SUBJECT: Agreement with Lexington-Fayette County Health Department

Request: Council authorization to execute an agreement with the Lexington-Fayette County Health Department in the amount of \$270,000 for the First Responders and Community Partners Overdose Prevention Project funded under the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services First Responders - Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act Grant Program.

Purpose of Request: On September 12, 2019 (Resolution #485-2019), Council approved acceptance of federal funds from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services for operating Year 2 of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government's First Responders - Comprehensive Addiction and Recovery Act Program.

Through the First Responders and Community Partners Overdose Prevention Project, the Lexington-Fayette County Health Department will be responsible for dispensing naloxone to first responders, which is a key component of the grant program.

What is the cost in this budget year and future budget years? \$270,000 is budgeted. Future budget years will depend on additional grant funding.

Are the funds budgeted? Yes. Funds are budgeted as follows: 3190-606105-0001-75101 – SAMHSA_2020.
