3. Question: L201 "Where poured in Place surfacing meets mulch, contractor to turn down surfacing" is there going to be all new mulch in white areas butting up to these areas?
Response: Contractor shall remove and stockpile existing engineered wood safety surface in area to receive poured in place. Once Poured in Place is installed, stockpiled engineered wood safety surface shall be placed back in the playground around the new Poured in Place.
4. Question: Please provide the fall heights for PIP play surface.

5. Question: L200 callout of #3 alternate of deducting sidewalk adjacent to outdoor classroom, how much of sidewalk is to be deducted? Please provide limits of sidewalk that is to be deducted.
 Response: Portion of sidewalk to be removed in Alternate #3 is called out in sheet L200. Exhibit L200.01 provides clarification by hatching the portion of sidewalk to be removed.

6. Question: L100 shows the Concrete paving south of the ramp to stay, but L200 shows there be new concrete pavement south of the ramp. Please clarify if the this concrete is to be removed and replaced or if it is to stay in place.
 Response: Portion of sidewalk around ramp to be removed for utility work. See exhibit L100.01 for areas of sidewalk anticipated to be removed and replaced.

7. Question: The finish schedule calls for Restrooms 100, 101 & 102 to receive wall tile. I only see Restrooms 100 & 102 on the plans. Can you clarify this please? Thank you!
 Response: Previous restroom 101 has been removed. Restroom 100, Restroom 101 and Mech/Elec. 102 have been re-numbered and are the only remaining rooms. A new floor plan and finish schedule have been revised and issued in this addendum.

8. Question: Please give some clarification on the alternates. The alternates noted on the plans do not match the alternates listed on the Bid Form / Schedule of Values. EX: Sheet L201 notes ALT #1 to be an ADD for site furnishings, while the Bid Form notes ALT #1 to be a DEDUCT for the PIP at the Outdoor Classroom.
 Response: Additive Bid Alternates listed on L201 as #1 and #2 should be #11 and #12, respectively. Exhibit L201.01 shows the correct alternate numbers. Issued specification 01 2300 Alternates with revisions tracked.

1. Question: The Door Elevation appears to show an embossed 2 panel design, but the spec calls for a Flush Panel Design. Steel stiffened doors are not available with the 2-panel design. Do they want Flush Steel Stiffened doors? Do they want Styrene Core 2-panel doors?
Response: Specification 081113 – Hollow Metal Doors and Frames has been revised to reflect the intended two panel steel door design. Please refer to attached specification for further information.
2. Refer to Sheet E200:
 - A. For power to mechanical room door security keypad, provide 120V power from circuit A-5 to the door hardware contractor's low-voltage power supply/transformer. Field coordinate exact connection locations and requirements.



- B. For the two restroom doors that have electronic door hardware, provide a 120V connection from circuit A-7 to the Securitron power supply cabinet. All low-voltage cabling and connections from the cabinet to the electronic door hardware to be by the door hardware contractor. Field coordinate exact mounting location of cabinet.







If the unit price and the item total are illegible or are omitted, the bid may be determined nonresponsive. If a lump sum total price is illegible or is omitted, the bid may be determined nonresponsive.

For a unit price based bid, the sum of the item totals is the bid amount the Division uses for bid comparison.

Deduct alternates may be accepted in order until acceptable budget is reached. At that time, additive alternates may be chosen in order.

- (1) *For the length of the contract, each contractor shall hire minorities from other sources within the drawing area, should the union with which he has collective bargaining agreements be unwilling to supply sufficient minorities to satisfy the agreed upon goals and timetable.*

Any provision of KRS 45.560 to 45.640 notwithstanding, no contractor shall be required to terminate an existing employee upon proof that that employee was employed prior to the date of the contract.

KRS 45.640 Minimum skills

Nothing in KRS 45.560 to 45.640 shall require a contractor to hire anyone who fails to demonstrate the minimum skills required to perform a particular job.

It is recommended that all of the provisions quoted above to be included as special conditions in each contract. In the case of a contract exceeding \$250,000, the contractor is required to furnish evidence that his work-force in Kentucky is representative of the available work-force in the area from which he draws employees, or to supply an Affirmative Action plan which will achieve such representation during the life of the contract.

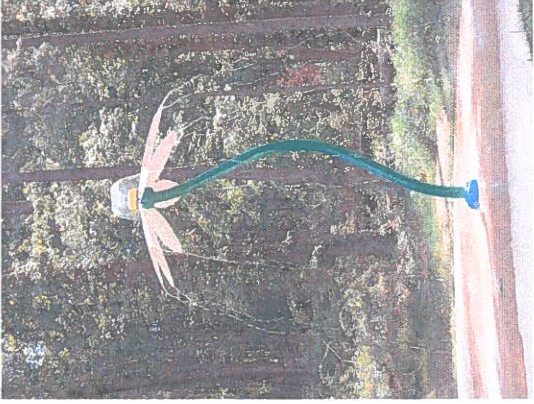
