KENTUCKY TRANSPORTATION CABINET – DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROVISIONS

SECOND TIER SUBCONTRACTS

Second Tier subcontracts on federally assisted projects shall be permitted. However, in the case of DBE's, second tier subcontracts will only be permitted where the other subcontractor is also a DBE. All second tier subcontracts shall have the consent of both the Contractor and the Engineer.

DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAM

It is the policy of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government ("LFUCG") that Disadvantaged Business Enterprises ("DBE") shall have the opportunity to participate in the performance of highway construction projects financed in whole or in part by Federal Funds in order to create a level playing field for all businesses who wish to contract with the LFUCG. To that end, the LFUCG will comply with the regulations found in 49 CFR Part 26, and the definitions and requirements contained therein shall be adopted as if set out verbatim herein.

The LFUCG, contractors, subcontractors, and sub-recipients shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of work performed pursuant to LFUCG contracts. The contractor shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 CFR 26 in the award and administration of federally assisted highway construction projects. The contractor will include this provision in all its subcontracts and supply agreements pertaining to contracts with the LFUCG.

- Description of the work each is to perform including the work item, unit, quantity, unit price and total amount of the work to be performed by the individual DBE and the project bid number.
- The dollar value of each proposed DBE subcontract and the percentage of total project contract value this represents. DBE participation may be counted as follows; a) If DBE suppliers and manufactures assume actual and contractual responsibility, the dollar value of materials to be furnished will be counted toward the goal as follows:
 - The entire expenditure paid to a DBE manufacturer;
 - 60 percent of expenditures to DBE suppliers that are not manufacturers provided
 the supplier is a regular dealer in the product involved. A regular dealer must be

Changes to DBE Participation Plans or DBE substitutions must be approved by the LFUCG Division of Central Purchasing. The LFUCG may consider extenuating circumstances including, but not limited to, changes in the nature or scope of the project, the inability or unwillingness of a DBE to perform the work in accordance with the bid, and/or other circumstances beyond the control of the prime contractor.

CONSIDERATION OF GOOD FAITH EFFORTS REQUESTS

If the DBE participation submitted in the bid by the apparent lowest responsive bidder does not meet or exceed the DBE contract goal, the apparent lowest responsive bidder must submit a Good Faith Effort documentation to satisfy the LFUCG that sufficient good faith efforts were made to meet the contract goals prior to submission of the bid. Efforts to increase the goal after bid submission will not be considered in justifying the good faith effort, unless the contractor can show that the proposed DBE was solicited prior to the bid date. DBEs utilized in achieving the DBE goal must be certified and pre-qualified for the work items at the time the bid is submitted. One complete set of this information must be received in the office of the LFUCG Division of Central Purchasing no later than 12:00 noon of the tenth calendar day after receipt of notification that they are the apparent low bidder.

Where the information submitted includes repetitious solicitation letters it will be acceptable to submit a sample representative letter along with a distribution list of the firms solicited. Documentation of DBE quotations shall be a part of the good faith effort submittal as necessary to demonstrate compliance with the factors listed below which the LFUCG considers in judging good faith efforts. This documentation may include written subcontractors' quotations, telephone log notations of verbal quotations, or other types of quotation documentation.

The Good Faith Efforts documentation shall include, but may not be limited to information showing evidence of the following:

- 1 Whether the bidder attended any pre-bid meetings that were scheduled by LFUCG to inform DBEs of subcontracting opportunities;
- Whether the bidder provided solicitations through all reasonable and available means;
- Whether the bidder provided written notice to all DBEs listed in the DBE directory at the time of the letting that are pre-qualified in the areas of work that the bidder will be subcontracting;
- Whether the bidder followed up initial solicitations of interest by contacting DBEs to determine with certainly whether they were interested. If a reasonable amount of DBEs within the targeted districts do not provide an intent to quote or no DBEs are pre-qualified in the subcontracted areas, the bidder must notify the Minority Business Enterprise Liaison in the Division of Central Purchasing to give notification of the bidder's inability to get DBE quotes;
- Whether the bidder selected portions of the work to be performed by DBEs in order to increase the likelihood of meeting the contract goals. This includes, where appropriate, breaking out contract work items into economically feasible units to facilitate DBE participation, even when the prime contractor might otherwise perform these work items with its own forces:

The bidder will receive a written decision on the reconsideration explaining the

The result of the reconsideration process is not administratively appealable to the LFUCG Division of Central Purchasing.

