Agreement with AARP for Co-Sponsorship of Educational Workshop titled: Taking Charge: Your Medications, your health on April 17, 2012

City of Lexington Department of Social Services (represented by Kristy Stambaugh, Aging Services and Disability Support Administrator) has agreed to provide the following resources and/or services:

- Secure the Lexington Cooperative Extension facility to include coffee pots, stage, podium, mike, screen and projector in addition to exhibitor tables and seating for attendees
- Arrange for GTV3 to videotape event
- Promote the event to seniors in the Lexington area
- Secure Certificate of Insurance for event

AARP Kentucky (represented by Patrice Blanchard, Associate State Director) has agreed to provide the following resources and/or services:

Any other use of either organization's name or logo is only permitted with written permission of the other.
- LFCUG will not collect or maintain any information from visitors or participants in the event that will directly or indirectly identify the individuals as AARP members, prospects, or persons interested in AARP.
