**SUBJECT: Grant application for submission to the Kentucky Commercial Mobile
Radio Service (CMRS) Board**

Request:

Request Council Authorization to submit a grant application to the Kentucky Commercial Mobile Radio Services (CMRS) Board in the amount of \$29,920.02 for the purpose of acquiring hardware, software and licenses for Automatic Location Information and Database Management Servers (a/k/a ALI-DBMS) for use in E911. Match funds are required in the amount of \$5,000.

Why are you requesting?

Funds are needed to replace end of life servers, update software and required licenses to support 911 Datamaster ALI/DMBS software. ALI/DBMS servers, software and licenses are used by managed services (A.K. Associates, Inc.) to maintain the ALI databases for 25 counties participating in the Central Kentucky 911 Network. Having agencies use Lexington's resources, versus individual ownership of similar servers and licenses by each service area, is a cost effective approach in accordance with the state's NG911 plan.

What is the cost in this budget year and future budget years?

The fiscal impact for Lexington 911 is expected to be \$29,920.02 in Fiscal Year 2018.

Are the funds budgeted: Funds are not yet budgeted. If CMRS board approves the grant request, a budget amendment will be initiated.
