## Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting Lexington, Kentucky March 3, 2022

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Mr. Moloney spoke about the recent passing of Margaret Long and her many accomplishments, noting she would be missed. Mayor Gorton concurred.

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Mr. J. Brown recognized the recent promotion of Police Sgt. Brandon Muravchick and his work as a Neighborhood Resource Officer.

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Ms. Reynolds spoke of her first encounter meeting the late Margaret Long and shared regret that her intent to honor Ms. Long with a proclamation could no longer move forward in light of her recent departure, but noted an alternative would be explored.

She also offered her gratitude to all those who attended the Peace Vigil held Wednesday, March 2 at the Robert F. Stephens Courthouse Plaza. Organized by the Mayor's International Affairs Advisory Commission, the vigil expressed support for the people of Ukraine as they defend their nation against the current Russian invasion. Ms. Reynolds thanked the Mayor and her fellow Council Members for their attendance and

shared some of the personal experiences of those who have been directly affected by the violence. She urged those in the community to make donations to the Ukrainian Pentecostal Church, Hope for Ukraine, Christian Mission Ebenezer, or New Heights Missions, in order to get aid those humanitarian organizations already on the ground in Ukraine.

Mayor Gorton thanked Ms. Reynolds for organizing the event, which was attended by approximately 350 people.

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Mayor Gorton gave an update on the Commission for Racial Justice and Equality noting that the Commission held their first meeting with the newly appointed members March 2, 2022 at 3:00 p.m.
