MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT

Shared-Use Paths on US 68 (Harrodsburg Road) at the New Circle Road interchange

This maintenance agreement is between the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet (KYTC) and the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government (LFUCG).

In conjunction with the new construction of the double crossover diamond interchange on US 68 (Harrodsburg Road) at KY 4 (New Circle Road), two shared-use paths were constructed. The shared-use paths provide improved mobility for pedestrians and cyclists within the limits of the new interchange. The two shared-use paths are hilighted on the attached plan sheets of Project # FD52 034 0068 002-004, and are described as follows:

Shared-Use Path (north): Constructed along the north side of Harrodsburg Road from the west side of Alexandria Drive extending southwest approximately 2,110 feet to the east side of Beaumont Centre Parkway.

Shared-Use Path (south): Constructed along south side of Harrodsburg Road from the west side of Pasadena Drive extending southwest approximately 1,550 feet to the east side of Corporate Drive.

The shared-use paths were constructed with 8 foot wide asphalt pavement (See sheet R2A). In areas where the shared-use paths are adjacent to a retaining wall, the shared-use paths were constructed with 10 foot wide asphalt pavement (See sheet R2F).

The LFUCG agrees to maintain or cause to be maintained the aforementioned public facilities and the associated signage located within the public right of way of US 68 (Harrodsburg Road). In accordance with the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet policies concerning maintenance of public shared-use paths, we will maintain the aforementioned facilities to the back-of-curbs of the state maintained route. We understand that KYTC will continue to maintain the roadway ramp pavement and pavement markings where the shared-use paths cross at the signalized intersections. We also understand that KYTC will continue to maintain the retaining wall structures and routine grass mowing adjacent to the paths within the interchange.