The LFUCG Division of Central Purchasing reserves the right to award the contract to the next lowest responsive bidder or to rebid the contract in the event that the contract is not awarded to the low bidder as the result of a failure to meet the good faith requirement.

SANCTIONS FOR FAILURE TO MEET DBE REQUIREMENTS OF THE PROJECT

Failure by the prime contractor to fulfill the DBE requirements of a project under contract or to demonstrate good faith efforts to meet the goal constitutes a breach of contract. When this occurs, the Cabinet will hold the prime contractor accountable, as would be the case with all other contract provisions. Therefore, the contractor's failure to carry out the DBE contract requirements shall constitute a breach of contract and as such the Cabinet reserves the right to exercise all administrative remedies at its disposal including, but not limited to the following:

- · Termination of the contract.

PROMPT PAYMENT

The prime contractor will be required to pay the DBE within seven (7) working days after he or she
has received payment from the LFUCG Division of Central Purchasing for work performed or
materials furnished

<u>CONTRACTOR REPORTING</u> All Contractors must report on their progress in meeting the DBE requirement on any construction contracts. These records may include, but shall not be limited to payroll, lease agreements, cancelled payroll checks, executed subcontracting agreements, etc. Prime contractors will be required to submit certified reports on monies paid to each DBE subcontractor or supplier utilized to meet a DBE goal.

Payment information that needs to be reported includes date the payment is sent to the DBE, check number, Contract ID, amount of payment and the check date. Before Final Payment is made on this contract, the Prime Contractor will certify that all payments were made to the DBE subcontractor and/or DBE suppliers and show the documented proof.

If after exerting good faith effort in accordance with the LFUCG Division of Central Purchasing policies and procedures, the prime contractor is unable to replace the DBE, then the unmet portion of the goal may be waived at the discretion of the LFUCG Division of Central Purchasing.

Please be advised of the following clarification to the above referenced bid:

Retaining Walls

- 1) Is there any geotechnical information available for the retaining walls? Response: No.
- 2) Can a profile of the retaining walls be provided? Response: No profile will be provided. The locations of the varying panel heights are shown on sheet S2.
- 3) Is it intended to set the panels on the concrete poured to the top of the rock socket? Or does the concrete backfilling the piling sometimes pour above the rock socket? Response: The intent is that the panels bear directly on the rock socket and be flush with the top of the pile. The top of the rock socket will therefore vary on either side of the pile.
- 4) What is the detail for setting panels at the same pile with different panel heights on each side? Response: See response to question 3.
- 5) Is it intended for the panels to set even with the top of the piling? Response: Yes.
- The note for the pre-drilled rock socket is confusing. For instance, some of the sockets indicate a 10' minimum rock socket, with at least 3' into unweathered rock. If weathered rock is greater than 2' thick, then extend the rock socket until you get at least 3' into unweathered rock but no more than 10'-6". Do we take that to mean that the rock socket should only get extended when weathered rock is more than 7' thick in the case of a 10' rock socket? Or does it mean if unweathered rock is 3' thick in this instance that the rock socket needs to be 10'-6"? Does it mean that if the unweathered rock is 12' deep, we drill a 10'-6" hole?

Response: The intent is that the rocket socket should a minimum of 3' into unweathered rock for at least the minimum rock socket length but not more than the maximum length. While it is highly unlikely that the weathered rock depth will be 12' deep. If such a case is discovered during construction, it would need to every evaluated on an individual basis.

