- 3.8 Contractors will be required to take photos of the job site before and after the clean-up. Photos need to be taken from the same position. Photos shall be submitted to Code Enforcement with all other paperwork.
- 3.9 Contractors shall be required to start the abatement process within 48 hours of being awarded the contract and complete within 72 hours under normal circumstances. If the work has not begun within 48 hours the inspector may award the job to the next most qualified quote. If the contractor cannot start the abatement and finish within the above time frames they shall contact the inspector that awarded the contract immediately.
- 3.10 The quality of the work performed shall be of turf quality.

4.0 DELIVERY

No requirements for delivery of services are established herein other than the response time specified in Section 3.9 above.

5.0 INSPECTION

Code Enforcement will inspect prospective contractors to determine if they have the ability to do the work. For example: determine what equipment and how many people are available to do the work.



- 6.2 For Nuisance Abatement Projects, the Division of Code Enforcement may request written quotes as to the:
 - A. Cost of Mowing
 - B. Mowing and Cleanup Services
 - C. Cleanup Services only

The quotes should clearly indicate total cost for abating the nuisance, including time to take debris to a dump or recycling center.

NOTE: For all LFUCG projects, any fill, trash, construction demolition debris, yard waste, dirt or debris of any kind that is removed from the project site must be disposed of in accordance with local, state, and federal regulations. The disposal site or facility must be approved in advance by the LFUCG and disposal documentation is required. The Contractor will be responsible for payment of any fines associated with improper disposal of material removed from the project site. Contractor will be required to submit copies of the dump and recycling invoices for payment.

- Upon completion of the job, the contractor shall submit an invoice showing the address, rates charged and total hours, date of actual clean up. To be included are: dump tickets, dated before and after pictures. Contractor is responsible for getting the invoice back to Code Enforcement no later than 72 hours after completion of work. Invoices shall be submitted electronically.
- 6.4 Failure to respond to Code Enforcement's request for quotes can result in disciplinary action.
- 6.5 Failure to complete an abatement and not notifying the inspector can lead to removal from the Contractors list.

6.6 Contractors shall have in their possession the paperwork from Code Enforcement that authorizes the abatement.

EQUAL OPPORTUNITY AGREEMENT

The Law

- Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (amended 1972) states that it is unlawful for an employer to discriminate in employment because of race, color, religion, sex, age (40-70 years) or national origin.

- Section 2012 of the Vietnam Era Veterans Readjustment Act of 1973 requires Affirmative Action on behalf of disabled veterans and veterans of the Vietnam Era by contractors having Federal contracts.
- Section 206(A) of Executive Order 12086, Consolidation of Contract Compliance Functions for Equal Employment Opportunity, states:

The Secretary of Labor may investigate the employment practices of any Government contractor or sub-contractor to determine whether or not the contractual provisions specified in Section 202 of this order have been violated.

The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government practices Equal Opportunity in recruiting, hiring and promoting. It is the Government's intent to affirmatively provide employment opportunities for those individuals who have previously not been allowed to enter into the mainstream of society. Because of its importance to the local Government, this policy carries the full endorsement of the Mayor, Commissioners, Directors and all supervisory personnel. In following this commitment to Equal Employment Opportunity and because the Government is the benefactor of the Federal funds, it is both against the Urban County Government policy and illegal for the Government to let contracts to companies which knowingly or unknowingly practice discrimination in their employment practices. Violation of the above mentioned ordinances may cause a contract to be canceled and the contractors may be declared ineligible for future consideration.
