Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting Lexington, Kentucky February 9, 2023

The Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Kentucky convened in regular session on February 9, 2023 at 6:00 p.m. Present were Mayor Gorton in the chair presiding, and the following members of the Council: Reynolds, Sevigny, Sheehan, Wu, F. Brown, J. Brown, Ellinger, Elliott Baxter, Fogle, Gray, LeGris, Lynch, Monarrez, and Plomin. Absent was Council Member Worley.

The reading of the Minutes of the previous meeting was waived.

Ordinances No. 003-2023 through 009-2023, inclusive, and Resolutions No. 005-2023 through 040-2023, inclusive, were reported as having been signed and published and ordered to record.

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The Invocation was given by Jared Underwood, Community Life Pastor of Emmanuel Baptist Church.

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At 6:04 p.m. Mr. Worley joined the meeting.

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Mayor Gorton asked Ms. Fogle to join her at the podium, along with Mr. Bobby Washington, and read a Proclamation declaring February 9, 2023 as Bobby Washington Day in Lexington.

Mr. Washington thanked the Council and Mayor for the recognition, noting he was surprised by the honor. He thanked his parents, his wife, and God for his opportunities.

Ms. Fogle spoke of Mr. Washington's many contributions to his community and the important role he has played during his life.

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Mayor Gorton asked Deputy Dir. of Recreation Adrienne Thakur, Superintendent of Planning and Design Michelle Kosieniak, and Superintendent for Community Engagement Laura Hatfield, Div. of Parks and Recreation, to join her at the podium, along with District STEM Learning Coaches Ashley Faulkner and Shad Lacefield, Fayette County Public Schools. Deputy Dir. Thakur thanked the Council and Mayor for the

opportunity to introduce the coaches and invited each to speak about the partnership between the City and Fayette County Public Schools. Mr. Lacefield spoke about the planning and design of a STEM integrated public park, which used Minecraft to allow the students to build a virtual park for the Div. of Parks and Recreation. Ms. Faulkner spoke about the Girls Who Game initiative, which aims to bolster female participation in gaming. She shared some highlights from the students' project plans and stated she hoped to see them realized in the new Cardinal Run Park design. Mr. Lacefield closed by sharing that some of the students' work would be on display at the local public library.
