

WHAT ARE COMPLETE STREETS?

Complete Streets are safe and comfortable for everyone - including pedestrians, bicyclists, transit riders and drivers.

They consider all people - whether they are younger, older, have a disability, cannot drive, or chose not to drive.





LEXINGTON'S POLICY


In December 2022, LFUCG adopted a Complete Streets Policy to make Lexington's transportation system safe, affordable, accessible, and dependable for everyone.

- A Complete Streets Advisory Committee was formed to guide the creation of an Action Plan by the end of 2023.
- Emphasis on stakeholder and community input in plan development.
- The Policy states we will report annually on the status of tasks in the Action Plan, and we will report the performance metrics every other year.



LEXINGTON'S ACTION PLAN

- The plan's primary goal is to ensure we use every opportunity available to us to plan, design, build and maintain our streets with the safety and comfort of all people in mind.
- The plan was envisioned as a to-do list to help LFUCG achieve Complete Streets and develop a timeline for completing those actions.
- This plan describes high-priority initiatives we need to accomplish in the coming 3 years



HERALD LEADER

38 people died on Lexington streets in 2022.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- Over 1,200 surveys completed
- Paper copies disseminated to all Lexington Public Library branches & online 10 minute survey
- Promotion of survey on all major City social media accounts, WKYT, Herald-Leader, CivicLex, among others
- Survey translated into French and Spanish by Global Lex





WHAT WE HEARD:

Common themes were heard from community stakeholders, subject matter experts, and the community-at-large that guided the development of the Action Plan

- Be Visionary & go beyond minimum standards
- Complete the Network throughout the community
- Prioritize safety, access, & equity projects as first action items
- Improve accessible walkways and clear signage for improved navigation
- Enhance the transit experience via shade, lighting, benches, barriers, and more
- Integrate sustainable practices into our roadway infrastructure projects
- Be Transparent throughout implementation, open design processes, and project prioritization
- Sustained investment is crucial for lasting change. Allocate Resources for staff, capital, maintenance, and education



ACTION PLAN TASKS & TIMELINE

- Plan tasks are divided into four categories (39 total tasks):
 - Plan, Prioritize, & Measure Progress
 - Design & Construction
 - Operations & Maintenance
 - Safety
- Each task description includes:
 - Intent & desired outcome
 - Deliverable and target completion date
 - Lead Division and supporting Divisions
 - Lead will also collaborate with internal and external stakeholders & experts
- The plan is intended to be dynamic with annual progress reports that include any recommended adjustments / additions to deliverables or timelines
