Budget Amendments are in process. (L1001-17) (Plueger/Hoskins-Squier)
b	1033-17	Authorization to amend Section 4-12(g) of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Code of Ordinances related to the regulation of kennels, to decrease the number of convictions necessary to suspend or revoke a kennel license; providing that a kennel license may be revoked for violation of state or local law criminalizing the mistreatment of animals, and increasing the time a person whose kennel license has been revoked must wait before applying for a new license from one year to five years. j	<u>1066-17</u>	Authorization to execute Amendment to HOME Agreement with Fayette County Local Development Corporation, Inc., to update the language in Article I and to correct the period of affordability to a period of fifteen years. (L1066-17) (Lanter/Hamilton)
k	<u>1067-17</u>	Authorization to execute an agreement with Telcordia Technologies Inc., d/b/a iconectiv, as a sole vendor under contract with the Federal Communications Commission to manage telephone number (landline, wireless and VoIP) portability between carriers. E911 accesses the database to resolve issues when calls to 911 do not present location and/or carrier information as they should. The annual cost is \$6,000. Funds are budgeted. I	<u>1078-17</u>	Authorization to execute modification to agreement with the Kentucky Department of Military Affairs, Division of Emergency Management for federal funds under the Chemical Stockpile Emergency Preparedness Program (CSEPP) for FY 2016 extending the performance period through September 30, 2018. No additional cost in this budget year or in future budget years. (L1078-17) (Dugger/Bastin)
m	<u>1080-17</u>	Authorization to accept grant from the Kentucky 911 Services Board (previously known as Kentucky Commercial Mobile Radio Services (CMRS) Board) in the amount of \$400,000 for the purchase of a new Computer Aided Dispatch (CAD) system to include hardware, software, licenses, and consulting for the Division of Enhanced 911. Budget Amendment is in process. (L1080-17) (Stack/Bastin)
n	<u>1081-17</u>	Authorization to execute Change Order No.1 with Cumberland Pipeline, LLC for the Paradise Lane Pump Station and Force Main Project, increasing the contract price by the sum of \$6,469.00 to

Authorization to allow an inducement to Innovative Mattress Solutions as local participate in the Kentucky Business Investment Program, which includes a 10-year local 1% wage assessment through KBI. Revenue to be rebated. Tax expenditure, not actual cost. (L0183-17) (Atkins)

Authorization to approve the Lexington Downtown Development Authority (LDDA) to enter into a reorganization agreement and partnership with the Downtown Lexington Corporation (DLC) to be known as the Downtown Lexington Partnership (DLP) and to make certain amendments to the Code of Ordinance sections pertaining to the LDDA in order to be consistent with the partnership agreement. The boards of the Lexington Downtown Development Authority (LDDA) and the Downtown Lexington Corporation (DLC) have approved a consolidation plan to allow both separate organizations to reorganize and operate as a unified entity to be known as the Downtown Lexington Partnership (DLP). This entity would receive any funding from LFUCG that sue to be provided separately to the same entities. There is no additional budgetary impact. (L1084-17)(Atkins)

Authorization to submit application to the Kentucky American Water, and accept award if offered, in the amount of \$500 for the Fire Fighting Support Grant to support the purchase of Personal Protective Equipment for the Division of Fire and Emergency Services.
