specified therein, the Agreement fee or fees shall be subject to reconsideration and possible adjustment. Section 6.5 of this Agreement shall apply in the event the parties cannot mutually agree upon an adjustment of fee.

4.4. If delays result solely by reason of act of the **PROFESSIONAL**, the **PROFESSIONAL** must immediately notify the **OWNER** in the event of such delay, and provide the **OWNER** a written action plan within five (5) business days on how

it will reasonably attempt to resolve the delay. If the parties cannot mutually agree to an extension of time or an adjustment, Section 6.5 of this Agreement shall apply. If the delay would prevent complete performance of the project within six (6) months of the time specified herein, **OWNER** shall have the option of canceling the project or otherwise adjusting the scope of service or work and any related fees.

SECTION 5 - PAYMENTS TO PROFESSIONAL

5.1 Methods of Payment for Services of PROFESSIONAL

5.1.1 For Basic Services.

All Lump Sum Pricing shall include all direct labor and supervision necessary to complete the item in a manner that meets or exceeds the **OWNER'S** satisfaction. It shall also include the labor payroll costs, overhead (such as unemployment taxes, general liability insurance, rent, utilities, phones, supplies, administrative salaries, F.I.C.A. sick and vacations, etc. disposal fees tool allowance, equipment, materials, profit and all other costs used on the job). The negotiated cost of services is established in Exhibit "B" per "Price Proposal Form", page 55 of 133.

5.2. Times of Payment.

5.2.1. PROFESSIONAL shall submit a schedule of values subject to approval by the **OWNER** prior to starting work. The approved schedule of values will be the basis for monthly statements for Basic Services and Additional Services rendered. The Statements will be based upon **PROFESSIONAL'S** estimate of the proportion of the total services actually completed at the time of billing and are subject to approval by the **OWNER**. **OWNER** shall pay **PROFESSIONAL'S** monthly statements within thirty (30) days of receipt.

5.3. Other Provisions Concerning Payments.

- **5.3.1.** In the event the Agreement is terminated by the **OWNER** without fault on the part of the **PROFESSIONAL**, the **PROFESSIONAL** shall be paid for the work performed or services rendered in an amount bearing the same ratio to the total Agreement fee as the amount of work completed or partially completed and delivered to the **OWNER** is to the total amount of work provided for herein, as determined by mutual agreement between the **OWNER** and the **PROFESSIONAL**.
- **5.3.2.** In the event the services of the **PROFESSIONAL** are terminated by the **OWNER** for fault on the part of the **PROFESSIONAL**, the **PROFESSIONAL** shall be paid reasonable value of the work performed or services rendered and delivered, and the amount to be paid shall be determined by the **OWNER**.
- **5.3.3.** In the event the **PROFESSIONAL** shall terminate the Agreement because of gross delays caused by the **OWNER**, the **PROFESSIONAL** shall be paid as set forth in Section 5.3.1. above.

SECTION 6 – ADDITIONAL GENERAL CONSIDERATIONS

6.1. Termination

- **6.1.1. PROFESSIONAL** may only terminate this Agreement due to **OWNER'S** material breach of the terms hereof which breach causes **PROFESSIONAL** to be unable to perform its duties and responsibilities under this Agreement, and only upon ten (10) days written notice to **OWNER**, and provided **OWNER** fails to cure such default within the ten (10) day period.
- **6.1.2.** The **OWNER** reserves the right to terminate the Agreement for any reason at any time upon seven (7) days written notice to the **PROFESSIONAL**.

6.2. Ownership and Reuse of Documents.

All documents, including Drawings and Specifications, prepared by the **PROFESSIONAL** pursuant to this Agreement shall be delivered to and become the property of the **OWNER**. The **OWNER** shall have the right to reuse same without restriction or limitation, but without liability or legal exposure to **PROFESSIONAL**.

6.3. Legal Responsibilities and Legal Relations.

- **6.3.1.** The **PROFESSIONAL** shall familiarize itself with and shall at all times comply with all federal, state and local laws, ordinances, and regulations which in any manner affect the services of this Agreement.
- **6.3.2.** In performing the services hereunder, the **PROFESSIONAL** and its **PROFESSIONALS**, employees, agents and representatives shall not be deemed or construed to be employees of **OWNER** in any manner whatsoever. Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, the **PROFESSIONAL** shall be acting as an independent contractor. The **PROFESSIONAL** shall not hold itself out as, nor claim to be, an officer or employee of **OWNER** by reason hereof and shall not make any claim, demand or application to or for any right or privilege applicable to an officer or employee of **OWNER**. The **PROFESSIONAL** shall be solely responsible for any claims for wages or compensation by **PROFESSIONAL'S** employees, agents and representatives, including **PROFESSIONALS**, and shall save and hold **OWNER** harmless therefrom.
- **6.3.3.** The parties hereto agree that causes of actions between the parties shall be governed by applicable provisions of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, that venue of any legal action shall be a court of appropriate jurisdiction in Fayette County, Kentucky, and that Kentucky law shall apply with respect to the interpretation of any provision of this Agreement.

