RE: The Historic Fayette County Courthouse Rehabilitation Project - Lease, Legal Entities, and Financial Contributions

## Request:

Approval of this resolution will endorse both the formation of the legal entities required to utilize state and federal historic tax credits for the Historic Fayette County Courthouse Rehabilitation Project and a future economic development grant of $\$ 22$ million. It will also authorize the long-term ground lease of the property and a short-term loan for the project in an amount not to exceed $\$ 12$ million.

## Why are you requesting?

This action is requested in order to qualify for the state and federal historic tax credits programs. The Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government will provide economic development assistance through newly created legal entities which will leverage private money in the form of historic tax credits to complete the project and ensure the future financial sustainability of the project.

What is the cost in this budget year and future budget years?
Council approved the issuance of a $\$ 22$ million bond related to this project as part of the FY2016 budget.
