Motion passed by a vote of 14-1 (all CMs except Moloney voted yes).

Motion by Plomin to place on the docket for the September 12, 2019 Council meeting, a resolution authorizing and directing the Division of Traffic Engineering, pursuant to Section 18-46 of the Code of Ordinances, to designate Forest Lake Drive and Hobbs Way as being prohibited to through trucks, and authorizing and directing the Division of Traffic Engineering to install proper and appropriate signs in accordance with the designation.
