SOLE SOURCE AGREEMENT

between LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT and LEXINGTON HABITAT FOR HUMANITY RESTORE

for the RECYCLING and REUSE of PAINT MATERIAL

Pursuant to this agreement, the Division of Waste Management will reimburse Lexington Habitat for Humanity ReStore on a monthly basis for the recycling and reuse of latex paint material.

The ReStore recycles approximately 4,000 gallons of latex paint material each year and will be reimbursed on a monthly basis at the same rate as the current Household Hazardous Waste Vendor Price Contract (\$0.23 per pound of paint with the average gallon of paint weighing 11 pounds). The ReStore will invoice the Division on a monthly basis for the latex paint material that is recycled and sold for reuse.

This program allows Lexington residents a year-round opportunity to drop off unwanted latex paint material to be recycled and reused at the Lexington Habitat for Humanity ReStore at 451 Southland Drive. The Lexington Habitat for Humanity ReStore has been a long-standing partner in Lexington's effort to divert this hazardous material from the landfill, participating in every bi-annual Household Hazardous Waste event. This program now provides a year-round opportunity to divert latex paint and further strengthen Lexington's commitment to keeping the Bluegrass green.

The annual cost of the program is anticipated not to exceed \$60,000, with reimbursement to occur on a monthly basis upon receipt of an invoice, net 30 days after receiving invoice, from the Lexington Habitat for Humanity ReStore.

Either party may terminate this agreement with 60 days' notice prior to the termination date.

This agreement shall be effective upon passage of Council and authorized signatures of both parties. The agreement will be renewed annually with the cost tied to the current Household Hazardous Waste Vendor Price Contract cost for processing latex paint.
