Lexington- Fayette Urban County Government Council Meeting Lexington, Kentucky November 12, 2020

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and State of Emergency, this meeting is being held via live video teleconference pursuant to 2020 Senate Bill 150, and in accordance with KRS 61.826, because it is not feasible to offer a primary physical location for the meeting.

The Council of the Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government, Kentucky convened in regular session on November 12, 2020 at 6:01 p.m. Present were Mayor Gorton in the chair presiding, and the following members of the council: Farmer, Higgins-Hord, Kay, Lamb, McCurn, Moloney, Mossotti, Plomin, Reynolds, Swanson, Worley, Bledsoe, F. 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Mayor Gorton announced that Public Comment had been suspended by the Council until Fayette County was no longer classified as a COVID-19 "Red Zone" county.

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Ms. Reynolds announced that on Friday, November 13, through Sunday, November 15, 2020, the Greater Gardenside Association would be facilitating an outdoor gratitude project at Cross Keys Park where citizens could come and write what they were grateful for with sidewalk chalk. Ms. Reynolds also shared that *Despicable Me* would be shown at The Red Mile at 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, November 14, 2020 as part of the Films in the Infield event series. She shared that tickets for the event could be purchased at www.redmileky.com/films.

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Mr. Farmer announced that the Ashland Park Neighborhood was celebrating its one hundredth anniversary. Informational placards had been placed outside those homes in the area that were at least one hundred years old. Additionally, Mr. Farmer mentioned that there were descriptive guides for the types of flora one may encounter during a walking tour of the neighborhood and that efforts were underway to create informational pamphlets for the historical placards as well. He commented that the walking tours may be a safe outdoor activity during the pandemic. He closed with sharing some information found in the guides, remarking especially on the definition of a shrub. Mayor Gorton remarked that she had seen the "100" signs and had wondered what they represented.

Mr. J. Brown expressed his condolences to the family of Latasha Benton, a childhood friend, community activist and leader, who passed away on November 6, 2020. He shared that services for Mrs. Benton would be held on Saturday, November 14, 2020. He spoke about the difficulties of mourning a loss during the COVID-19 pandemic, a time when people want to be comforted, but social distancing still needed to be maintained. Mr. J. Brown also mentioned that the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Holiday Committee has been participating in a series, called 2020 Critical Conversations Series, meant to continue the work of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Mr. J. Brown said that the most recent Critical Conversation was held during the summer and the next one would be held virtually on November 16, 2020 at 6 p.m. He encouraged everyone to visit the Lexington MLK Holiday Facebook page to sign up to attend the sixty-minute event which would include a presentation as well as a question and answer portion. Mr. J. Brown noted the importance in observing Dr. King's message throughout the year, not just on the Holiday.

Mayor Gorton expressed her appreciation for Mr. J. Brown's comments concerning lost loved ones, and the inability to hug one another other, during the pandemic.

Ms. Lamb thanked Mr. McCurn, Ms. Plomin, and Ms. Reynolds for attending the Veteran's Day 2020 event held via teleconference on November 11, 2020. She noted the group of speakers who spoke at the event, which included Mayor Gorton, Congressman Andy Barr, and Deputy Commissioner of the Kentucky Department of Veteran's Affairs, Dean Stoops. She also shared that Whit Whitaker, Executive Director of the Lyric Theatre & Cultural Arts Center, sang two songs. Ms. Lamb noted that footage from the event was available on the City of Lexington -- Government Facebook page and LexTV YouTube page for anyone who wanted to watch it or share it with a veteran. She expressed her happiness at the opportunity to gather in support of veterans via a teleconference event. She thanked LexTV staff, her aide, Kelley Farley, and everyone else who had helped make the event possible.

Mayor Gorton explained that ten citizens signed up for public comment for the meeting, but that administrative staff had contacted all the citizens to inform them that inperson public comment had been suspended due to Fayette County's COVID-19 Critical "Red Zone" designation. She thanked Chief Administrative Officer Sally Hamilton, her staff, and Tyler Scott, Mayor Gorton's Chief of Staff, for their help disseminating the information about the suspension of public comment.

Mayor Gorton expressed her appreciation for Assistant Chief, Dwayne Holman who was retiring on November 13, 2020 after twenty-nine years of service with the Lexington Police Department. Mayor Gorton recounted an experience she had in 1999 when she went with Assistant Chief Holman, at that time a sergeant, on a Ride-Along. She shared that Assistant Chief Holman had worked with three police chiefs during his career with the Police Department and that for the past five years, he had overseen the Bureau of Administration, and helped in the development of the Body Worn Camera Program. Mayor Gorton wished him well in his retirement.

Upon motion by Vice Mayor Kay, seconded by Ms. Plomin, and approved majority vote (Ms. Mossotti was absent), the meeting adjourned at 6:52 p.m.
