SUBJECT: Agreement with Lexington-Fayette County Health Department

Request: Council authorization to execute an agreement with the Lexington-Fayette County Health Department in the amount of \$237,500 for the Expanded First Responders and Community Partners Overdose Prevention Project (EFRCPOPP) funded under the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services First Responders - Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Support Service Grant (FR-CARA).

Purpose of Request: On September 8, 2022, Council approved acceptance of federal funds from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for operating the Expanded First Responders and Community Partners Overdose Prevention Project. The funding agency requires recipients to contract with a service provider who will collect data and evaluate performance. The Division of Social Services listed the Lexington-Fayette County Health Department as the required evaluator in the grant application.

Through the Expanded First Responders and Community Partners Overdose Prevention Project (EFRCPOPP), the Lexington-Fayette County Health Department will be responsible for dispensing naloxone to first responders and providing data on naloxone distribution, which is a key component of the grant program.

What is the cost in this budget year and future budget years? \$237,500 is budgeted. Future budget years will depend on additional grant funding.

Are the funds budgeted? Yes, funds are budgeted as follows:
