

Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting

Lexington, Kentucky November 18, 2021

The Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Kentucky convened in regular session on November 18, 2021 at 6:03 p.m. Present were Mayor Gorton in the chair presiding, and the following members of the Council: Kloiber, Kay, Lamb, LeGris, McCurn, Moloney, Plomin, Reynolds, Sheehan, Bledsoe, F. Brown, J. Brown, and Ellinger. Absent were Council Members Worley and Baxter.

The reading of the Minutes of the previous meeting was waived.

Ordinances No. 112-2021 through 122-2021, inclusive, and Resolutions No. 593-2021 through 633-2021, inclusive, were reported as having been signed and published and ordered to record.

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The Invocation was given by Father William Redmon of Holy Mother Queen of All Greek Orthodox Church.

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Upon motion by Mr. Ellinger, seconded by Mr. McCurn, and approved by unanimous vote, the Minutes of the November 4, 2021 Council Meeting were approved.

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Mayor Gorton asked the Lexington Catholic Girls Cross Country team to join her at the podium, along with Head Coach Bernie Dugan, and Ms. Bledsoe, and read a Proclamation declaring November 2021 as Lexington Catholic Girls Cross Country Class AA State Champions Month in Lexington.

Mayor Gorton congratulated the Lexington Catholic Girls Cross Country team for winning the KHSAA Girls Cross Country 2A State Title. She noted runner Caroline Beiting was the first of the team to finish the race.

Coach Dugan expressed her pride in the student athletes and their accomplishments as well as the team's perseverance while honoring two late teammates, Dominic Bilotta and David Cervoni.

Ms. Bledsoe spoke about the tough meteorological challenges the Cross Country runners encounter during meets and acknowledged the significant role and dedication the parents play in the success of the students.

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Mayor Gorton asked the Lexington Christian Academy (LCA) Girls Varsity Cross Country team to join her at the podium, along with Head Coach Tom Stickel, and Ms. Bledsoe, and read a Proclamation declaring November 2021 as Lexington Christian Academy Girls Cross Country Class A State Champions Month in Lexington.

Mayor Gorton congratulated the LCA Girls Varsity Cross Country team for winning their first KHSAA Girls Cross Country 1A State Title.

Ms. Bledsoe expressed pride in the team for winning their first state title and congratulated them on their championship.

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Mayor Gorton asked Mrs. Mary Aurelia Rice and Mrs. Carol Ann Readnour to join her at the podium, along with Henry “Skip” Watson, and read a Proclamation in Memoriam, celebrating the life of George F. Rabe and honoring his service to the City.

Mayor Gorton recognized additional family members of Mr. Rabe’s, who were seated in the audience, as well as former City employees who had worked in the Dept. of Law with Mr. Rabe during his tenure as the first Commissioner of Law for the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government after it became the first city-county merged government in Kentucky: the Hon. David Wagoner, Richard Murphy, Henry “Skip” Watson, James T. Hodge, Mary Ann “DeDe” Delaney, and the late Stephen D. Milner. Mayor Gorton also recognized several Roman Catholic priests and members of the Lexington Serra Club of the Diocese of Lexington.

Mr. Watson spoke of the challenges he and Mr. Rabe had to navigate when helping to establish the newly merged government. He shared a few anecdotes demonstrating Mr. Rabe’s loyalty and mentorship to others.

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Mayor Gorton asked Michael Wilson, Central Kentucky Housing and Homeless Initiative (CKHHI), to join her at the podium, along with Dir. Polly Ruddick, Office of Homelessness Prevention and Intervention, and Dir. Charlie Lanter, Div. of Grants and

Special Programs, and read a Proclamation declaring November 13 – 21, 2021 as Hunger and Homelessness Awareness Week in Lexington.

Mr. Wilson thanked the Mayor and Council for the opportunity to receive the proclamation. He emphasized there were many other community partner agencies in Lexington with the same mission, and requested copies of the proclamation be shared with each of the partner agencies. He spoke about hunger and homelessness in Lexington and across the nation.

Jarred Paull, Treasurer for CKHHI, challenged everyone to do something uncomfortable in the spirit of raising awareness for Hunger and Homelessness Awareness Week.

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At 6:41 p.m., Mayor Gorton departed the meeting and Vice Mayor Kay assumed the chair.

Dave Barberie, Dept. of Law, clarified that as the ordinance was a matter of finance it could not receive a second reading in the same meeting per Charter rules. Ms. Lamb asked a procedural question. Mr. Barberie responded. Ms. Bledsoe withdrew her motion.
