**SUBJECT: Extension of Performance Period for Chemical Stockpile Emergency
Preparedness Programs for Fiscal Years 2017 & 2018**

Request: Council authorization to execute modifications to agreements with the Kentucky Department of Military Affairs, Division of Emergency Management for federal funds under the Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP) for FY 2017 and 2018 extending the performance period through September 30, 2022.

Why are you requesting? On September 14, 2017 (Resolution 556-2017) Council accepted award of federal funds from the Kentucky Department of Military Affairs, Division of Emergency Management for the continuation of the Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP) for Fiscal Year 2017. On October 25, 2018 (Resolution 631-2018) Council approved extension to September 30, 2019 and on October 24, 2019 (Resolution 589-2019) extension for FY2017 and FY2018 to September 30, 2020 and September 24, 2020 (Resolution 439-2020) FY2018 extension to September 30, 2021. On December 5, 2019 (Resolution 710-2019).

The Kentucky Department of Military Affairs, Division of Emergency Management has offered the LFUCG modifications to these agreements extending the performance period for the Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP) for Fiscal Year 2017 and 2018 through September 30, 2022 to expense remaining grant funds.

What is the cost in this budget year and future budget years? No additional cost in this budget year or in future budget years.
