**SUBJECT: Acceptance of \$75,150 in funding from the Cabinet for Health and Family
Services for the Lexington Fire Department**

Request: Council approval to accept funding for the Kentucky Opioid Response Effort from the Cabinet for Health and Family Services, in the amount of \$75,150 to help fund the Community Paramedicine Program, and council approval for ratification and for any amendments as needed. No matching funds required.

Purpose of Request: The purpose of the grant is a continuation Quick Response Team capabilities through existing staffing within the Community Paramedicine Program. Grant funding will allow for the continuation of having the firefighter off the line to work in the Community Paramedicine and paying the backfilled overtime costs generated by the move. The Kentucky Opioid Response Effort (KORE) seeks to expand and sustain a comprehensive, equitable recovery-oriented system of care to end the opioid epidemic that has reached into every community in Kentucky. To achieve this aim, KORE and its partners commit to a trauma informed care and anti-racist framework to reduce overdose deaths and increase access to high quality, evidence-based prevention, treatment, and recovery support services.

What is the cost in this budget year and future budget years? Estimated Cost is \$75,150. No costs are anticipated in future years.

Are the funds budgeted? FY23 budget amendment is in process.