- 7) The plans show 10" thick concrete panels. Does this 10" include the stone veneer listed in Section 37 of the Technical Specifications or is the stone veneer in addition to the 10"? Response: The 10" is structural thickness and does not include the stone veneer thickness (see additional information regarding stone veneer).
- 8) On sheet S11, on Detail A, there is not shown any plates for the pile cover on end of the return leg of the retaining wall. How is the cover to be attached to the steel piling at this location? Response: The cover is to be attached using Plate "B", similar to that shown in Detail "B".
- 9) On sheet S11, Detail A, there is no weld detail for Plate A on the return leg of the retaining wall. What is the required weld, if there is one for this connection? Response: The weld should be 1/4".
- All references on the plans and specifications regarding stone veneer treatments on the retaining walls south of Man O' War Blvd, shall be disregarded. The aesthetic treatments for the retaining walls shall be constructed with form liners with a stone pattern that matches the existing walls on the west side of Clays Mill Road just north of Higbee Mill Road. The form liner shall be submitted to the LFUCG for review and approval. The form liners shall be of such dimensions that are be compatible with the retaining wall structure plans (sheets S1 S11).
- 11) It appears that if the top of the pile elevation is indeed the top of the panel elevation, then subtracting the panel heights from the top of the pile elevation indicates that in some locations the bottom of the panel will be above the sidewalk. This will also cause the rock socket / column of concrete to have to be formed in order to construct. Response: The intent is that bottom of the panels to be at/below is the existing ground/rock line. If the current field conditions differ from the original survey (from 2004), then field modifications to construct the panels/wall as intended may be necessary.
- 12) Since there is not a uniform height or stepped down locations of the top of the wall indicated, there will be areas where the precast panels setting on a small half column of concrete several feet high will be required. This will be an unreinforced half column of concrete and with continual wind / vibration / backfill loading on the wall panels would appear to create an undesirable situation vis-à-vis the stability of this loaded area.

 Response: See response to #11. The intent is not to have reinforced concrete columns providing the primary support. The existing rock line is the intended primary support.
- 13) There does not appear to be any pad or other device on which to set the panel, thus, there will be concrete on concrete interface. There will be movement due to wind, vibrations, etc. that will likely lead to displaced stone veneer and cracking / chipping of the panels due to the movement of concrete on concrete. Response: See #'s 11 & 12 responses.

Bridge Widening over South Elkhorn Creek

- 14) The plans indicate a Barrier Median Type 4 which extends across the bridge. However, the roadway plans and the cross-sections indicate a width of 2' while the bridge plans indicate a width of 4'. Which is correct? Response: The width of the median barrier should be 2'.
- 15) Should the Barrier Median Type 4 be changed to indicate Barrier Median Type 5 for the section on the bridge? Response: The barrier median type shall be in accordance with the KYTC standard drawings for the surface that it will be constructed on (existing or new flexible pavement, existing rigid pavement, etc.).
- 16) The item for the joint seal appears to have been left off the quantities. Response: The joint seal is incidental to the armored edge.
- 17) Is it intended for a neoprene seal to be used on the bridge joints? If so, are the existing seals to be left in place? If the existing seals are left in place, what is the detail for tying the new seals to the existing seals?

Response: Use a preformed compression joint seal per Std. Dwg. BJE-001 as noted in the plans. If the existing seals are damaged or in poor condition, they should be removed and new seals be placed along the entire width of the bridge. If not, the new seals will be tied into the existing per the seal manufacturer's recommendations.

- 18) If the intent is to use the cork throughout the new joints, the item for armored edge will need to be increased. Response: The intent of the cork is to provide a bond break between the end diaphragms and the abutment backwall. It does not need to extend past the limits of the armored edge and should not impact the armored edge quantity.
- 19) Handrails for the bridge widening shall be aluminum. See attachment B of this addendum for details.
- 20) Masonry coating for the superstructure is revised from 1955 SY to 352 SY. Total quantity for masonry coating is 503 SY.

Miscellaneous Items

- 21) Storm sewer pipe may be HDPE
- 22) Existing light poles will be removed by Kentucky Utilities prior to the start of construction
- 23) In instances where proposed pipe is connecting to existing pipe through existing inlets, the inlet structure will be removed as part of clearing and grubbing.
- 24) DGA under sidewalks and ramps is not required, but may be used. If used, it will be incidental to the construction of the sidewalk and/or ramps.
- Above ground and below ground utilities have been previously relocated. Existing topography on the plan sheets does not reflect these relocations. If it is discovered during construction that utilities conflicts exist, the contractor shall immediately notify the LFUCG.
- All materials for the traffic signals will be provided by the contractor (controller cabinets, mast arms, signals, etc.).
- 27) Attachment A of this addendum shows the roadway earthwork quantities. Note these quantities do not include bridge widening construction and construction of the retaining walls behind the face of the wall.
- 28) Attachment B of this addendum is a detail for the aluminum handrails for the bridge widening.


