A Resolution establishing Kraus Associates, Inc. d/b/a AK Associates, as a sole source provider of telephone technology and equipment manufactured by Solacom Technologies Inc. and Execom logging recorders, for the Div. of Enhanced 911 and authorizing the Mayor or her designee, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to execute any necessary Agreements with Kraus Associates, Inc. d/b/a AK Associates, related to the procurement of these goods and services

A Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to accept a Grant from the U.S. Dept. of Justice, which Grant funds are in the amount of \$35,916 Federal funds under the 2019 State Criminal Alien Assistance Program (SCAAP), are for reimbursement of costs related to the incarceration of undocumented criminal aliens, the acceptance of which does not obligate the Urban County Government for the expenditure of funds, and authorizing the Mayor to transfer unencumbered funds within the Grant Budget.

A Resolution authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to accept deeds and to execute any documents necessary for the acquisition of property interests to facilitate construction of the Wilson Downing Sidewalk Project 676, at a cost not to exceed \$10,000.

A Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to execute and submit a Grant Application to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and to provide any additional information requested in connection with this Grant Application, which Grant funds are in the amount of \$88,500 Federal funds and \$14,160 Commonwealth of Ky. funds, under the Hazard Mitigation

Grant Program, and are for the procurement and installation of a redundant emergency power system at the Lexington Fayette Animal Care and Control (LFACC) Facility.

A Resolution authorizing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to accept deeds and to execute any documents necessary for the acquisition of property interests to facilitate construction of the Armstrong Mill Rd. Sidewalk Project 151, at a cost not to exceed \$14,000.

A Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to execute Release of Claims Agreements with Officer Henry C. Hicks, for care of retired canine Brixi, and with Officer Steven Newton, for care of retired canine Max.

A Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to execute and submit a Grant Application to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and to provide any additional information requested in connection with this Grant Application, which Grant funds are in the amount of \$16,500 Federal funds and \$2,640 Commonwealth of Ky. funds, under the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, and are for the procurement and installation of twelve (12) flood warning markers and signs in Fayette County.

A Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to execute Supplemental Agreement No. 1 with the Ky. Transportation Cabinet, for the acceptance of Federal funds in the amount of \$292,000 for the Construction Phase of the Citation Trail Project, the acceptance of which obligates the Urban County Government for the expenditure of \$73,000 as a local match.

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Upon motion by Ms. Mossotti, and seconded by Vice Mayor Kay, the Communications from the Mayor were approved by unanimous vote and were as follows: (1) Recommending the appointment of Ms. Mary McCormac, to the Arboretum Advisory Board, with term expiring December 31, 2023; (2) Recommending the reappointment of Ms. Christina Espinosa Bard, At large, and Mr. Ryan Guyder, Employment/Education Advocate Representative, to the Commission for People with Disabilities, both with terms expiring April 7, 2024; (3) Recommending the appointment of Ms. Nicole Jenkins, to the Explorium Board of Directors, fulfilling an unexpired term, with term expiring January 23,

2024; (4) Recommending the appointment of Mr. Joshua Mers, to the Human Rights Commission, with term expiring February 4, 2024; (5) Recommending the appointment of Mr. Joseph Coleman, Alternate, Mr. Mike Mayer, Engineer, and Mr. Mark Polston, At large, and the reappointment of Mr. Steve Stadler, Alternate, to the Infrastructure Hearing Board, all with terms expiring February 1, 2023; and, (6) Recommending the reappointment of Lt. Mark Brand, Police Representative, to the Keep Lexington Beautiful Commission, with term expiring February 1, 2024.

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Commander Jesse Harris, Div. of Police, presented a disciplinary matter regarding Officer Matthew DeMent. It is alleged that Officer DeMent has committed the offense of Operation of Vehicles in violation of KRS 95.450 and General Order 1973-02J, Disciplinary Procedures, Appendix B, Operational Rule 1.13 – Operation of Vehicles in that on the 17th day of November 2019, he allegedly:

(1) At approximately 0215hrs on November 17th, 2019, Officer DeMent drove his department issued police cruiser after having consumed alcoholic beverages while off duty.

The appropriate punishment for this conduct is Forty (40) hours Suspension Without Pay and Sixty (60) days Suspension of Home Fleet after returning to duty.

Upon motion by Ms. Plomin, seconded by Ms. Reynolds and approved by unanimous vote, the disciplinary recommendation was approved.

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Commander Jesse Harris, Div. of Police, presented a disciplinary matter regarding Officer Roberto Reyes. It is alleged that Officer Reyes has committed the offense of Unsatisfactory Performance and Audio and Video Recordings in violation of KRS 95.450 and General Order 1973-02J, Disciplinary Procedure, Appendix B, Operational Rule 1.11 – Unsatisfactory Performance and General Order 1973-02J, Disciplinary Procedures of Sworn Officers, Appendix B, Operation Rule 1.37 – Audio and Video Recordings in that on the various days of August and September 2019, he allegedly:

(1) On August 17th, 2019, at approximately 0107, Officer Reyes made contact with an individual during a call of disorderly individuals at 2490 Nicholasville Road.

During the interaction, Officer Reyes used inappropriate language, including racial slurs, while speaking with the subject. Officer Reyes has previously been counseled regarding his use of inappropriate language.

- (2) On August 18th, 2019, at approximately 0147, Officer Ryes was approached by a subject who told Officer Reyes that he had just been assaulted by a suspect. The victim also referenced a possible EPO that the suspect was violating. At the conclusion of the encounter with the victim, Officer Reyes did not complete any reports documenting the allegations of assault or violations of protection orders.
- (3) On 8/18/2019, at approximately 2220, shortly after 3rd Shift roll call, Lt. Sell and Sgt. Thurman met with Officer Reyes to discuss performance issues. Those issues were later addressed in formal charges.
- (4) On 9/12/2019, Officer Reyes was interviewed pursuant to the formal charges. During the interview, Officer Reyes disclosed that he surreptitiously recording the meeting with Lt. Sell and Sgt. Thurman. Officer Reyes gave the recording that he made with his cellular telephone, to Lts. Boyles and Brotherton. The appropriate punishment for this conduct is Written Reprimand.

Upon motion by Mr. F. Brown, seconded by Vice Mayor Kay and approved by unanimous vote, the disciplinary recommendation was approved.

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Ms. Lamb announced that the Lexington Housing Authority has opened the wait list for one-, two- and three-bedroom apartments at Centre Meadows Apartments located on Centre Parkway, with online applications accepted on www.LexHA.org until Sunday, May 31, 2020, and online applications are also being accepted for one-bedroom apartments at Connie Griffith Apartments for elderly persons 62 years of age or older, located on Tower Plaza downtown.

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At 6:50 p.m., Ms. Bledsoe departed the meeting.

Vice Mayor Kay commented on Mr. Moloney's earlier remarks regarding the Town Branch Trail funding and sidewalks involved in the associated streetscape projects.
