RE: Cummins Generator Maintenance Agreement

Request:

The Division of Enhanced 911 is requesting authorization for the Mayor to sign a 3 year maintenance agreement with Cummins Sales and Service.

Why are you requesting?

The Division of Enhanced 911 (E911) is responsible for generators that supply emergency power to public safety radio infrastructure at three (3) separate locations throughout Lexington and northern Jessamine County. Those locations are: WKYT (2851 Winchester Rd), WLEX (1065 Russel Cave Rd) and WVRB (2166 Brannon Rd, Nicholasville). E911 would like to enter into a 3 year maintenance agreement with Cummins Sales and Service, with the option for renewal at the end of the 3 year term. E911 recently obtained service related quotes from 3 different vendors and Cummins offered the lowest cost for the services requested. This service will insure that all generators maintained by E911 are inspected and serviced twice annually, in accordance with our SOP and accreditation standards.
