

Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting

Lexington, Kentucky May 14, 2026

The Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Kentucky convened in regular session on May 14, 2026 at 6:00 p.m. Present were Mayor Gorton in the chair presiding, and the following members of the Council: Higgins-Hord, Lynch, Morton, Reynolds, Sevigny, Sheehan, Wu, Beasley, Boone, Brown, Curtis, Eblen, Ellinger, Elliott Baxter, and Hale.

The reading of the Minutes of the previous meeting was waived.

Ordinances No. 030-2026 through 031-2026, inclusive, and Resolutions No. 139-2026 through 164-2026, inclusive, were reported as having been signed and published and ordered to record.

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The Invocation was given by Rev. Sunday Daleng of Wesley United Methodist Church.

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Upon motion by Mr. Sevigny, seconded by Mr. Ellinger, and approved by unanimous vote, the Minutes of the April 14, 2026 Budget Address and the April 30, 2026 Council Meeting were approved.

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Mayor Gorton asked Lexington Catholic High School Girls Track and Field Coach Burnadette Dugan, to join her at the podium, along with the team members and Mr. Sevigny, and read a Proclamation declaring May 14, 2026 Lexington Catholic High School Girls Track and Field Day in Lexington.

Mayor Gorton congratulated the team for winning their fourth straight Class 2A, Region 4 team track championship, making them three-time defending state champions in Class 2A girls track. She commended the team, coach and parents for their determination, grit, and endurance.

Coach Dugan expressed her gratitude to the Mayor and Council for their recognition. She shared that the team had dedicated its victories to the memory of a beloved classmate, Eli Sloan, who recently passed away after a courageous battle with

cancer. In honoring his memory, the team found renewed strength, unity, and determination throughout their training and competition season.

Mr. Seigny extended his congratulations to the coach and team and expressed sincere appreciation to the parents for their steadfast support and encouragement throughout the season. He further praised the team for the remarkable perseverance they demonstrated facing the loss of a friend and classmate.

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At 6:15 p.m., Mayor Gorton declared open a public hearing for the Mayor's Proposed FY 2027 Budget and invited public comment.

Luke Box, Dist. 10, asked the Council to reconsider allocations intended for Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA) of the Bluegrass. He suggested those funds be reallocated for ONE Lexington.

At 6:19 p.m., with no one else appearing to speak, Mayor Gorton declared the public hearing closed.
