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Ms. Gorton made a presentation in honor of Alcohol Awareness Month to the Mayor's Alliance on Substance Abuse. A Resolution authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to execute an Addendum to the Agreement granting additional responsibility pursuant to

KRS 198b.060(5), with the Commonwealth of Ky. Dept. of Housing, Buildings, and Construction, specifying the enforcement responsibilities within Lexington-Fayette County, at no cost to the Urban County Government.

A Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to accept a Grant from the Ky.