6.4. Successors and Assigns.

6.4.1. PROFESSIONAL binds itself and its partners, successors, executors, administrators, assigns and legal representatives to this Agreement in respect to all covenants, agreements and obligations of this Agreement. **PROFESSIONAL** shall not assign any interest, obligation or benefit in this Agreement. **PROFESSIONAL**

shall not assign any interest, obligation or benefit in this Agreement or transfer any interest in the same, whether by assignment or novation, without prior written consent of **OWNER**.

6.4.2. The PROFESSIONAL shall not subcontract more than fifty percent (50%) of the work, based upon dollar value, to be provided under this Agreement. The PROFESSIONAL shall obtain written approval prior to subletting or assigning any services contained in this Agreement, and consent to sublet or assign any part of this Agreement shall not be construed to relieve the PROFESSIONAL of any responsibility for compliance with the provisions of this Agreement.

6.4.3. Nothing herein shall be construed to give any rights or benefits hereunder to anyone other than **OWNER** and **PROFESSIONAL**.

6.5. Disputes.

Except as otherwise provided in this Agreement, any dispute concerning the amount of payment due the **PROFESSIONAL** or any dispute concerning any question of fact of any act to be performed under this Agreement, which is not disposed of by agreement between the Urban County Division of Central Purchasing and the **PROFESSIONAL**, shall be submitted to the Commissioner, Department of General Services, Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government for review. The decision of the Commissioner as to the determination of such dispute shall be final and conclusive unless determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to have been fraudulent, capricious, arbitrary or so grossly erroneous as necessarily to imply bad faith. Pending a final decision of a dispute hereunder, the **PROFESSIONAL** shall proceed diligently with the performance of the Agreement in accordance with the directions of the **OWNER**.

6.6. Accuracy of PROFESSIONAL'S Work.

The **PROFESSIONAL** shall be required to perform this Agreement in accordance with the degree of ordinary and reasonable skill and care usually exercised by solar industry professionals prevailing at the time, place and under similar conditions as the services hereunder are rendered.

The **PROFESSIONAL** shall be responsible for the accuracy of all work, even though Drawings and Specifications have been accepted by the **OWNER**, and shall make all revisions or corrections resulting from errors and/or omissions on the part of the **PROFESSIONAL**, without additional compensation. By submission of reports, calculations and Drawings and Specifications to the **OWNER**, the **PROFESSIONAL** has made a statement that, to the best of its belief and knowledge, the information is accurate. Failure on the part of **PROFESSIONAL** to provide the expected level of accuracy may be grounds for the **OWNER** to terminate this Agreement.

6.7. Security Clause.

The **PROFESSIONAL** certifies that it shall not at any time release or divulge any information concerning the services covered by this Agreement to any person or any public

or private organization except the **OWNER** without prior approval of the **OWNER** unless required by law.

6.8. Access to Records.

The PROFESSIONAL and its sub-PROFESSIONALS shall maintain all books, documents, papers, and accounting records relating to this service agreement, and make such materials available at their respective offices at all reasonable times during the contract period and for three (3) years from the date of final payment under the contract for inspection by the OWNER, and copies thereof shall be furnished if requested. Failure to maintain such records for three (3) years after the date of final payment may be grounds for the OWNER to disqualify the PROFESSIONAL from consideration for future PROFESSIONAL service agreements.

6.9. Required Risk Management Provisions.

The Risk Management Provisions of RFP No. 17-2024 are incorporated herein by reference as if fully stated. Copies of the required Certificates of Insurance shall be provided to **OWNER** as required therein.

SECTION 7 - EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY

During the performance of this service agreement, the PROFESSIONAL agrees as follows:

- 7.1. The PROFESSIONAL will not discriminate against any employee or application for employment because of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age or handicap. The PROFESSIONAL will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age or handicap. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: employment upgrading, demotion or transfer, recruitment or recruitment advertising, layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeships. The PROFESSIONAL agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided setting forth the provisions of this non-discrimination clause.
- 7.2 The PROFESSIONAL will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the PROFESSIONAL, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age (between forty and seventy), or handicap.

SECTION 8 - SPECIAL PROVISIONS

8.1. This Agreement is subject to the following provisions.

- 8.1.2. Pursuant to subparagraph 3.4 of this Agreement, OWNER'S representative is authorized to monitor, direct and review the performance of work of the PROFESSIONAL. Documents, data, reports and all matters associated with carrying out this Agreement shall be addressed to the OWNER'S representative or their designee. Questions by the PROFESSIONAL regarding interpretations of the terms, provisions and requirements under this Agreement shall be addressed to the OWNER'S representative or their designee. The PROFESSIONAL shall look only to the OWNER'S representative or their designee for direction in its performance under this Agreement; no other direction shall be binding upon OWNER. OWNER shall respond to written requests by PROFESSIONAL within thirty (30) days.
- 8.2. NO THIRD PARTY RIGHTS. This agreement does not create a contractual relationship with or right of action in favor of a third party against either OWNER or PROFESSIONAL.
- **8.3.** UNENFORCEABLE TERMS/SURVIVABILITY. If any term or provision of this Agreement shall be found to be illegal or unenforceable, this Agreement shall remain in full force and such term or provision shall be deemed stricken. The provisions of Section 6 of this Agreement shall survive its termination.
- **8.4. NON-WAIVER.** The failure of either party to enforce any right reserved to it in this Agreement shall not be a waiver of any such right to which the party is entitled.
