General Overview:

- What is the International Property Maintenance Code?
 - Published by the International Code Council
 - "Industry Standards"
 - Modifiable to fit each city/community
 - Used as a guideline in all 50 states.
 - Updated every 2-3 years (1998)—Next in 2018
 - Our update: both delayed and intensive (library)
 - Proposed changes are based on past issues, community needs, uniformity in government operations and requests from Council; many are administrative in nature



Chapter 12-1 Property Maintenance Code:

12-1 (a): Officially changes operations to the 2015 IPMC

12-1 (b): Is a list of sections of the 2015 IPMC that will not be adopted (Hearings and Nuisance)

102.3 and 201.3: Places our requirements with pre-existing state law and local ordinances (uniformity with others)

<u>106.4.1:</u> Citations, places greater value on the number and scope of housing violations, and will assist in addressing abandoned and blighted property in a more timely manner

107.6: Transfer of Ownership



Chapter 12-1 Property Maintenance Code (Continued):

108.2.1: Authority that was in place, but is more clearly defined

108.5.1: Occupying a Condemned Structure

304.15: Exterior doors--Rental property

901.1 to 906.1: Removes the Vacant Property Licensing



Chapter 12-2 and 12-5 Nuisances:

12-2 (a) and 12-2(c) (3): Definitions

12-2(c) (1): Automobiles

12-2(c) (4) (a): Expands noxious weeds addressed

12-2(c) (4) (b): Decreases allowable grass/weed height to 10"

12-2(c) (4) (d): Addresses vegetation that collects trash....



Chapter 12-2 and 12-5 Nuisances Continued):

12-2(c) (5): Better defines equipment and structures that are in violation

12-2(c) (6): Better addresses sidewalk obstructions

12-5(b): Increases repeat violation timespan from 12 months to 24.

12-5(c): Increases maximum penalty (without special circumstances) to \$1,500
