What is the Lexington CAIR program?

- Co-project of CivicLex, LFUCG, BGCF, and a large Advisory Group.
- Pilot Program partially funded by the National Endowment for the Arts.
- Process started with application to NEA Our Town program in August of 2019.
- Less than 20% of Our Town apps are funded.









Why a CAIR program in LFUCG?

- Enhance and strengthen trust and communication between city and residents
- Celebrate the labor of city employees
- Bring creative solutions to ongoing challenges by inviting more voices & resources into processes
- Communicate with residents by making information more accessible, user friendly, less intimidating









Why artists in City Government?

- Artists naturally employee creative thinking and problem solving in their work
- Artists try multiple methods, change directions and take risks
- Artists don't work in a vacuum --- they observe, take in information and respond
- Artists embrace processes which can be replicated and evaluated

What is the Lexington CAIR program?

- Three artists in three departments (EQPW, Finance, Social Services)
- 13 month placement: June 2021 July 2022
- 15 hours per week estimated
- \$15k stipend, \$1.5k supply budget, workspace









Who is paying for the CAIR program?

- National Endowment for the Arts Our Town Grant housed at BGCF: \$75,000.00
- CivicLex Cash & In-Kind Match: \$62,100.00
- LFUCG Cash Match: \$15,000.00
- Significant LFUCG staff involvement









History of Lexington's CAIR program

- Awarded NEA OT grant in May 2020.
- First meeting of Advisory Group in September 2020.
- Program fully designed by November 2020
- Applications launched January 2021; closed March 2021
- Artists selected

 Project Deployment, Documentation, and Evaluation (implement proposed project and assist CivicLe and the City with documentation throughout to capture key findings and inform future residencies)
