PremierTox 2.0 Inc.

PremierTox 2.0 Inc. has submitted an application and received preliminary approval from the Kentucky Economic Development Finance Authority to participate in the Kentucky Business Investment (KBI) program. PremierTox's decision to expand their drug screening and confirmation laboratory in Lexington will create wealth and provide additional job opportunities for the citizens of Lexington and the surrounding area.

The company plans to create 25 new jobs with an average wage of approximately \$42,000 per year plus benefits. PremierTox plans to invest \$250,000 in new equipment, building improvements, start-up costs, and lease costs for a 10-year period.

With the KBI program, the state and local government enter into a ten-year agreement with an approved company under which the business can recover up to 100% of its start-up costs and 50% of the annual rent costs through Kentucky corporate income tax credits and a wage assessment fee of up to 4%. Although the company may not actually use the full KBI benefit, we demonstrate in the chart below the maximum amount that the company could recover through the local 1% wage assessment.

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The maximum potential fiscal impact of this project is summarized in the following table.

Additional tax revenues and other collections are likely, but are not as easy to measure. These include the County-wide net profits tax, the County-wide insurance premium tax, Kentucky corporate income and license taxes, Kentucky motor vehicle usage and gasoline taxes.

No attempt is made to estimate any public costs associated with the the proposed economic development.

Calculations assume property listed is "new". The average annual taxable value of tangible personal property is assumed to be 1/3 of the purchase price.

Estimated impacts do not take account of, and are not reduced by, any tax incentives for the direct or indirect jobs added.
