The recommended Insurance Policies represent **\$1,255,339.83** in premiums for FY 2016. This is an increase of \$60,478.51. (5%) compared to FY 2015 premiums. The majority of the increases are due to the added Aviation Hull Damage (\$21,459.00); Workers' Compensation (\$25,850.00); and General Liability (\$13,051.00) as noted in **Table I.**
