Please be advised of the following clarifications to the above referenced Bid:

	Questions	Answers
1.	Are there any agreements or special conditions related to the property owner whose landscaping will be affected?	LFUCG has executed separate Landscape Reimbursement Agreements with the two property owners near the existing headwall. It is recognized that landscaping will be disturbed on those two properties. Contractor should make efforts to minimize the amount of disturbance to the landscaping. LFUCG will be responsible for reimbursing the property owners for the disturbed landscaping. Contractor shall assume the disturbed areas on the properties shall be seeded and strawed. Contractor shall NOT disturb any areas on the two properties BEYOND the existing fencing.
2.	Are there any work time restrictions (Saturdays/Sundays), or other known holiday/event restrictions?	No construction between the hours of 11:00 pm and 7:00 am on weekdays. Work outside these hours, or on Saturdays or Sundays will require a variance to be approved by the Mayor's office. Any other restrictions will be relayed to the contractor after award.
3.	In reference to the access road, the plans indicate that a 10' wide access is proposed. LFUCG reserves the right to require removal of the product if it is not adequately removing mud and debris from tires/treads prior to equipment driving offsite.
