## Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting Lexington, Kentucky August 28, 2025

The Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Kentucky convened in regular session on August 28, 2025 at 6:00 p.m. Present were Mayor Gorton in the chair presiding, and the following members of the Council: Ellinger, Elliott Baxter, Hale, Higgins-Hord, LeGris, Lynch, Morton, Reynolds, Sevigny, Sheehan, Wu, Beasley, Boone, Brown, and Curtis.

The reading of the Minutes of the previous meeting was waived.

Resolutions No. 365-2025 through 374-2025, inclusive, were published and ordered to record.

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The Invocation was given by Councilmember Hale.

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Upon motion by Ms. Elliott Baxter, seconded by Ms. Curtis, and approved by unanimous vote, the Minutes of the August 14, 2025 Council Meeting were approved.

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Mayor Gorton asked Taylor Steele, architecture teacher at Lafayette High School to join her at the podium, along with the students of the Architectural Design Team and Mr. Sevigny, and read a Proclamation declaring August 28, 2025 as Lafayette High School Architectural Design Team Day in Lexington.

Mayor Gorton shared that the team recently made headlines by winning first place at this year's National Technology Student Association conference in Nashville, TN. She congratulated the team and Mr. Steele on their accomplishments.

Mr. Steele thanked the Mayor and Council for their recognition and spoke of the accumulative hours spent on projects, commending the students on their perseverance and determination.

Mr. Sevigny congratulated the team on their recent victory, lauding Lafayette High School for the many achievements of the student body. He expressed his felicity in honoring the students with a proclamation.

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Mayor Gorton asked Steve Baron, owner and proprietor of CD Central, to join her at the podium, along with Vice Mayor Wu and Ms. LeGris, and read a Proclamation declaring August 28, 2025 as CD Central Day in Lexington.

Mayor Gorton spoke of the cultural importance CD Central held over the past 30 years and shared news that the store would be closing in early September upon the retirement of Mr. Baron.

Mr. Baron thanked the Mayor for the honor. He thanked the city of Lexington for the support offered throughout the past 30 years. He thanked his current councilmember, Ms. LeGris, and her predecessors, and the various departments of the City for their services. He offered thanks and gratitude to his staff and to the community.

Vice Mayor Wu shared his personal history with the store, noting he was one of the first employees who worked there in the lates 90s. He reflected on the impact the store had on the community, not just by offering a wide range of music, but by supporting local musicians and events throughout its history.

Ms. LeGris congratulated Mr. Baron and remarked on CD Central as an institution in the community, supporting local music and small businesses. She thanked him for helping to make Lexington more interesting landscape.
