Agreement with Lexington Rescue Mission for Innovative and Sustainable

Solutions to Homelessness funding

Request Council authorization for the Mayor to sign an agreement with Lexington Rescue Mission to provide one-time funding of \$55,000 for acquisition and renovation of 629 N. Broadway for the purpose of an expanded community center and addition of 20 beds of transitional housing. This funding leverages an additional \$700,000 in federal and private resources for the project which has a total cost to Lexington Rescue Mission of \$755,000. The project is consistent with the 2014 Report of the Mayor's Commission on Homelessness which identified a need for additional beds of Transitional Housing in Lexington.

Why are you requesting?

On July 13, 2016, the Homelessness Prevention & Intervention Board voted to authorize a match commitment of \$55,000 from the Innovative & Sustainable Solutions to Homelessness Fund for the Lexington Rescue Mission to acquire and renovate property at 629 N. Broadway for a new and expanded community center and additional beds of transitional housing. This commitment was contingent upon the project's receipt of all other necessary revenue including \$550,000 from the Federal Home Loan Bank. Those funds have been secured and the transaction is scheduled to close in April 2017 with renovation beginning soon thereafter.
