Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting Lexington, Kentucky August 13, 2020

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and State of Emergency, this meeting is being held via live video teleconference pursuant to 2020 Senate Bill 150, and in accordance with KRS 61.826, because it is not feasible to offer a primary physical location for the meeting.

The Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Kentucky convened in regular session on August 13, 2020 at 6:02 p.m. Present were Mayor Gorton in the chair presiding, and the following members of the council: Reynolds, Swanson, Worley, Bledsoe, F. Brown, J. Brown, Ellinger, Farmer, Kay, Lamb, McCurn, Moloney, Mossotti and Plomin. Absent was Council Member Higgins-Hord.

The reading of the Minutes of the previous meeting was waived.

Ordinances No. 57-2020 through 68-2020, inclusive, and Resolutions No. 309-2020 through 361-2020, inclusive, were reported as having been signed and published and ordered to record.

The Invocation was given by Rev. Dr. Robert Strode of St. Paul AME Church.

Ms. Higgins-Hord joined the meeting at 6:06 p.m.

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Mayor Gorton talked about the motion to suspend public comment at all Council Meetings and Work Sessions held via Zoom until the Dept. of Information Technology can devise a way of screening or vetting legitimate callers. She explained this decision was made in response to the racial slurs and comments of bigotry were made when Public Comment was opened during the August 11 Work Session. Mayor Gorton then read the following statement:

The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Council has allowed time for public comment at its meetings for decades. It is not something we are required to do. It is something we have always wanted to do, to ensure transparency and to have an opportunity to hear

from all of our citizens. But that doesn't mean that we will listen to people who engage in hate speech. We will never legitimize hatred, racial slurs or any expression of bigotry. So for now, we have suspended public comment. We are searching for technologies and other ways that will allow us to bring it back safely, and in the meantime, all of us – all fifteen Councilmembers and myself – have email addresses and we can all be found on our public website at <u>www.lexingtonky.gov</u>. Thank you.
