A Resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor, on behalf of the Urban County Government, to execute and submit a Grant Application to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and to provide any additional information requested in connection with this Grant Application, which Grant funds are in the amount of \$88,500 Federal funds and \$14,160 Commonwealth of Ky. funds, under the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, and are for the procurement and installation of a redundant emergency power system at the Lexington-Fayette Animal Care and Control (LFACC) Facility. Authorization to submit application to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) requesting federal funding in the amount of \$118,000 from the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program to procure and install a redundant emergency power system at the Lexington Fayette Animal Care and Control (LFACC) facility.
