## RESOLUTION NO. 595 -2014

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR, ON BEHALF OF THE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT, TO ACCEPT A GRANT FROM THE KENTUCKY DEPARTMENT FOR LOCAL GOVERNMENT, WHICH GRANT FUNDS ARE IN THE AMOUNT OF \$100,000.00 FEDERAL FUNDS, ARE FOR PHASE 4 OF THE BRIGHTON RAIL TRAIL PROJECT, THE ACCEPTANCE OF WHICH OBLIGATES THE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF \$100,377.92 AS A LOCAL MATCH, AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO TRANSFER UNENCUMBERED FUNDS WITHIN THE GRANT BUDGET.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE LEXINGTON-FAYETTE URBAN COUNTY GOVERNMENT:

Section 1 - That the Mayor, on behalf of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, be and hereby is authorized and directed to accept a grant from the Kentucky Department for Local Government, which Grant funds are in the amount of \$100,000.00 Federal funds, are for Phase 4 of the Brighton Rail Trail Project, and the acceptance of which obligates the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government for the expenditure of \$100,377.92 as a local match.

Section 2 - That subject to the provisions of Ordinance No. 22-79, the Mayor is hereby authorized, in his discretion as Chief Executive Officer of the Urban County Government, to transfer the unencumbered balance of any operating or capital account appropriation to another operating or capital account appropriation within the Grant budget previously established for this Grant.

Section 3 - That this Resolution shall become effective on the date of its passage.

Request Council authorization to accept award of federal funds from the

Kentucky Department for Local Government under the Recreational Trail

Program for Brighton Rail Trail Phase 4

On March 22, 2012 (Resolution No. 126-2012), Council approved the submission of a grant application to the Kentucky Department for Local Government, requesting federal funding for construction of Brighton Rail Trail Phase 4. An award in the amount of \$100,000 has been approved.

The proposed is a 2600 ft, 10 ft wide asphalt trail that begins at the intersection of Liberty Road and connects to Brighton Trail east of Man O' War Boulevard. This project will connect three existing parks.

This project requires a 50% local match. Local match in the amount of \$100,377.92 will come from the Municipal Aid Program. Project costs include right of way, design, environmental assessment, construction, and landscaping. Total project cost is \$200,377.92.

The source of federal funds is the Federal Highway Trust Fund, and represents a portion of the motor fuel excise tax collected from non-highway recreational fuel use.

Council authorization to accept the award is hereby requested.
